My Lord,

I have the honour to request that the European Warder for the Lunatic Asylum at Nairobi may be engaged at an early date.

2. Provision for the appointment at the rate of £200 per annum has been made in the Estimates for the current year and as the Asylum building is practically completed the services of the Warder will shortly be required.

3. The person engaged should have experience of work in Asylums and it is desirable that he should be qualified to dispense medicines.

4. The Principal Medical Officer suggests that the Army Council might be approached with a view to the appointment of a Non-Commissioned Officer of the Royal Army Medical Corps, who has been trained as a Lunatic attendant and has a Dispenser's qualification.
