The point raised by the  
Attorney General is a  
good one. Though we have held  
that the Berlin Act is in  
abeyance during the war so  
far as enemies are concerned,  
it might be difficult to hold  
that it is in abeyance as regards  
neutrals (Swedes) especially if  
suggested to it that it is  
to establish that there is a  
association on the part of such  
neutrals.

If once we can establish  
such association on the part of  
these Swedes, the matter is  
straightforward, as we can  
take action as suggested by  
the B. of Trade (38251), quite  
apart from the proposed Ordinance.  
I presume that we had better

August 11th. Your cipher telegram of  
July 19th I consider that pending a decision after  
the war on imperial policy with regard to alienation  
of the land to foreigners in British Colonies,  
it would be very desirable to promulgate an ordinance  
on the lines you suggest. It is however pointed out  
by Attorney General that the provisions of  
Article No. 5 of the Berlin Act 1885 gives foreign sub-  
jects without distinction the right to acquire  
immovable possessions in the "Conventional Congo  
Basin" in which the protectorate is situated.  
Presumably therefore it would be necessary to consult  
Foreign Office in order that we may be advised  
how objections based on Act, which may be raised  
locally, should be met.
