The coming week will show whether this halt is permanent or a mere diversion. According to the available information the Russians are prepared for the possibility that the enemy may drive a spearhead east of Tula in an attempt to extend the southern German wing and outflank the Russian front. Berlin has indirectly confirmed this possibility. ## To Prevent Uneconomic Competition

[TRANS-AFRICAN CORPORATION] (Incorporated in South Africa)  
A Bill providing for the prohibition of competition with the Tanganyika Railway when it starts to operate on the route between Dodoma and Mtwara is being introduced into the Tanganyika Legislature.

With the object of providing a more economical, regular and dependable means of transport of goods to and from the southern Highlands Province it has been decided to operate motor services on certain routes in that Province under the powers contained in the Railways Ordinance, 1931. These services will be operated either directly by the railway administration or by contractors under the direction and control of the railway administration.

In order to ensure that these services will be operated without loss it is considered essential that the Railway Administration shall have protection from competitive undertakings in the route of the transport of imported goods over the routes which are proposed.

It is expected that a consequence of this protection will be to enable the Railway Administration to offer the lowest economical rates for the transport of goods on these routes. The object of this Bill is to secure that protection.

**From NAKURU Standard Correspondent**  
**Homes For Britain's Bombed Babies**

**KENYA'S FINE RESPONSE**

A VERY large gathering of members of the East Africa Women's League, from Nairobi and the outlying districts, and many others, assembled in the lounge of the River Head Hotel to welcome Lady Brookes-Popham on Thursday last. She visited Nairobi to tell those who were interested about what was being done for bombed babies in Britain.

The evening was opened by Mrs. G. C. Griffin, District Vice-President, Mrs. Knorr, I.A.W.L. who welcomed Lady Brookes-Popham on behalf of all present.

Lady Brookes-Popham, in thanking all those who had come such a distance to hear her, also expressed her gratitude for the help and interest shown to her at Cottingham for the babies. The Girl Guides in Nairobi, she said, had been the first to respond.

The excitement that he home at Cottingham was but one of the many War Resisters which were under the direction of the Ministry of Health. After the war, she had been in London a number of times among the thousands of babies being rescued from the debris, all orphaned as a result of the bombing. In some cases it had been impossible to obtain any trace of their parents, so many were too young to know their names.

These unfortunate little ones have, first of all, to be rescued and in this respect the East Africa Women's League worked in conjunction with the A.R.C. to rescue squads after the air raid.

The W. A. W. workers take children, immediately they are rescued, to a headquarters centre, where they receive a very superficial check-up and are given some milk. After that the children are taken immediately by car to homes in the country, such as Cottingham, where they are cared for and reared. Only the best of care is given these fortunate babies, but most of them are suffering from malnutrition.

**A Fine Future**

Lady Brookes-Popham outlined how the children are being reared to provide a suitable environment for them. She said that when the child has an unusual temperament and the home was not large and able to take many numbers of children, against the wishes of the parents, she has self had—and she felt sure that other mothers had—some great faith in the future of this country that if a certain number of children were absorbed here it would be a most precious thing for them. Her children, used of course, be sent abroad if they had a claim bill of health with regard to mental and other hereditary diseases.

Lady Brookes-Popham said that the response to her appeal had been magnificent in Kenya. She had already offers for the full and complete adoption of 49 children and six or seven other offers to take two or three children into a family, while 1434 had already been sent to be in

the form of subscriptions to the cause. She went on to explain that there were really only two feasible schemes. One was the out and out, individual adoption and the other the collective scheme which was being considered by a strong and representative committee in Nairobi. She added that there were many pros and cons to be considered and nothing was yet definitely decided. In any case, she said, no children could be sent out after the war. Under no conditions would she authorize the parents children, in numbers, to be put on the high sea now although, she added, it might be possible to get individual children out.

A number of photographs were passed round, and Lady Brookes-Popham said that she had seen a number of letters between the agencies of these and five, had already passed through Cottingham. Lady Brookes-Popham added that some of the thousands sent annually in health centres and on welfare workers, and one of these children had been seen a year or two ago.

