AIDED CROPS SCHEME Subukia Farmers' Suggestion

At a general meeting of Subukia Farmers' Association on August 7, Capt. Dickinson gave a resume of Government's proposals on crop production, and a long discussion followed on the subject held.

The meeting was held at the Government House, and the following letter was drafted for dispatch by Mr. C. P. Nicholson, the Director, Secretary, to the Chairman of the Settlement and Production Board.

"Your circular letter of July 11 on the Agricultural Sub-Committee was forwarded to the general meeting of the Subukia Farmers' Association on August 7. It was realized that a great deal of useful work had been done in regard to the actual and guaranteeing of prices, but there was a strong feeling that the whole attitude of Government towards crop production was lacking.

"It is necessary for the welfare of the West that adequate supplies should be saved by the Government of wheat in this country, then we would suggest that Government should consider the possibility of encouraging farmers to grow wheat which is to be sold to the Government at a price which is to be fixed by the Government. It is a fact that the wheat crop is not produced in this country in quantities that if Government were prepared to purchase it they would be encouraged to grow more wheat than they are at present doing.

"We consider it unreasonable to ask farmers who may already be deeply in debt to produce wheat for the Government to add further to their liabilities by having their wheat bought at a price which is to be fixed by Government against any possible loss due to crop failure.

"This Association writes a memorandum giving a detailed account of your Board on November 17, 1945, regarding the matter, in your letter on November 6, 1945.

"We believe that it would be in the best interests of the Government to take all risk and the farmer all the profit, so that the farmer would be encouraged to produce wheat in quantities which would be sufficient to meet the needs of the Government for wheat for its own use.

"It is suggested that the Government should purchase wheat from farmers at a price which is to be fixed by the Government, and that the Government should be responsible for the marketing of the wheat.

"The question of loaned insurance was also raised, and the Director of Settlements was requested to advise on the matter.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING FOR AFRICANS

To Increase Earning Power & Efficiency

HOUSING ON FAMILY BASIS AN ALLIED PROBLEM

THE desirability of vocational training for Africans in Nairobi is the subject of considerable discussion at Friday's meeting of the Nairobi Association of Commerce when in the view of the members of the committee on the problem a special sub-committee was appointed to investigate the matter and report to the Chamber. The members with powers to appoint additional members, who consisted of Mr. J. P. Holden, A. J. Dea Smith, F. K. Holden and Mr. J. K. Lawrence.

By invitation, the meeting was attended by Mr. F. C. Colchester, Mr. A. A. Lawrie, Mr. E. A. Davies, of the Kenya A. C. Chamber, Mr. P. C. Colchester, Municipal Native Affairs Officer, who gave forward various points to the Chamber.

In the course of discussion, several speakers stressed the need for adequate housing on a family rather than a "boarding" basis, was strongly bound up with the problem of giving better African artisans and a competency enhanced earning power and means to their high standard of living.

The matter was introduced by the Chairman, Mr. A. A. Lawrie, and a letter from the Director of Education was read asking for suggestions for technical classes for Africans. Mr. Lawrie, a very important subject and one which should be given the most serious consideration. He estimated a well known Mr. A. A. Colchester dealt with the Nairobi continuation classes which the Municipality contributes to all communities and said that far there was only one technical class for Africans, the electrical class, which was attended by a number of Post Office and E. A. Davies and Lighting Co. employees. The organization was asked to consider the formation of other technical classes for Africans, which were difficult with regard to the Chamber of Commerce which suggested suitable subjects for additional classes.

Mr. Colchester made reference to training facilities, such as the N.I.T.D., where Africans were trained as electricians, carpenters, tailors, etc., and to the Railway Apprenticeship Scheme, where—based in a hotel—the Africans were trained in a variety of trades in the Railway workshops. These trained included mechanics, fitters, electricians, engine drivers, coachmen, and so on. He stated that he had a technical school for its own.

