PRESIDENT'S REPLY TO FRANCE

THE NEWS FROM ALL THE WAR FRONTS WAS OVERSHADOWED DURING THE WEEK-END BY THE MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT IN REPLY TO M. REYNAUD'S APPEAL FOR HELP.

Mr. Roosevelt made it clear that military commitments were a matter for Congress to decide but that so long as Britain and France continued to fight, then so long would the United States continue to send them all the supplies of material and equipment within her power.

The United States, he said, would redouble her efforts to give the Allies France the maximum supplies of aeroplanes, armoured vehicles, munitions and other necessities to continue their fight for freedom.

President Roosevelt replied on Saturday to M. Reynaud's appeal for help.

London has answered with enthusiasm with sincere gratitude, sympathy and understanding.

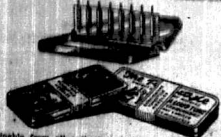

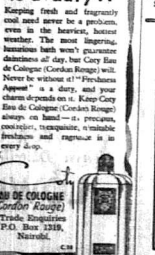
KENYA KONKONT'S PATRIOTIC RESOLVE

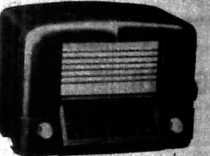

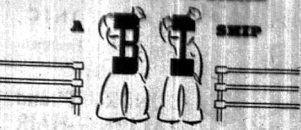

SUGAR AND COCOA
Crops Purchased Others Destroyed

(*STANDARD'S CORRESPONDENT'S)
Cocoa and sugar were in the news in a big way in the East African Colonies on Wednesday May 29th. The following information from the Empire Observer, M.P. of the question of sugar imports was given to the question and answer being as follows:—

The total quantity involved is about one and a quarter million tons, of which the United Kingdom will take about one and a quarter million, and a sugar in the United Kingdom will be used over a long period, beginning in about two months, and do not therefore affect the immediate sugar supplies. Canada and New Zealand are partners with the United Kingdom Government in these purchases, and both Dominions have shown the utmost co-operation throughout the negotiations, whilst the arrangements have been facilitated by the helpful attitude of the exporting countries.
Custians concerned. Supplies of foreign sugar are being increased to supplement as necessary deficiencies in supplies from the Empire, and the policy will be continued for the future. In the circumstances no useful conclusion would be drawn from a comparison between present and pre-war figures.

CHASER BY TANKS, CAR AND MOTOR CYCLE

The story of a great feat of tank chasing by a young British officer was told to a Daily Herald reporter by Captain Dunn of the War Office. BRITAIN'S COLOSSAL WAR EFFORT: NEARLY 3,000,000 REGISTERED

Industries Full Out

Our London correspondent yields the fullest and most graphic review of the war situation in England. Every person registered in. Almost no exemptions.

Exemptions

London, May 28.—After the fighting in Flanders, we are not completely satisfied with the British Army. We have a vast army of 2,000,000 men. Two million's classes, 4,000 in all, are being sent to the front in the next few months for military service.

Men of the 1911 class (who were aged 28 last year) will register on June 15. These numbers about 200,000.

Men of the 1910 class (aged 29 last year) will register on June 22. About 200,000 men reached the age of 29 between 1939 and 1940. The number for this year will have to register these 200,000.

The 1910 class total about 2,000,000. It will be possible to register these new classes.

The registration of two classes in quick succession has been arranged to ensure that a sufficient number of men is available to meet any call that may be made by the Service Department. The actual number called up will, of course, be less than with the earlier groups, as more men in the higher age groups have preferred occupations. Judging by experience with earlier groups, calling up of those required from the new registrations will begin in August, about six weeks after registration.

No Holiday this Year

All workers' holidays are being cancelled in Britain this summer. Trade Unions and employers' associations are to discuss in what form and what terms war work may be allowed relaxation. The said holidays' arrangements reached before the war, covering nearly eleven million workers, which was dropped for this year at least. Also cancelled are the bank holidays. The new weeks in Lancashire and in their plants in the North East five weekends with pay, arranged for such a way that no plants, particularly those engaged on war work, will be closed down. It may be possible to arrange for a small number of workers to take long weekends on a rota basis if their absence does not impede production. This decision does not refer to a subject of Government decision, on the seven day working week.

No one else will be able to take a holiday this year. This is a hard but necessary relaxation of other workers.

Spending Up Industry

Mr. Ernest Bevin, Minister of Labour, has ordered a big speed-up in the Government's scheme for training civilian workers for war work. There are various Government departments which are to be opened. Until further notice the age limits will be 17 to 55, but in some cases will be extended to 16 and 56. There are 100,000 men in the Army who are ex-officers or ex-servicemen. These men will be re-opened. More Officers Needed

The Army Officers' Emergency Reserve is being opened on November 1st with the largest number of officers ever to be re-opened. Until further notice the age limits will be 17 to 55, but in some cases will be extended to 16 and 56.

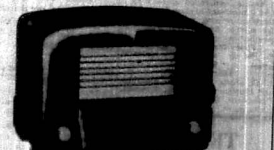

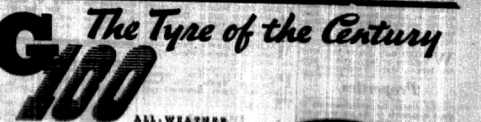

RUBBER IN BRAZIL

Mr. Ford's New Scheme

To avoid dependency on the British Empire, Mr. Henry Ford is following an ambitious scheme of rubber cultivation in Brazil, says the British United Press correspondent at Rio de Janeiro.

At the same time the Brazilian Government is preparing a campaign with the object of raising the price of the rubber industry in the pre-1914 importance. One of the principal targets of the Government's efforts is the big United States market.

