# Price Control In Union

Increased powers to control wholesale and retail prices, including those of manufactured goods are given to the Minister of Commerce and Industries in regulations which have been laid down in the new South Africa under the War Measures Act.

The Minister may determine the maximum selling price of such goods, irrespective of their cost, or he may lay down that of the selling price shall not exceed a stated percentage of the cost of the goods. The Minister may also determine the charge that may be made for carrying out the provisions of the Act. Dealers may be exempted by the Minister from the provisions of the Act.

# WAR DESTROYED 68,000 BRICK HOUSES

The French Press quoted a report during the last week that 68,000 brick houses were destroyed and 178,000 severely damaged. 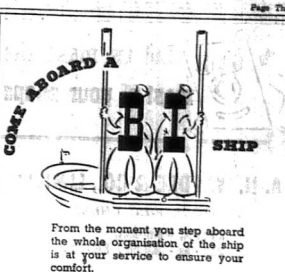

# MORE STORIES OF GALLANTRY IN E.A. CAMPAIGN

## Captain Who Took Most of a Division

MANY BRAVE N.C.O.s.

**OFFICERS** and other ranks of the British Army who served in the East Africa campaign figure in the latest list of immediate awards for gallantry approved by the Commander-in-Chief, Middle East. These include descriptive awards and circumstances in which the honours were won, as published below.

**MILITARY CROSS**  
**Captain John Burke McGavin, C.M.G. D.S.O., D.S.M.C., D.S.M.**  
Captain McGavin was awarded the Military Cross for conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He was in command of the advance guard of a Mobile Column moving from Addis to Hula in pursuit of the retreating 24th Italian Division. In spite of atrocious road conditions, heavy rain, the river overflowing in his task night and day, and the fact that he had only a few miles from Addis. He had the 5th Armoured Gren and three platoons. Without hesitation he advanced on the enemy position and captured 20 Europeans and 1,000 Africans who surrendered arms and two platoons of infantry. He immediately went after them with armoured cars and two platoons of infantry. One having been left in the rear after the first batch of prisoners took the objectives. Although it was getting late he had his objectives with him and his armoured cars and two platoons. He arrived at Hula about 2.00 p.m. on May 29. A large enemy force of approximately 100 Europeans and 1,000 Africans was occupying Hula, and Captain McGavin's force must have been in full view of the position for the last few miles, giving the enemy every opportunity to judge the size of the force.

Undaunted, Capt. McGavin summoned the enemy to surrender. The enemy demurred, saying they were a small force composed of such-and-such a unit. Captain McGavin gave them ten minutes to decide. The enemy promptly surrendered. By his gallantry, initiative and perseverance, Captain McGavin was instrumental in capturing 20 Europeans, 2,000 Africans and much material—the major portion of the 24th Italian Division.

It is not, however, so clear that the Japanese appreciation of the value of the opportunity for a successful development of the 'New Order' in the East is quite the same thing as the urgency of the normal need for relief in Russia. There is at present a tendency on the part of Japan to hesitate before they plunge and that hesitation may be due to the fact that preparations for defence as well as attack are not yet complete, that the outcome of the struggle in Russia is not sufficiently clear even to Japanese official thinkers, or that Japan is as yet quite sure that the United States will keep out of the Far East war if a conflict begins. We may, therefore, expect the present stage of the world war to continue in Japan, while military preparations go on apace in various directions to confuse the issue.

But Japan only one pawn in the game. While Germany here partner to cause a diversion in the East, it is a useful gain control of important seaboard bases. Hitler is no less anxious to get his hands on the French ports in North and West Africa. Control of these is of the greatest importance to him in his operations which have been in mind for the western Mediterranean and Spain, and for the hampering of the movement of our own supplies and reinforcements through the Mediterranean to thwart or minimize a German attack on Turkey with the Danubians as the first objective. So far as West Africa is concerned, it is obvious that ports such as Dakar and Algiers, fresh impetus to the German plans for continuance of the Battle of the Atlantic. It is, however, there are indications that throughout the French Empire in Africa the balance in favour of Vichy is unassailably supported by General Weizmann, and German stiffening would be invaluable to the success of the plan which the Darlan group has made for full collaboration with the Germans.

The news that Vichy will have come as a disappointment to all friends of France, and there are still many, who hoped that what was left of French pride and love of liberty would be jealously safeguarded within the limits of the armistice. But the same of General Petain's broadcast leaves little hope that the Darlan group has any such desire or intention. General Petain has moved still closer to Germany and a Nazi system of dictatorship and suppression, whether of his own volition or at the instance of the Darlan group is not very clear. The fact that support centres of the armed forces of France has been placed in the hands of Admiral Darlan leaves little room for doubt where Vichy would stand. Declarations that the French Empire will be defended against all common enemies little in the light of that decision. What is clear is that if it left Admiral Darlan in charge, Vichy will be given all facilities and the use of all the remaining forces of France as aid in the war against the British Empire and her allies.

It is possible, of course, though not probable, that General Weizmann, whose name still will power in French Africa, will decline to hand his authority over as Germany is that his considerable anti-German element in the French African Empire will oppose the Darlan group. We cannot say longer but any hopes on such a development and we have to reckon with the probability of that, that what is left of the French Empire will be progressively handed over to the enemy by the men of Vichy, bringing the United States and the United States—face to face with problems even more complicated and difficult than those with which we are dealing today. So why involve themselves in a war again? From the point of view of the British people it is becoming increasingly clear that they must put first their own interests and are going to achieve and allow nothing to stand in the way of their own interests. It is not adding further to the humiliation of France, well and good; that the essential objective of the French people is to see that the French people threaten our cause we must act accordingly. We have still many adherents in France, and among French people outside, who believe in us and are actively helping and we must continue to differentiate as clearly as we can between those in Vichy who are traitors to the traditions of France, and those others who are working and living dangerously for a British victory. All help we can give them is to let them know that the French Empire who stand by us, must not accept the view of Vichy as the expression of what is the broken heart of France.

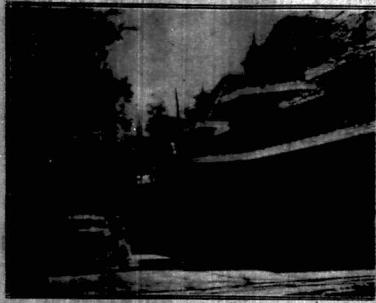

# Design for Living

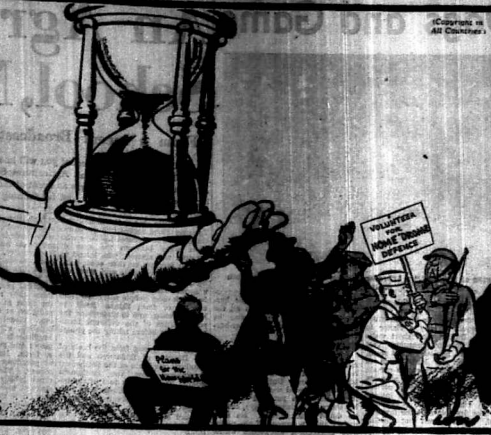

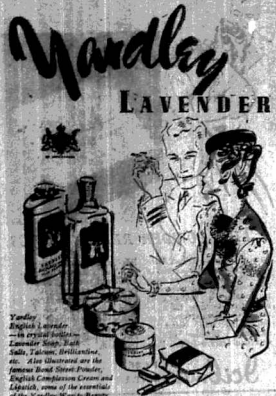

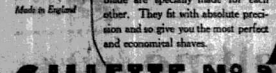