Mr. P. C. Colchester, who was opposed to making the cities more attractive to the natives, stressed the Chamber's views on the subject of such classes, or apprenticeship schemes.

Advantages of Youth

He stressed the need to keep Africans from the cities, and agreed that classes were needed for the purpose of training and employment which was better than the present state of affairs.

Mr. A. A. Lawrie suggested that the view that only technical education of all types could be given to Africans, he stressed the fact that there had been many applicants for training Africans in the past, but that the Chamber had also thought there would be a good opportunity for technical training.

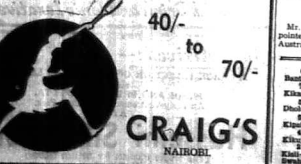

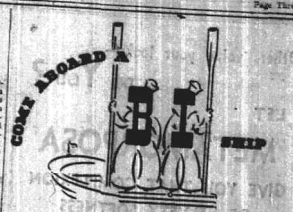

LONDON LETTER: A REVIEW OF THE NEWS

STANBROOK, London, August 17.—It is increasingly clear that the President Roosevelt and our Prime Minister are well-meaning. Both have expressed throughout the world and it is obvious that it has revealed the press offensive of Hitler.

The Times expresses public opinion when it says: "It had long been hoped that the highest admiration would still have had been a genuine deficiency. The world now knows for what we are fighting and what the enemy is fighting against. Perhaps the highest variance is to make it clear on both sides of the Atlantic that there is recognition that a genuine course must include both the realisation and the determination against breaking it."

The Daily Telegraph says that the momentous meeting promises a change which, by united effort, has transformed the 2,000 miles of coast from an abysmal dividing us, into the means of a bond of union and an endless bed of communication and supply.

The Sunday Times, after eulogising the declaration says that it could have wished for something more substantial, namely, a clear pronouncement of American policy concerning the Far East.

"War to End War?"

Mr. J. L. Garvin, writing in the Observer says that since the official separation of Britain and America 140 years ago there has been nothing to equal the conference. This is a real war to end war. In 1818 we did not know enough, but this has now no doubt. Mr. Garvin assumes that other results of the conference will be:

- (1) American aid for the Battle of the Atlantic will be strengthened.
- (2) A further change-over from ordinary manufacture to war production.
- (3) The calm determined attitude to Japan which is more likely to attract Russia before attempting a move southwards, in view of the exorbitant Chinese war. He adds that never was a million possessed by a more suicidal policy of overstrain and catastrophe than Japan. The only question is time and, unless wisdom prevails, these considerations are dominated by Russia and south anxiety about the speed of the war is allowed by later power conference.

In the sixth week of Russian resistance it is impossible that Germany will conquer before the winter. If the tempo, that winter will set her back.

Mr. Tavin concludes by saying that Mr. Churchill and Mr. Roosevelt have gained stature if they give outstanding support to Russia as outlined, then the next phase of the war may be the last.

German anxiety is not only due to the charter's long distance importance, since in the more immediate sphere it constitutes a direct threat to Hitler's complete programme at Kiev and secures a United States of Europe to include the Ukraine and North African Colonial France. It is, however, apparent the idea of a United States of Europe would be left to step through the channels of resistance during the winter, but now the character of the struggle is changing. It offers freedom to the coupled countries.

Japan's delay in taking further

General Lord Bridgeman, Director General of the Home Guard, in a review of recent exercises, has given more training in order to improve efficiency. He emphasised that the art of taking cover should be more developed as invasion was possible, not only from the sea, but from the air.

