(ii) The following telegram has been received from the War Office:— No. 41788 (M.S. 3) dated 12-10-17.

"To provide for cases in which officers and soldiers are recommended for reward but are killed or die before recommendation approved by Commander-in-Chief following procedure authorised.

In case of immediate awards, Commander-in-Chief may approve wholly deserving cases as from date on which recommendation signed by officer who initiated it, provided individual was alive on that date. No award under this procedure permissible prior to 7th September.

For New Year Gazette, 1918, and future Gazettes, Commander-in-Chief may accept approved recommendations provided officer or soldier was alive on the last day of period covered by lists.

No retrospective effect permissible in respect of Gazettes already published.

These instructions apply to Orders, Decorations and Medals only."

The following telegrams have been received from the Secretary of State during the week:

December 9.

Official News.—Admiralty announces that morning of 8th December Scharnhorst, Guisenau, Nuremberg, Dresden, Leipzig, sighted near Falkland by British Squadron and Vice Admiral Sturdee. Action followed, and Scharnhorst, flying flag of Admiral Von Spee, Guisenau and Leipzig sunk. Dresden and Nürnberg are being pursued. Two ships captured, one sunk, one very severely damaged and forced to run for safety.

December 9.

Official News.—During last night, French Government report enemy activity somewhat increased. Vigorous German attack repulsed south of Ypres. Struggles in Artois continuing very vigorous. Verdun, recently captured by French, has been scene of determined struggle for nearly two months.

Russians independently report attack north of Orel, with which 60 German divisions had been held back without resistance. Several guns, many men taken prisoner. Offensive still maintained.

Sixth Press Bureau report says German offensive against Austria.

December 10.

Official News.—No further particulars now known of the recent French offensive. Forces pressing along heights of Meuse and Argonne. Italian Government report heavy fighting left bank Vistula, south of Grodno, Lowicz, Illyria, region Piotrkow and south of Czestow. Enemy achieving no success. Russians

evacuated Loitz for strategic reasons. After successful operations, resulting in capture of about 200 prisoners and five guns, Indian Expeditionary Force has captured Kurma, where late Governor of Basra surrendered unconditionally with his troops. We now control country from junction of Tigris and Euphrates to sea. Serbians have routed Austrian Army, recaptured Valamevo, taking twenty thousand prisoners, fifty guns. In South Africa, Boers believed drowned in Vaal, rebel commandos numbering over two thousand in all recently captured or surrendered unconditionally.

December 10.

Following is summary of Press Bureau notice:—In further telegrams received, from Vice Admiral Sturdee reporting Nuremberg sunk Dec. 8th after search for Dresden still proceeding. Action lasted five hours with intervals. Scharnhorst sank after three hours; Giesenau two hours later. No loss of any British vessel reported.

December 12.

Official News.—British casualties in action off Falkland Islands: 7 killed, 4 wounded, no casualties amongst officers. French Government report violent attack repulsed in region of Ypres. Russian report German offensive repulsed near Malitsa, and repulsed with enormous losses in region of Lowicz. Several German guns and over 2,000 prisoners taken south of Grodno. In victory over Austrians Serbians captured over 20,000 prisoners, 70 guns, 40 machine guns, enormous quantity war stores.

Official News.—Admiralty announces that morning of December Scharnhorst, Gneisenau, Nürnberg, Dresden, Leipzig, sighted near Falkland by British Squadron under Vice Admiral Starke. Action followed, and Scharnhorst, flying flag of Admiral von Spee, Gneisenau and Leipzig sunk. Dresden and Nürnberg are being pursued. Two German captured. One casualty very severe. Some survivors rescued from sea. In and London.

December 9.

Official News.—December 9th. French Government report enemy activity some what increased. Vigorous German attack repulsed south of Ypres. Struggle in Artois continuing very vigorous. Vermandois, recently captured by French, has been scene of determined struggle for nearly two days.

Russian Headquarters report successful attack of German, after nine hours of combat, having lost in field between 10,000 men. Several guns, many prisoners captured. Officially same time.

Second Press Bureau announces capture of a vessel over Austrians.

December 10.

Official News.—No further particulars received regarding the recent. French Government reports progress along heights of Meuse and in Argonne. Russian Government report heavy fighting left bank Austria, south of Lysva, Glowno, Lowicz, Ilawa region Plock and south of Warsaw, enemy achieving no success. Russians

evacuated Lodz for strategic reasons. After suspension of rations, resulting in capture of about 200 prisoners and five guns. Indian Expeditionary Force has captured Kuma, where late Governor of Basra surrendered unconditionally with his troops. We now control country from junction of Tigris and Euphrates to sea. Serbians have routed Austrian Army, recaptured Valamevo, taking twenty thousand prisoners, fifty guns. In South Africa, Beyers believed drowned in Vaal, rebel commandos numbering over two thousand in all recently captured or surrendered unconditionally.
