Further explanation of No 2. I should

also to point out that I did not obtain this certificate until I went on leave to South Africa. The date on which it was issued is in fact to be found on the company letter also enclosed herewith. On my arrival at Kimberley and at the final interview had with the Director of Public Works, prior to my going on active service, I protested against the reasons given for my dismissal as an injustice, such as it deprived me of all benefits regarding leave which I was given to understand would accrue for faithful service and that even most indignantly that I declared that during the 19 months I was with the Public Works Department.

I was assured a temporary agreement and the Director of Public Works was quite satisfied his right to discharge me with a fortnight's notice if he did not require my services any longer. The Director that he should have

we were a clean certificate of service
in every respect when they so nothing
more & nothing less.

I am sure that the blue print plan
of the road gives me at the time I look
