as to use of Solignum as a tick remedy.

Mr. Greasy.

Mr. Howard, representing Solignum Ltd., came to see me on July 4th. He informed me that he had been placed in charge of the department which was interested in insecticides, and that, on an investigation of the matter, he found that the sales of Agrisol, a product manufactured by Solignum Ltd., had fallen considerably in recent years. He desired to secure information as to the reasons for this, if possible. I told him that a certain amount of work had been done on the use of Agrisol in the treatment of tapping cuts of rubber to prevent black rot, but that it had not been found as satisfactory as Brumolinum, and subsequently Cargillimum. The latter had now practically replaced all other fungicides used on rubber estates in Ceylon. He stated, however, that Agrisol still had a good sale in Malaya and was recommended there, where

it

it seems to have given as good results as Cargillimum. He was, however, more concerned with sales in Kenya. The Reports of the Department of Agriculture, Malaya, of 1923, or thereabouts, showed that Agrisol had been used effectively in spray mixtures against coffee pests, but these Reports indicated that they were probably not making the insecticides in the way in which Solignum Ltd. recommended, and he wished, if possible, to get into touch with officers interested in coffee in East Africa, and Agricultural Officers in general, to discuss the matter. I agreed to having further tests made, ultimately, to effect increased sales of Agrisol in that part of the world. After discussion of the matter in general I gave him the name of Mr. M.M. [unclear] Officer, Uganda, who is at present on leave. Mr. [unclear], Deputy Director of Agriculture, Uganda, and he said that he would communicate with them in the hope of arranging an interview in order to discuss further.

He also told me that he had received from Swaziland a report that Solignum had been found to be a valuable dressing for the control of ticks on cattle. He himself was rather surprised at this, but he said that he would supply me, in due course, with a copy of the letter, and he hoped that it might be possible for him to arrange for further tests in this direction to be made. In this connection I gave him the name of Mr. McEwen, Senior Agricultural Research Officer, Northern Rhodesia, as I thought that he might be interested in the matter.

Mr. Howard further asked that he should be supplied with lists of officers of the Agricultural Departments from overseas who might be interested in Solignum products. This matter is not raised in the letter of July 2. Personally I think that we should not undertake to supply to commercial firms the names of our Agricultural Officers on leave. I would, however, like to discuss this matter with some time.
