mission is believed to have had its European Headquarters in Hamburg, it counted among its members in this Protectorate before the war several enemy subjects, it has been the subject of grave suspicion since the outbreak of war, and its usefulness is small. In view of the large numbers of natives who have now received a military training and have fought side by side with Europeans, native administration will in the future be a matter requiring the greatest care and attention, and it is most important that no person who does not possess the highest credentials should be allowed to take part in their education.
