THE DETAILS.

(1) On the 18th of July a letter dated Kismayu June 16th was received from Mr. Power. The two Herti runners sent to the Marchan country have returned and state that they saw the Chiefs of the Rer Farah Ughas the informed them that the Marchan have had many small affrays with the Aulihan and are waiting until the Government makes a move when they will give us assistance.

The Aulihan are reported to be deserting Abdurrahman Mursual and a considerable number of his own section to have joined the Marchan.

N.B. - If this is correct Er. Power thinks the Marchan in question would be the fer Tulha or Rer Hassan (Ker Doi sections). The remaining sections are Galti who would not be likely to welcome any Numin Wafattu.

Some sections of the sulthen intend to go to the Uses Nyiro and it appears that messangers have been sent to the Abd Tak to try to persuade that tribe to join them.

- (ii) On the same day a letter dated fismayu
 July 6th was received from the Acting Provincial
 Commissioner. He has been informed that during May the
 Marchan took considerable loot from the Aulihan. He
 learns also from Maalim Abdi (vide Precis for week
 ending April let I(iii))
 - (a) that Abdurrahusin Mursaal has sent Gabobi Abdi

(Chief of the Garreh?) to Abyssinia with 30 camels loaded with cloth loated from Serenli as a present to the Abyssinians in the hope of obtaining permission to live in Abyssinian territory.

(b) that the Mohamed Zubeir are quite loyal, in spite of repeated efforts on the part of Abdurrahman Mursaal.

The Bartiri and Tur Adi have been ordered not to go to Kismayu, Gobwen, or Youte. The Aulihan obtain much information from caravans composed of members of these sections:

(e) that the Serepli Aulihan have poved towards hajheir. Mohamou Aden, probably Intelligence Agent, reports confirming the raids by the Marchan on the Aulihan and states that the Habr Suliman (the Mad Mullah's section) wish to join the Nohamed Zubeir,

It is stated that a dispute has arisen between Abdurrahman Nursaal and some of the Rer Afgab, the former wishing to go to abyssimia, the latter to Kajheir.

Abdurrahman Mursaal is reported to have ordered his own section, the Emfattu, to leat any Somali near majheir. They accordingly took 200 usnels from the Maghabal, whereas Abdurrahman Mursaal's intention was that they should raid the Mohamed Zubeir, to prevent the Rer Afgab from coming to terms with them.

(iii) On the loth the repeated telegram referred to in I(ii) of last week's precis was received. It was to the effect that all/Mehamed Zubeir chiefs taked for permission for their young men to proceed to Wajheir to fight the aulihen.

(iv) The Somali Ali Khush, vide precis for June

17th I(i), tried to escape on route to Gobwen and was shot His body was hanged the following morning for one hour before an enermous crowd.

- On the 13th Er. Power telegraphed reporting a rumour that the Mijjertels and Warsengeleh Sommii had attacked the Mullah she suffered 2000 casuatties. The Mullah is reported to be at Obbid.
- (vi) On the 2nd Omptein Percelli, Officer Commanding Troops, Jubaland, reported the Rohamed Zubeir to be quiet, but he intended, shortly to take a large patrol to their country with the object of increasing their intention to remain loyal,

The garrison at Alexandra is being reduced to 21 Jubaland Irregular Constabulary and 21 police.

Abdurralman Mursual is said to have received news that the chief of the Abyssinian Aulihan, Dagulli, will permit him to join him.

The Government of Italian Somaliland has consented to allow stores of every kind to be sent to Brave and will be responsible for their delivery at Barders, This will greatly facilitate the recompation of Serenli.

- (vii) Farah Got, vide Precis for week ending April 1st I(i) is preceeding to Kimmayu to see Mr. Power.
- II. DISPOSITION OF OFFICERS, Mr. Kittormester will proceed to Nairobi from Marsabit.
- III. DISPOSITION OF SOMALI TRIBES. Certain of the Aulilian are reported to be at Mirgis near Wajheir.
- DECISIONS ARRIVED AT. A reply has been sent to I (iii) IV. above that the Government cannot consent to the request of the Rohamed Zubeir. As far as is known, no Aulihan are near Wajheir, and raids by the Mohamed Zubeir might make the situation there more complicated.
