I have the honour to transmit herewith Pension forms duly completed in connection with the retirement from the service on medical grounds of Mr. Goverdhandss Lelji Mankermy.

- Mr. Mankermy was engaged as a clerk in the Port
  Office at Mombasa on 15th January 1898 and is therefore
  eligible for a pension in respect of 18 years' service.
- The Government Medical adviser in India has certified him to be constitutionally and physically unsuitable for further service in this Protectorate on account of commencing cataract in both eyes.
- 4. Pending receipt of your formal sanction to the payment of the pension which has been computed at £57.12.00 per annum, I have approved of the grant of an alimentary allowence at the rate of £50 per annum as from the £2nd ultimo.
