BRITAIN AND FRANCE: An Unhappy Interlude

There is no member of the British race, no admirer of the France we knew so recently, no man who has fought beside the French in this war and the last who will not share the grief and regret of the Prime Minister over the unhappy results of this past week. Yet we all believe, and shall continue to believe, that as General Smuts phrased it in the hand that smote France at Oran will be the hand that will save her and restore those great principles of Liberty, Equality and Fraternity which France has risen to the height of her nobility in the last hundred years. The French people have contributed to the growth of civilization throughout the world, and no progress, no improvement in agriculture, no development of commerce and the development of civilization and culture that is to be maintained in the world can be achieved without the aid of the French. The spirit of France will govern us in the

after 1870 and flower again. The friendship with Great Britain and the United States which has meant so much to Democracy and enriched the conditions of life as we knew them before the evil things came into the world. Europe will be restored. Indeed it must be rebuilt because upon the success of its restoration depends not only the future of the British and French people but the only hope for a rebuilding of a better world for free men and women. This is the hope and the expectation which we must cling tenaciously when Oran and Bordeaux are still in the fire which will continue to remind us of some time to come, of the unhappy interlude in a long period of trust and cooperation. It is only in the sure knowledge of a vision that of hope that we can understand what Great Britain means, that the sacrifice of French lives and the destruction of great ships, the sorrow and the suffering which the British authorities who negotiated the armistice with the common enemy had promised that whatever happened the French fleet would not fall into the hands of the enemy. They are not the souls of the French people, but the souls of their new masters, a voice that knows not the truth and has no reverence for the high principles of international responsibility. Deep down, near the root of that friendship, are things which no Dictator can destroy. They are the things which still have their liberty stife their emotions and fight on.

GOVERNOR'S APPEAL TO UGANDA

People Anxious To Give Fullest Support

“STANDARD” CORRESPONDENT. Kampala, July 2. His Excellency the Governor of Uganda, Mr. P. E. Mitchell, K.C.M.G., M.C., has issued the following appeal to the general public in Uganda: “Last year we established a War Charities Fund in Uganda which we decided should continue until June 30, 1942. This date is now upon us and we have the satisfaction of knowing that over £25,000 has been collected for the many irrevocable War Charities purposes which exist in the Empire. “But lately the War has entered its fiercest phase, and it is always with the people of the British Empire, that there has been a greater increased desire among all classes and races to make even greater efforts to rally to the help of the Mother country. “The statement issued by this magazine from me gives full information of what has been done and what is intended. I need not appeal to the people of Uganda for support for our new effort, for they have abundantly shown that they are impatiently waiting the opportunity to do it.”

No Effort Must Be Skipped

We will content myself therefore with stating simply what it is known in the hearts and minds of us all that must be done to effect and to sacrifice to ensure the victory of the cause upon which all that we value depends. I confidently rely upon the people of this country of all races and communities to make our new appeal a success.”

Uganda has already from Protectorate funds sent a gift of £100,000 to the Uganda Government but sent from their Native Government a further sum of £10,000.

HEARTENING NEWS OF DEFENCE PLANS

A high military authority said, however, that we must not get too defensive-minded; we must have the confidence, not only in our fighting forces, but on the farm, in the factory and in the office.



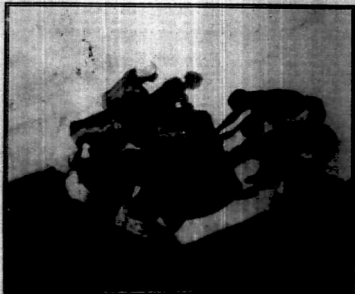

Main's Food Policy

The Defence (Finance) Plans Department set up in December, 1936. The Department was part of the Board of Trade in the outbreak of war it became the Ministry of Food.

Other departments such as the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Department of Agriculture for Scotland are connected with the planning of Britain's Food Policy. There is a committee presided over by one of the members of the War Cabinet which is responsible for co-ordinating food policy, and which includes the various Ministers who are directly or indirectly concerned with food policy.

The main features of British food policy, which has world-wide implications, are:

- The setting up of a Ministry of Food with remarkably wide powers.
- The purchase of surplus stocks of wheat in the Empire and other countries.
- The setting up of the Ministry of Shipping to deal with the problem of shipping space.
- The reorganisation and expansion of public elementary and secondary schools.
- The introduction of a special price of wheat in Great Britain by reducing the tariff and subsidising prices.
- The introduction of food rationing in Great Britain.

It must not be forgotten that the Government is supported in its policy by a wide range of co-operating organisations. These include the various sections of the "I" trade, the various sections of the "S" trade, the various sections of the "M" trade, and the various sections of the "A" trade.
