A Prompt Decision

We congratulate His Excellency the Governor of Kenya, Sir Henry Moore, on his prompt and personal decision, announced at the first opportunity open to him, to do so for the benefit of £30,000 to begin a housing scheme for Africans in Nairobi and Mombasa. We are glad to see that he is so far-sighted as to like to see things done. We hope that the Executive Council will lose no time in providing the necessary approval and that steps can be taken at once to consider the many initial problems which arise in respect of site, building materials and the nature of the housing.

Through we have only recently returned from a very valuable visit to a large area of Africa which included the Union and the Belgian Congo. We hope that when wartime difficulties disappear such tours will become a normal part of the period of office of African Governors of British East Africa. As Sir Henry pointed out, has made these tours so valuable after the war the expansion of civil services is going to be a matter of great importance. Through we dispute the contention made by the Governor that in housing (or any other matter) the Government owes a duty to the people, we do not propose to allow that divergence of view on a principle of government to distract our attention, or that of the public, from the main issue before us—the eradication of the appalling conditions of housing in Nairobi and Mombasa. Thirty thousand people are to go very far, especially in price, to find a substantial flat.

Before plans can be made to spend in kind in that connection some Italian stone masons and other artisans might be glad of a job we must thank you for our objective is. If every African in the service of Government were provided with proper housing, there would still remain the even more urgent and large problem of the rent. A decent African, and there are many such, is just as much attracted to live in good and attractive surroundings as anybody else and if we remember what happened in Trinidad and even in Mombasa, we shall not hesitate to pay a heavy insurance premium against the social unrest which inevitably breeds under such conditions. We are allowed to persist.

It is true that the African cannot today do more than pay an economic rent for the type of house we should like to see built for him. Nor will he be able to do so for the next few years. But it is a fact which has been realized all over Africa and far-reaching authorities in the United States of Congo and elsewhere, have not allowed so material a consideration as an economic rent to interfere with their determination to provide improvement.

If we in Kenya have that determination we shall get the money, and we will maintain that if the Government had not withheld the money, the Nairobi Municipal Council, legitimately and rightly sought, to raise a Municipal Loan for a housing scheme, we should have had part of it completed today at a cost much below what we shall have to face now. The least the Government can do, in recompense, is to help the Municipality in every profitable direction to finance it, and remembering that as far as we possibly can we must build for the future, we should remember the war has imposed on us. His Excellency certainly recognized the fact that the Legislative Council, March 1940, with the British War Paper on Colonial Development and Reconstruction, and the disturbing Report on the Mombasa crisis very recently before him, that the Municipality should be their application a year earlier still.

Now that everybody is anxious to make a start as soon as possible, we in Kenya may set our hands to a job of which we shall all be proud. We shall not do any guidance, the Government has recently seen some of the latest samples of housing schemes, and information and plans are ours for the asking from all over Africa.

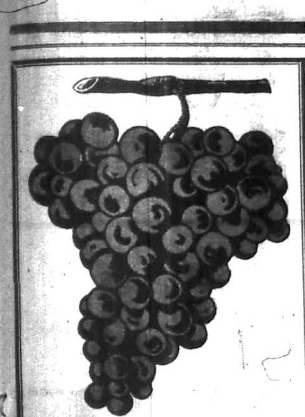

THE CASE AGAINST PLURAL VOTING

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard"
In your issue of 2nd inst. Mr. Conway Harvey writes to me regarding Plural Voting. This must be a signpost of the direction in which the minds of the people are turning. I will enlighten him as far as I am able. We were a happy, united community, as far as the vote was concerned, until the coffee industry was working and we became dissatisfied with the Coffee Owners' Association to protect our interests. We had a meeting in our state where the delegates favourable to the Board were elected with the vote of the voting—then introduced for the first time. The result was that one company, of planter, with over 100 small ones. Owing to Plural Voting the Board was elected over 1,000 acres and out-voted the small planters that the latter became aggrieved and refused to attend meetings. One of the three farms has lately joined the Coffee Owners' Association. Feeling dissatisfied, and an air of suspicion and distrust pervaded the district. The District Association also went up.

At a meeting in August 1940, after delegation had been elected, the vote was taken on the question of Plural Voting. The majority of voters were against that measure yet two delegates actually went straight from that meeting to the conference and voted for Plural Voting. One delegate was absent, and another delegate refused to vote either way. Only Colonel Brierley carried out the mandate of the majority of voters. It was not a match vote as some disappointed Plural Voters would like to make out. I shall be very surprised if the single delegate in favour of Plural Voting is elected at Nairobi for the coming conference.

There has been a great revolution of feeling amongst planters and owners during the past years against the dictatorship of the existing Coffee Control and Coffee Board. The pockets of planters have been so hard hit that they have taken heart, and are determined to have say in matters affecting their farms. Mr. Hunter found this out in 1935. Mr. Walker's recent small pamphlet showing a majority of 200 to 100 votes against Plural Voting is proof of the awakening of the people who are interested. I do not think Mr. Harvey has had his eyes opened by seeing what a delegate pointed out at a Conference meeting, namely that the election of the N.A.P. President was what is now in use by the Board. What good enough for 120,000 of Americans was likewise used by one of your own planters. This system did give delegates a chance to discuss matters at Conference which changes their minds would have under a Plural

Hammond was out for 20 in his first knock, being clumped by Hartshill off one of Jones' deliveries in an attempt to hit the ball over out of the Municipal area. In that brief spell, however, he hit a couple of sixes and a four.

His second knock also ended as a result of trying to hit a "twelve" off Hartshill's bowling. The rest of the spectators had their fill of the kind of sparkling batting which Hammond has made his own. It was not a Test standard but an excellent one, thoroughly interesting cricket.

For the Military XI C. Jones (3/12) finished the ball well and his leg spinners were always dangerous. Hartshill bowled the most overs, kept a steady length and took 3/23. In the second innings the Military captain, P. T. Hartshill (21) and A. E. Larsen (12) were the only double-figure scorers, the remaining wickets

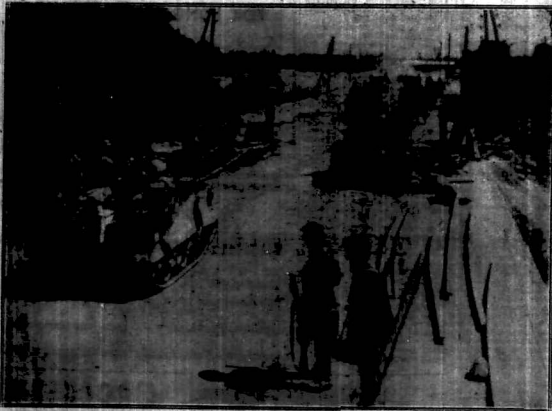
