In any case where there appears to be no properly constituted trustee a a Wakf, or where a trustee appears to be acting in an improper or unauthors manner, the Commissioner may apply to the Chief Native Court (hereafter calls the Court), and if the Court shall find there is no authorized trustee, it shall make order declaring that the property has vested in the Commissioners, or if it is of opini that any duly authorized trustee is not administering the Wakf in a proper manner. may remove the trustee and either appoint another or other trustees in his place. may make an order vesting the property in the Commissioners

9. The Commissioners shall in all cases administer Wakf properties under the charge in strict according with the intentions of the founder of the Wakf, proud that such intentions are sawful and capable of being appried out.

10. In cases where (a) such intentions cannot be exerted out, or (b) where urplus revenue remains after fulfilling the intentions of the founder, the Comi sioners may, with the sanction of the Court, apply such original property or an surplus revenue for such good or charitable purposes on behalf of the Muhammad as may appear desirable.

11. Where it appears to the Commissioners in any case that the intentions of i founder of the Wakf cannot reasonably be carried into effect, and that it is according expedient that the property or some portion thereof should be sold, the Court may, the application of the Commissioners, order a sale thereof, and the proceeds of sa sale shall be applied as provided by the foregoing section (§ 9).

12/ All property of deceased Muhammadans natives to which no claim can established shall vest in the Commissioners, but no such property shall be handed on

to the Commissioners without the sanction of the Court.

13. The Commissioners shall keep accounts of all properties and funds dealt

by them, which shall be from time to time andited by the local auditor. 14. The Commissioners may, with the approval of Her Majesty's Commission
