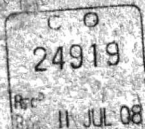

I have the honour to report that I have received an application from Mr. J. B. I am directed by the Secretary of State for the Colonies to inform you that, subject to your being passed as physically fit for service, he proposes to select you for probationary appointment as a Temporary Assistant in the East Africa Protectorate with salary at the rate of £250 per annum by annual increments of £10 to £400 per annum.
