My Lord

With reference to my confidential despatch of the 21st instant, dealing with the allegations made against Mr. Silberad and Mr. Haywood, I have the honour to report that I have allowed Mr. Silberad to proceed home by the French Mail leaving here on the 28^E instant.

2. Mr. Silberad is entitled to five months leave, but pending your Lordship's orders on his case, he will be, both as regards leave and

and pay, under such conditions
as your Lordship may direct.

3. He has been allowed half
salary here from the date of his
suspension.

4. Mr Silbernads suspension and
position have affected his health; he
is of a nervous disposition, and I
am advised that further suspension
in this country, pending the receipt
of your Lordships instructions, might
have serious consequences; I have
therefore thought it better to allow
him to proceed at once to England.