**Questions**

Various questions were asked at the end of the most interesting address, amongst others: what was it possible to do for a child brought before it was left in England? and what was the cost of such a child in Kenya it cost £20 to adopt a child. Lady Brookes-Popham said that was a point that would have to be considered. Lady Brookes-Popham was also asked what she thought of the fact that the children were being reared in the country. She replied that there was plenty for adults and the fact is that the child population was definitely healthier as a result of being reared in the country. It is apparent to us that any scheme which leaves a sick person in the hands of a private firm, or a private hospital, or a private nursing and may not even include all the necessary drugs, is apt to be a failure. It is apparent to anybody that the cost of being ill and the restoration of health is a burden which too small a proportion of the community can face without anxiety.

In this young country we have to be constantly looking ahead. Particularly at the moment we have to try to visualise what post-war conditions may be. Until now we have maintained a high average standard of living, largely because we are a small community and the salaries have been generous and the commercial profits considerable. Expenditure in the towns on such essentials as housing and transport and the amount expended on domestic service, has been in proportion. These are the conditions which are common to all modern communities in a young country which is rapidly developing. But they will not continue.

As the community grows and we look forward to expansion when in our society will become more marked than they are at present there will be a larger proportion of people who will have to live justly to make ends meet in their domestic budget. There will be fewer importations of personnel from abroad, jobs will be filled from our own ranks, expensive things like leave to Europe at short intervals will not play so prominent a part in our lives, and we shall have to find a place for an even larger proportion of the people who earn small incomes than we now do. The fact will in themselves tend to reduce our standards. In the course of time, however, as the introduction of the Local Civil Service we have already made substantial reductions in the salaries in the Government and other agencies of employment. If that process is to continue the balance must be redressed in other directions. We cannot believe that broadening of the basis of our community growth and still maintain high costs of living.

The trend of social reform of public policy in the past few years has been the direction of making the State the servant of the people. We pay our taxation into a common fund, and in return we are entitled to draw from that pool our fair and adequate share for the maintenance of our life and health, and for the State services. We have passed the stage at which the State being the owner of hospitals can long continue to expect the general body of the taxpayers to pay for the sickness charges of those who are not themselves in the Government, and at the same time be called upon to bear heavy hospital charges themselves. For twenty years in these matters it is only the agent. The hospital should belong to the people as a whole. It is not for the Government to expect the Government's distribution of the public revenue in a manner which will provide for every citizen an equal share in the services and the benefits which are together necessary for the maintenance of the country and the individual health, and education are among the more obvious of these State responsibilities. If we are to be responsible for these, we must have the means to carry them out.

war and its later problems a considerable change in the whole character and condition of the white community in Kenya, we believe it is essential to provide for that community a social structure which is greatly different from that which in the past has largely rested on the theory that the Government had no direct responsibility and individual responsibility and should pay for all his lot and contribute his taxation in addition.

There are considerations which make us believe that the Government, the Local Authorities and the people, will keep well in question of hospital services in its social setting. It is important that the Local Authority, with the support of the public, should have some scheme to put forward and should make it clear to the Government that it is a development which should be considered in its relation to the community as a whole throughout the Colony and not merely as affecting a portion who happen to stay in Nairobi. We pay enough for individual health to enable us to expect that it should be returned in a form which is of real benefit to all particular and in particular those who are, and always will be, nearer the bottom of the wealth structure than at the top. In sickness there should be no differentiation. The State, out of its revenues, should provide the maximum free service, leaving the individual to pay, if he must do so, a nominal part of his cost of hospital charges and should be wiser, he is then at liberty to engage any additional service at his own cost. It is in the interests of the whole community to ensure that a general standard of health as high as can be maintained and in the conditions of the new world as we are trying to build, then, sickness should not be an unduly anxious burden for anyone whose circumstances are governed by the standards which the State and the community together impose upon him.

# Approach of War's "Supreme Crisis"

The transfer of Marshal Voroshilov from the Caucasus to the Caucasus is considered to be less important than it was a fortnight ago.

### THE GAUCASIAN PIVOT

Furthermore, Marshal Voroshilov, who has a high reputation as a strategist, has the advantage of being well acquainted with the Caucasus country, which the Marshal Voroshilov thought the Germans in the last war.

### INHERENT DANGERS

In firing their great guns it is being thought that the German is taking the opportunity. To reach the Caucasus, Germany will have to cross 700 miles of front, support and therefore keep open their lines of communication, during the winter of the Caucasus, which is a very serious matter. However, unless Marshal Voroshilov is completely contrary to all reasonable expectations, complete fails to reorganize the Army of the South, the Germans will have captured a very long left flank in a breathing space. It can hardly be too strongly emphasized that the advance on Stalingrad was timed to follow and not to precede the fall of Moscow.
