With regard to Sir G. Riddell's minute on  
28/5/88 I am sorry that this & No. 7360  
have not been sent on earlier, but it  
has not hitherto been possible to lay ~~hands~~  
on Co. 3209/5/9 & there has been a  
continuous paucity of relevant work.

Re No. 70. Cobden memorandum  
attached to Co. 3209/5/9 shows a  
clear statement of the general  
question of territorial rearrangements  
in North-Eastern Africa and of the  
attitude and interests of Great  
Britain, France & Italy.

The correspondence ending with  
Enc. 2858/5/19 East deals with only a  
small part of the question, i.e.  
whether, in connection with the  
adjudication of territories, an conclusion

of peace, Italy could be given a  
piece of country on the East frontier  
to be added on to Italian Somaliland.

No. 70 being the East was converted  
(despatched on Co. 19403/7/24) & made

suggestions  
for certain concessions, the  
most substantial of which was the  
proposed cession to Italy of the  
strip of territory colored mauve  
on the map herewith. He has  
amplified this suggestion & pointed  
out that the western boundary line of  
the mauve piece might be modified  
slightly in the favour of the Malians  
so as to give them better places to  
establish frontier posts in  
order to facilitate the administration  
of the territory if it is ceded to them.

The main objection to the  
cession of the territory in question  
is ~~not~~ its potential value for  
colonizing purposes.

PARAPHRASE TELEGRAM from the Officer Administering the Government  
of the East Africa Protectorate to the Secretary of  
State for the Colonies.

(Received Colonial Office 3.43 p.m. 11th January, 1919)

January 10th.

I inadvertently omitted reference in paragraph 7 and 12 of my secret despatch of October 29th 1917 to an important factor suggested by Kittermaster and approved by Commandant namely that opportunity of establishing frontier post at most easterly well of El Wak area by the alienation of such well without allowing Somalis access thereto should be given to the Italians. Commandant considers that with a view to facilitating their more effective administration of Somalis who would be east thereof the Italians should have such a post. In substitution of boundary given in paragraph 7 of my secret despatch following boundary is transmitted after consulting with Commandant and Kittermaster "From Malka Re through Dumasa to El Wak and thence to Dieff" Thence as before. Commandant considers that from military aspect this proposed boundary would be much more suitable.
