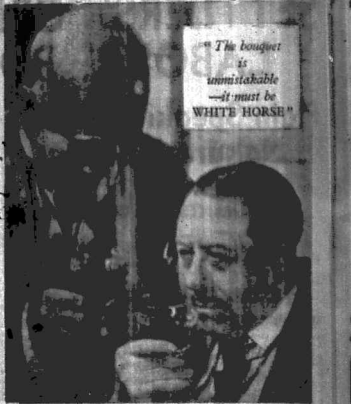

The Military Authorities on the broad question of man-power and production since the major campaign against the East African campaign can do. They bear a responsibility to help the native labour they employ to properly employed, that there is no wastage by the individual and that the wages for native servants and other Africans are in proportion to their duties and are not a menace to the labour market.

Apart from the sensible suggestions made regarding the legislation and practice to be adopted, the most serious danger to our country is that of deserters and natives who overstay their leave are promptly dealt with. It is not as much as fault as the Government's most important of all decisions taken was the appointment of a small Committee which will regulate their agricultural areas and keep close and constant contact with labour problems. The Chief Native Commissioner has told us that there were only 200,000 Africans more than their own reserves. That is a large labour force and it is clear that it is not fully used. We must endeavour to all means at our disposal to try to build up a labour supply for agriculture which without the dangers of the squatter system will have some of its advantages in that a large and dependable body of Africans look to agriculture for their regular income. Another serious matter is that of the railway. 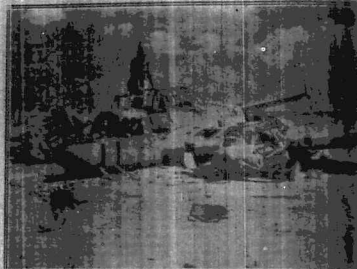

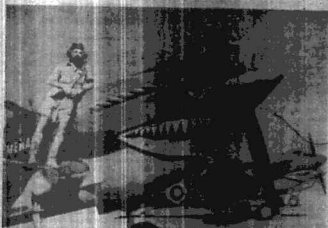

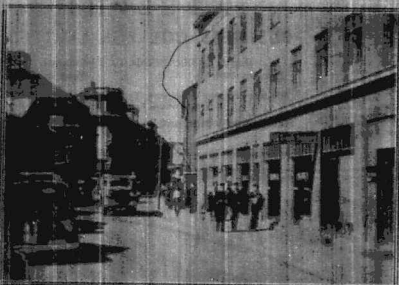

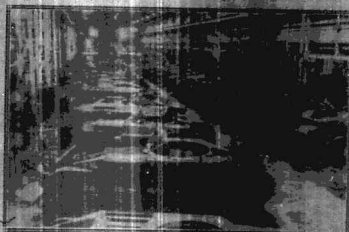

CRISIS IN RUSSIA
 Low, the famous cartoonist, contributed to our columns yesterday a cartoon which said in a few words what many of us have spontaneously remembered from time to time during the past three months. Many people, Low thinks, are enjoying a fool's holiday. Reading accounts of Russia's remarkable resistance, reading especially about the enormous losses which Germany has suffered, they remember by rote, as it were, the news from Moscow and by a process of wishful thinking decide themselves with the hope that Hitler will suffer the same fate and that, as a consequence of Russia's almost incredible sacrifices, Britain will win the war at an earlier date than we have so far seen.

is not the only one. The Germans also have their operations on the rich industrial area of the Donets basin around Kharkov, and they are equally anxious to control strategically important Crimea so that they may deal more successfully with Russia's strong and important Black Sea and threaten the Caucasus, probably by expeditions from the ports of Bulgaria, Germany's valuable tool in the Balkans. For this purpose it is important that the advantage is best secured by leaving Turkey out of the conflict until the German south Russia has been strengthened. Similarly Latvia, and also Estonia, can be left for the time being until the Germans by a series of piecemeal movements, great and small, weaken the great Russian armies which have resisted so valiantly. They do not want to cut the east which lives or material. He is prepared to sacrifice both if he can smash the Russian resistance before the winter with Hitler's Army in his position, weaken the legions of Leningrad and Odessa and thus provide for himself a more and reasonably comfortable line on the Russian front which he can hold either in order to rebuild his armies for further advance elsewhere or to enable him to say that, with all Europe in his control, he will leave problems of invasion to us.

