the abnormal death rate from

my seventeen years experience of
Uganda as official and
I have never seen anything
quite equal it - Allow me Sir

make a few remarks on the various
points of the Commission's report
embodied in your letter.

a. It is stated the death rate was
not abnormal =
the loss should be about 2%.
I lost between 80 and 100 head
of stock out of 300 odd owing
directly to the miasma.
Is this not abnormal?

b. Had the serum been efficient
such a loss could not have occurred,
unless the cattle owners in the
Kauwaha District are of a
"specially" ignorant and careless
type as compared to other cattle
owners in B.S.I. who suffered

normal losses

If there was a necessity for special action to be taken in the matter after inoculation, why was not a pamphlet issued to cattle owners on the subject warning them and advising them? Again if the cattle were in such poor condition due to the prevailing drought (there was plenty of good grazing on my land) why did not the veterinary state that they were too weak to stand inoculation and postpone the same until the cattle were fit to stand it?

The above remarks speak for themselves. I trust may induce you to consider the matter of compensation.