Annual consumption of rubber in the United States is about 270,000 tons—approximately 52 per cent of world consumption—and the majority of this comes from Malaya and Java.

First Effort Fails

Mr. Ford, whose first unsuccessful attempt at rubber production in Brazil is reported to have cost him approximately £400,000 in 12 years, is to spend another £400,000 to begin his effort after large-scale production. Production is expected to begin in 1942 or 1943. Seeds for 2,500,000 trees have already been planted in the huge new estate and the young trees are already in splendid condition. It is expected that Mr. Ford should be able to export about 12,000 tons annually.

The failure of his first effort is said to be due to faulty selection of land and seeds.

The failure of the Brazilian Government involves the erection of two large factories for treating crude latex, improvement of labour conditions on the plantations, and improvement of roads and reduction of transport charges.

Transport Problem

Owing to the difficulty and cost of shipping in Brazil, it costs twice as much to ship a ton of rubber as it does to ship a ton of tin. A special organization is to be set up to improve the Government's aims, and this transport question will be one of the Government's main lines of policy.

Prices of Brazilian goods in the present state of high, partly owing to the cost of transportation and the risks involved. This leads to a demand for wages higher than the industry can afford to pay.

Similarities being pointed out, it will have to be bettered in the present state of affairs. It is to be attracted in sufficient numbers for large-scale production.

Brazilian experts believe that if the internal economic and transportation problems can be solved, re-conquest of the principal world markets will follow naturally. The North-American market, it is thought, is the most important. It is thought that a decisive factor in favour of eventual increase in Brazilian imports over the country's production can be reduced to its former magnitude.

How Abyssinia Prepared

Armed

DIAMONDS AND THE WAR

All diamond merchants in Britain are busy making a detailed return of their stocks for the Ministry of Economic Warfare. This census is not a national one, but a census of a secret traffic with the enemy carried out, not by the diamond merchants but by a special force of men who have been smuggled from this country to Holland and there is no doubt that there they go to Germany since diamonds are used in intricate cutting operations in arms manufacturing and in the production of the atomic bomb. 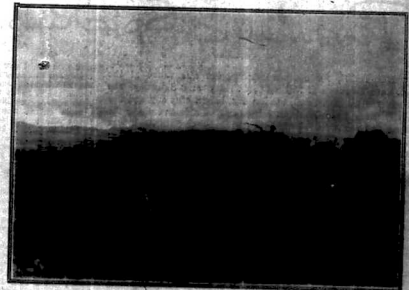

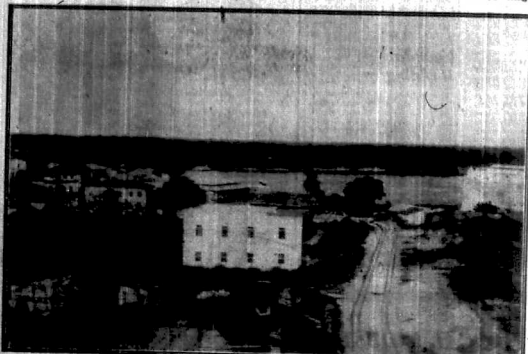

HEAVY BOMBING RAIDS ON ITALIAN TERRITORIES

K. A. R. SUCCESSFUL BORDER ACTIVITIES

Mediterranean Operations

British Air Forces, the Rhodesians and South Africans, were active over the whole East African front on Sunday. There was no land activity.

Among Italian aerodromes bombed were those at Neghelli and Yavello in Abyssinia where it is believed that very considerable damage was done.

Another target was an entrenched camp at Mega which was also bombed as well as the wireless station and barracks there.

No major action has occurred in the Mediterranean area but there has been extensive air bombing on both sides.

Among the latest developments are included two attacks on Egyptian strategic towns and casualties among Egyptian personnel. King Farouk has been in consultation with his Government.

In the course of an official communique issued by Force Headquarters, East Africa Force on Sunday, mention was made of the fact that a K.A.R. patrol which had raided the Italian aerodromes and found them abandoned hurriedly there the aerodromes were resented and horrified by finding there the bodies of three Bando Bombs which had obviously been killed in a British air raid two days earlier.

The King's African Rifles have been in action again, on this occasion on the border of Italian Somalia-land.

It was a lively and successful encounter and for the first time the troops were supported by aircraft.

June 14. The East Africa Force, taking the initiative, carried out the first ground action in the campaign on Thursday says an Information Official communique.

It was a brilliant little operation, developed with skill and resources by the King's African Rifles who gave the Italians a taste of their own medicine. The Italian post was taken completely by surprise when a fighting force of the King's African Rifles, supported by the K.A.R. collected two prisoners and withdrew.

Thursday was again a busy day in the air and both the Royal Air Force (Southern Rhodesia) and the South African Air Force had full and interesting programmes.

The Coastal sector of enemy territory was the scene of operations. Heavy bombing attacks, directed against the airfields, were carried out in the Aden, Jeddah and Kismayo areas of Italian Somalia-land, and valuable photographs were brought back of the military camps at these three points.

The Kismayo Raid. Kismayo on the Indian Ocean, once a Kenya harbour but transferred some years ago to Italy by the Italian Government, was mentioned in the morning's communique, but the latter said Germany has made the aerodrome of the South African Air Force and left plenty of damage reports on the raid gave a picture day. REPEATED AIR RAIDS ON LIBYA

In repeated raids on Italian bases the Royal Air Force has destroyed nearly 100 enemy planes.

Reports from Cairo say that over 600 prisoners, including 200 Italians, were taken by the Allied troops in Libya yesterday.

Reuter's Correspondent in the Egyptian western desert reported last night that the Italians moved forward 20 tanks towards the British line at Sollum. British tanks went out to meet them and 10 Italian tanks, seven guns, and two senior officers were captured. Our losses were very slight.