This is the moment of supreme crisis. On its outcome will depend the answer to the question we ask ourselves about the duration of the war. This is no time for complacency. We must all watch anxiously, if we are not too fastidious, to see what the grim possibilities Day by day we must follow the news hopefully, remembering every word of our cartoonist's warning. For it is not Russia alone. Our Ally is not fighting her own battles. It is the survival of the British Empire just as much as she is fighting for herself, and the battles on the eastern front are being fought on our side.

There are bright spots in the grim picture. This is the fourth German offensive, three others have failed. This is also the most desperate of our wars, and if time is no longer with us, nor is it with Germany—Failure in Russia might bring the British Empire into dependence in Germany and Italy. But at the moment Germany's resources are increasing. In the last year we saw the production of our production and the United States which will tip the scales in our favour. Our Army effort has been good, but it is not yet nearly enough. One can understand, though, why Russia continues at their machines for fourteen hours a day till they are exhausted, and one can equally understand why they are so keenly anxious to see the American army get to the front. There are critical days in the war. It is only by realising how much the war in Russia may mean to ourselves that we can develop an appropriate courage, fortified by mind as we face our tasks and search for other ways of helping. One day, without doubt, Russia will be struck. In the Middle East and the Mediterranean we are securing mastery over Italy and Iran we are making our own preparations so that we may be able either to deal with developments there or, if conditions are propitious, to launch an offensive, our Russian ally. The question many people must ask is that themselves is when our blow will fall. Even in the East, it will be a long time before we can say that our suspicions may have been regarding the weakening of the German grip in Europe, and the vulnerability of the parts of western Europe to Hitler's attack. Victory is certain. Let us not allow our faith to be shaken. But on what happens in Russia will depend how long our patience will be tried, and how long and how bitter our struggle will be. For the few people of the world who are still living in that kind of unrelenting struggle.

TO THE BRITISH EUROPEAN WOMEN OF KENYA

You will have all seen in the press that under the Defence Regulations the Governor has ordered the compulsory registration of all British Women in Kenya...

Before exercising these powers it has been decided by Government to appeal to women to volunteer their services for the special war work for which they are fitted...

Whilst at the start of the war many women registered with the K.W.E.O. for war work, unfortunately women as the immediate danger receded and registrations have latterly decreased...

From today the Central Offices of the K.W.E.O. are in Sirona House, Sadler Street, Nairobi. Here a staff is very glad to answer all enquiries...

Whilst we have in Kenya no opportunity to serve in factories or as munition workers, there are continuous calls for full-time and part-time workers for accountancy, book-keeping, store-keeping, clerical work, typing, etc.

The difficulty is that many women are quite vague as to what they would like to do, or indeed what they could do, and this is where the K.W.E.O. can help.

The supreme duty of women is motherhood, the care of the young, the care of the home, but remember if Hitler were to win the war, Kenya would be a land of slaves and all the happiness of home life would be gone for ever.

The power of the Empire Women's War Effort can be compared to a great river as its flood approaches the sea, but trace that river back to its source and its beginnings...

There are two posters that have been published in England. The first portraying two women helping the homeless and disabled in the bombing of London has the slogan:

"If you are doing your best you are doing your bit."

Visualise the poster and take your minds to England. Think of those pathetic and courageous stories we have all received from mothers, sisters, and daughters of demolished homes, narrow escapes from fire and bomb, and so narrow escapes of some. Perhaps our best can be better. Perhaps we who live in safety and plenty still have got some way to go before we reach our best?

The other poster which is to be seen in Kenya, is of the three fighting services in action. The R.A.F. fighting the Hun out of the skies. The Navy protecting a convoy of food. And the Army in action with anti-aircraft. They are all superb pictures and the slogan is simple: "Back Them Up."

It is our job to Back Them Up, until Hitler and his grisly gang are swept off the face of the earth.