against a dishonest customs clerk.
"So long as there are dishonest customs clerks in the Customs Department there can be no peace in the Customs Department."
Special Charge.
The Solicitor-General then detailed the seven charges against Narayan. The first charge dealt with four cases of goods imported from Hongkong by Koonhoobhai Karmali. It was alleged that Narayan on April 26, 1938, delivered up the goods which were liable to forfeiture in that they were liable to forfeiture in that they were valued at 782/22 when they were valued at 2,562/82 upon which duty of 1/10/10 was paid.
The second charge was that Narayan on April 28, 1938, added and sold 18 1/2 cwt. of opium in evading the duty payable on the first charge.
Under the third charge, Narayan was charged with delivering up on May 10, 1938, an additional case of goods imported by the same firm when they were liable to forfeiture because they were valued at 588/10 when they were valued at 220/20 when entered in fact the goods were valued at 502/7 was evaded.
The fourth charge concerned goods with aiding and abetting B. N. Karmali in evading payment of the duty of 272/3 which was part of the duty in the third count.
The fifth charge dealt with four bales of cotton imported from the firm of Koonhoobhai Karmali. It was alleged that Narayan, on July 12, 1938, delivered up the bales which were liable to forfeiture as they were falsely valued at 332/22 when the 4 1/2 duty had been paid whereas in fact the bales were valued at 449/10 upon which duty of 389/10 was payable.
Under the sixth charge which arose from the foregoing it was alleged that Narayan aided and abetted B. N. Karmali in evading payment of the duty which was part of the duty payable on the four bales.
The seventh and last count which dealt with opium consisted of a charge framed under the Penal Code. It was framed on the 11th November, 1938. Narayan removed from the firm of Koonhoobhai Karmali on four occasions 500 cwt. of opium on account of having passed false import duty entries, whose numbers were discharged by the Customs Department in breach of the duties of his office.
The first witness, Mr. Fred Bishop, collector in charge of the Customs and Excise Department, was then called and gave evidence of the proceedings in the long room prior to 1938.

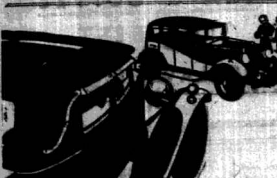

THE OCCUPIED TERRITORIES

Have We a Policy?

Yesterday we asked in the name of the people of the British East African Territories whether the authorities concerned intend to give the public any information regarding what is happening in the occupied countries and their neighbours. It is not a matter of military security. The public do not want to know military dispositions or arrangements. They are interested in the civil aspect of the series of problems presented to the British East African Territories by the occupation of Italian Somalia and Ethiopia and Abyssinia.

We may be told that since the appointment of a British Minister of State in the Middle East, all questions of policy are decided in Cairo. If that is so, and if the East African department of the Colonial Secretary's Office, which is merely a branch, then permission should be sought from the Middle East headquarters, or from some other authority, to be allowed to take some steps in these British Territories to let the public know the position.

Firms have just been invited to send in applications for permission to trade in the occupied territories. It is not clear what conditions there are as a background to trading enterprises? What are the circumstances under which trading will be allowed? What is the position of stocks of goods in the occupied Territories?

It is not clear what is to be the impact control of the East African Territories in respect of the supply of tradable commodities in markets where so little is known? What are the currency complications and how are they to be overcome? What, if any, are the Customs facilities and charges? What restrictions, if any, are at present imposed on money transfers? What have commercial interests in Somalia and Ethiopia and under what conditions are other traders, such as the Armenian, carrying out these functions? To what extent is the desired to encourage trade and what steps are being taken?

These are only some of the questions which people are asked. We have also been invited to require whether there are postal facilities and, if so, what they are. We have been asked what policy governs the management of the existing land, farms and plantations, whether these are being carried on, if so by whom and with what end in view? To what extent the price

equal requirements of the communities and military forces are being met from the local resources of the Territories, and communications with the various purposes as between the group of territories, and how far private civil activities are still governed by military considerations.

Everybody knows that the economies of areas like Somalia and Ethiopia were largely destroyed prior to the war extensive and valuable irrigation schemes, particularly in the Sudan, were destroyed such as canals and production as had been introduced. But what is not known today is how far these irrigation and other works are being operated and, if they are being operated, and to what extent the civilian population of the East African Territories and the productive and commercial organisations can take any part in maintaining the pre-war productivity of the areas in question.

