With reference to your telegram dated the 24th of March, I have the honour to address you on the subject of housing accommodation of the Non-European Customs Staff taken over from Uganda on the amalgamation of the Customs Departments of the two Protectorates.

2. All clerks in the Uganda Customs Department were given free quarters or an allowance in lieu thereof while working in Uganda under the old system. Some of these clerks have enjoyed this privilege for a considerable number of years. The same conditions do not obtain in the East Africa Protectorate

Protectorate and applications have now been received from clerks who have, under the new system, been transferred to this Protectorate to be allowed to continue under the previous conditions.

3. I do not consider it right that these clerks should lose by their transfer and I have consequently approved of the privilege of house allowance to Customs Clerks taken over from the Uganda Protectorate being continued when they are not occupying Government Quarters. This privilege should not, I think, cease on promotion, as the amount lost thereby would not be compensated for by the increase of pay on promotion. As heretofore Customs Clerks will occupy available free quarters in Uganda and East African Customs Stations when it is difficult or impossible to obtain other than Government quarters. I trust that you will approve my action in this matter.
