With reference to Your Lordship's despatch No. 191 of the 12th of April last giving sever to correspondence with the Treasury relating to a new scale of charges to be made by the Mint for executing subsidiary Colonial coinages, I have now the honour to report as follows:-

2. With regard to the question of balancing the loss on the half cent pieces by the profit on the one cent pieces, I would point out that no half cent pieces have been issued in this Protectorate as it was not considered necessary to have so small a coin.

3. The issue has in fact been confined to Uganda and any loss consequent upon it should be entirely borne by that Protectorate without prejudice to any profit due to East Africa on the other coins.

4. The aluminium one cent pieces have not yet been demonetized but when once received at the Treasury they are not re-issued.

5. The Treasurer hopes shortly to be able to submit

submit proposals for the demonetization of aluminium cents and copper pice, but the reserve of new nickel cents is scarcely large enough and any movement in this direction would as yet be premature.

6. He informs me that his present intention is to send an experimental consignment of cents to the Crown Agents for the Colonies for disposal, and on hearing what this consignment is sold for it will be possible to gauge approximately the total loss accruing from the use of aluminium.


