

Formation of university by 1964

1. That plans should be formed for setting up an inter-territorial university college in Tanganyika to be opened to students in 1960-61 in the immediate thereafter.

3. 





Three-week tour ends in triumph

HER MAJESTY Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother today flew safely to East Africa, ending yesterday at the end of her three-week visit which has gladdened the hearts of people of all communities.

As she sped in the Comet IV to London Airport, the wish apparent in their thoughts was: "Will she ever come back again?"

The Queen Mother's tour has been regarded in full eyes as one of the most successful. The impact of her radiant personality has left unforgettable impressions wherever she has been on her journey through the two territories.

Farewell message

The Queen Mother arrived at London Airport at 9 p.m. (E.A.T.), after a stop of an hour at Tripoli. The Queen, Princess Margaret and members of the British Government met her at London Airport.

In a message sent from the Royal Comet to the Governor of Uganda, the Queen Mother expressed her "heartfelt thanks for the loyal welcome and great kindness shown in her during her tour. In his reply, Sir Frederick Crawford said that the Queen Mother's visit to the Protectorate had given tremendous pleasure and happiness to everyone in Uganda."

Against a background of fluttering handkerchiefs, the Royal aircraft took off into a chiselled sky from Entebbe Airport yesterday morning. Senior officials and Government Ministers were at the airport to say farewell, and senior airport staff were presented to the Queen Mother before she left.

'Outstanding success'

Amateur photographers, with cameras poised, lined the barriers and filled the enclosure as the Queen Mother's car drove on to the tarmac last Friday, July 11 a.m. As she white accessories and a white, elegant, pointed hat, the Queen Mother smiled to the crowd.

The Queen Mother shook hands with a number of people, then paused to speak to Sir Frederick Crawford for a moment at the doorway of the Comet to wave and cheer good-bye, disappearing inside.

After the Queen Mother's departure, the Governor of Uganda said: "The visit has undoubtedly been an outstanding success and I should like, as Governor, to express my warm personal thanks to the very many people who have contributed to this success by their hard work over many months."

VISIT DELAYED THROUGH FEAR OF MORE RIOTS

Statement on Nyasaland

WHILE reports on the situation in Nyasaland yesterday had been no further violence, it was announced that the visit of Lord Perth, the British High Commissioner for Southern Rhodesia, to the area for consultations with the Ndebele and Shona leaders had been postponed because of the danger of further disturbances and looting.

Lord Perth's visit was originally planned for last week but has now been postponed until further notice. The British Government is concerned about the stability of the region and wants to ensure that the visit will be conducted in a peaceful and orderly manner.

MINERS PROTEST

More than 200 Scottish miners, gathered through London to the National Coal Board head quarters in protest at high unemployment in Scotland.

The miners are demanding better wages and working conditions. They are also protesting against the government's policies on coal production and distribution.

Close cooperation

The same cooperation between the two Governments in the various spheres of activity, such as the transport, education, health and social services, has been maintained. The two countries are working closely together to address common challenges and promote mutual development.

AFRICA, JOINT OF PATH OF ECONOMIC PROGRESS

President's address to joint chambers RAPID EXPANSION

FACTORS behind the economic progress of East Africa were stressed by the president of the Association of Banks and the industry of Southern Africa, Mr. R. F. Anderson, at the association's annual meeting in Nairobi yesterday.

Mr. Anderson, in his presidential address, said that Africa's growth "could not be sustained unless the speed of progress depended on it."

The rate at which the present transition in Africa is proceeding is rapid.

The extent to which the policy of enabling colonial Governments to obtain financing has been a developmental expenditure—maintained by the Chairman of the Binchanga administration—is to be applied to Africa.

Further improvement in industrial and agricultural methods, bringing increased production and raising the standard of living, is to be given consideration.

Farming methods improved

Mr. Anderson said that since the Second World War there had been tremendous strides in education and social services in East Africa. The part of Mombasa had been completely re-planned and deep-seated work had been done in the fields of education and health.

The railway system had been expanded and modernized; electric power had been brought to Nairobi from the hydro-electric station in Uganda and there had been other important developments in the field of electricity supply, with further possibilities.

Mr. Anderson said that the three territories were very different from their European counterparts. Great strides had been taken in improving methods of farming by all means and the productivity of the territories had been raised.

During the past few years there has been a steady increase in the number of people employed in the territories. This has been due to a number of factors, including the expansion of the public sector, the growth of the private sector, and the expansion of the services sector.