Large numbers of Italians, both prisoners of war and civilians, are being transferred to British territory and this imposes a considerable burden on our resources and it is reasonable to enquire how far it has been possible, or is contemplated, to harness the productive capacity and machinery of the occupied Territories in the general work of war-time production.

And, indeed, how far we are planning to employ these territories and their population in the East African Territories and in the production of the British Empire as producers.

All we know is that considerable numbers of people, many experienced in Colonial Administration at present or in the past have gravitated to the new department called O.E.T.A. and have been given military ranks and the accompanying emoluments in some cases, considerable. But apart from administration of law and order, the settlement of disputes and the ordinary functions which a D.C. or other administrative officer normally discharge, with the problem of Italian civilians as a complication, nobody outside the office of the authorities knows what is being done.

Yet the range of problems created by the occupation of the complex areas is so wide, and in some cases so urgent in relation to our own war preoccupations and responsibilities, that it is not unreasonable to urge again that steps should be taken to acquaint the public with at least the main facts. Why there is all this secrecy we cannot understand.

There are more instances of this kind. The members of the French Chamber of Deputies has arrived in London for the first time since the French Foreign Minister, the Governor-General of French West Africa, and the French High Commissioner in Dakar after a long period of absence from the country.

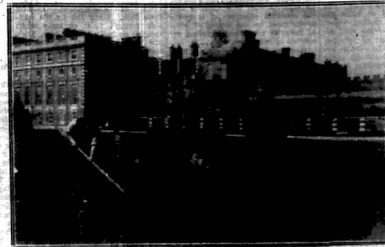

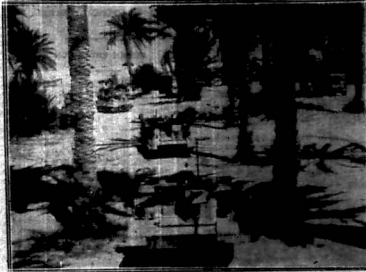

SUPPLY OF GOODS TO ARMED FORCES

Modified System To Be Introduced

RECENTLY the East African Standard published an out-of-date article on the present system of requisitioning goods for the military use on an arbitrary price and credit basis.

The old system has now been abandoned through the Kenya Supply Board's self-empowered to place in certain cases the goods supplied to the Armed Forces.

A statement setting out the new and considerably modified system has been issued to the following:

The following arrangements in regard to the military purchases of goods are to be introduced from the 1st of January, 1946, and Government Notice No. 148 of 1946, and Government Notice No. 149 of 1946, have been issued.

The effect of the cancellation of the order in that certain whole-sale percentages of profit may be charged on goods sold to the military, provided that they conform with the terms of the various articles.

Under the power granted to it by Regulation 10 of the Kenya Supply Board's Regulations, the Board will continue to issue orders for goods to be supplied to the military.

Military purchases will be effected in consultation with the Supply Board and full regard will be paid to the requirements of the civilian community but no special priority or priority service need be given.

Importers of the commodities have been requested to provide the Supply Board with the information which will enable the Board to keep closely in touch with the local stock position.

In calculating the appropriate wholesale price whether for civilian or military sales, the Supply Board has approved the inclusion of the following charges in the cost:

Cost free on board, Insurance, Freight, Landing Charge, Handling Charge, Interest and Exchange, and Crating Charge.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING FOR AFRICANS

To Increase Earning Power & Efficiency

THE desirability of vocational training for Africans in Nairobi is the subject of considerable discussion at Friday's meeting of the Kenya Vocational Training Committee.

The matter was introduced by the Chairman, Mr. A. L. Lewis, and the report was read and approved.

Mr. Lewis, a very important subject and one that should be given the most serious consideration.

The Kenya Vocational Training Committee is a body set up to coordinate the training of Africans in technical skills.

Price of Goods and Statutory Profit

The question of the release of the price of goods for essential civilian needs was among statutory raised at the meeting of the Kenya Trade and Industry Commission.

