Court Frijs is a new settler in the sense that he has never been resident in E.A. On the other hand he has paid for the land which he bought before the war, & also the expenses of putting up a house in another portion of land, which he bought after the beginning of war but has not yet paid for (see 63034 p. 18) and has recommended loss of new group to which the parcel was bought.

It is recommended that no guarantee can be given that he will be able to sell in Jan. 1920; recommend also the Controller, & daughter, & medical attendant.
