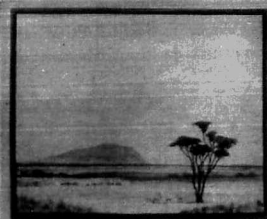

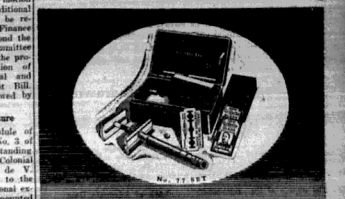

The cause is believed to have been the sharks' oil with which the children had been dosed. This is absorbed at the coast from sharks' liver and is occasionally used as a substitute for cod liver oil.

The headmistress of the School, Mrs. Walfington, herself a fully qualified doctor, is also ill from the same cause but is progressing favourably.

All stocks of sharks' oil are now being examined and immediate instructions were issued to prohibit its use pending investigations.

Administrative, Police and Medical officers have been rushed to Malindi both by motor car and aeroplane.

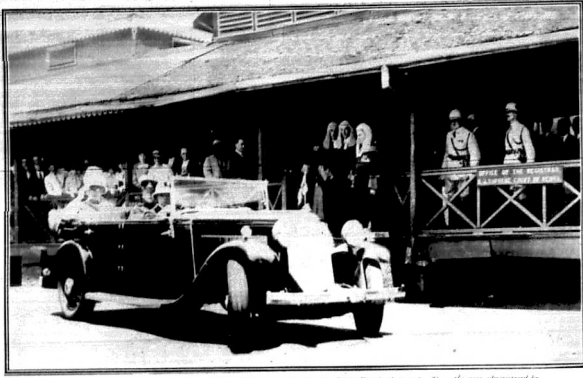