The Chairman stated that the report on the price of goods was submitted to the Kenya Trade and Industry Commission.

Mr. E. H. Sayer pointed out that the problem of price control was a very serious one and that it was necessary to consider the interests of both the consumer and the producer.

Mr. E. H. Sayer stated that the Government was considering the possibility of introducing a system of price control for essential goods.

It was decided that the Government should continue to monitor the price of goods and to take such steps as may be necessary to ensure that the needs of the community are met.

A LETTER FROM LONDON:

News Indiscretions In America

PREMATURE REFERENCES TO BRITISH WAR PLANS

London, August 22.

LONDON was indeed glad to welcome the Prime Minister and I think everybody agreed with Mr. Alexander, the First Lord of the Admiralty, when he remarked that it was a load off his mind to see the Atlantic meeting had of course been arranged by the Admiralty.

Message Continued

One of Mr. Churchill's last talks in his visit to the Mainland and per-sonally who represent British views at the Moscow conference. This conference continued to attract much attention here. The Daily Telegraph declares that if the result of the visit is to weaken the output of supplies in America and if the resulting volume exceeds what was intended, it may well prove a decisive factor in the war.

The newspapers today regularly carry warnings against comment on the part of the public. This comment is criticised in part, and the stubborn Russian defence and the opinion of these German allies and also from the absence of heavy air raids for many weeks. The newspapers point out, however, that the war is entering upon a critical phase and that the utmost speed in preparation, both here and in America, is necessary.

Insider's View

The London Evening News says that the Downing Street communique regarding an American report on the meeting of Congress leaders, after stating "President Roosevelt" that Britain is not contemplating leaving the continent at present, suggests the reason that our industries are not yet able both to maintain the great army in the Middle East and to equip a force strong enough to transport it.

The News Chronicle on the other hand, suggests that the American report about no British invasion is the making of a serious mistake in the United States which has been causing criticism in London. Through the American press a hint in the statement of Mr. Churchill, it did not get a train from public opinion about his voyage to America while it was being recommended.

Whether announced in advance the landing of American forces in Iraq, still thus endangering the lives of British and American soldiers and allies.

An interesting comment on the Churchill-Bismarck episode, denounces the view from Mr. Bismarck, Minister of Labour and National Service, and the Transport Secretary, General Workers' Union Conference, he implied the denunciation and suggested that after the war there should be a system of international pooling of raw materials and thought. Among other things advocated by Mr. Bismarck was raising and maintaining a citizen and democratic army. There should be a social obligation on everyone to defend their own homeland and the army should never again be allowed to be disbanded as it had been at the end of the last war. The old out-look, he said, had been defective all the time.

Mr. Bismarck was to be a party to a policy of stabilising wages until a price policy had been settled. He announced that the Government is considering a fairly wide development of the rationing system, and merely with the object of controlling prices, but to get correct distribution. The newspapers have given a welcome to Mr. Bismarck's statement about the army and regard it as profoundly important that the army should not be forgotten after the war is over. The Daily Sketch, upon the pre-

sentation of the pay commission which soldiers are paid less than practical purposes.

Enemy's Shipping Lines

The news about the extent to which the enemy has suffered shipping losses recently has had a weakening effect. The Admiralty has estimated that since July 19th, British shipping losses have exceeded those of the enemy a grand total of 4,000,000 tons from the start of the war. The Daily Telegraph points out that the maximum percentage of the enemy's shipping tonnage is estimated to be 1,500,000 tons which even if it were to be made good, would not be sufficient to make good the present rate of enemy losses or even the average rate of the outbreak of the war.

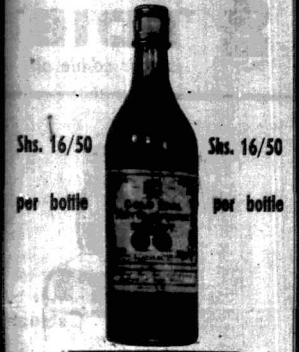
