Check to Greyhound Racing

BOTH HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT HAVE A BUSY DAY

It is expected that the Royal Assent will be given to-day to the Betting and Lotteries Bill which passed its third reading in the House of Commons on Wednesday.

This will mean the end of the Irish Sweepstake as far as Britain is concerned since the importation and sale of tickets will be prohibited as well as also the publication of newspapers of any kind. Newspaper competitions, unless depending substantially upon skill, are also to be prohibited.

After the Betting and Lotteries Bill has been passed, the Government will move on to the Bill which will become operative after the Royal Assent has been given on Friday, to rigidly apply the law which will prohibit the sale of all lottery tickets, the prohibition of the publication of lists of winners of lottery tickets, and the prohibition of the publication of the names of winners of lottery tickets.

Newspaper and other publications depending on the results of sporting events will be prohibited, equally any newspaper competition which does not substantially depend upon skill. Detailed Survey Urged

IRRIGATION CANAL UPPER REACHES TO WATER 200,000 ACRES

The two Commissioners appointed by the Secretary of State months ago to report upon the possibility of agricultural development in the Tana River valley, have submitted their recommendations and these were issued yesterday.

The expedition which carried out its work in very difficult country recommends that a detailed survey be carried out to prove the feasibility of a project outlined by them for the supply of water by irrigation to an area of over 200,000 acres on the upper reaches of the Tana.

The estimated cost is roughly two million pounds and includes an irrigation canal over 100 miles long.

The Commission consider that they have made out a prima facie case for such a project which would, however, take ten years to complete and including a preliminary survey of three years. 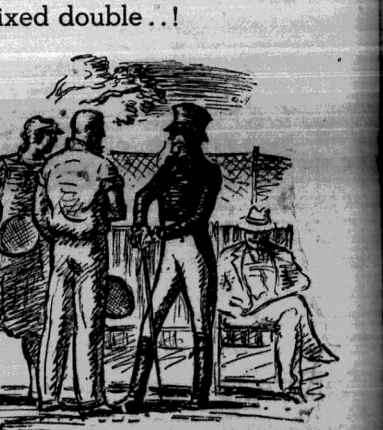

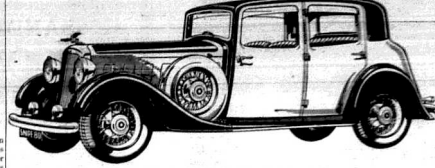

NOTES FOR WIRELESS FANS

Theory and Practice

SEVERAL times lately I have been asked by people who have been doing a little experimenting on their own, whether or not it is worth the while to invest in a set of wireless, the carrying instructions of a theoretically sound design always meets with the same answer and that answer is, "No, it is not worth the while." I have tried here, contrary to theoretical indications, some suggested means. When, having an ignorant reader, who has no previous knowledge, I have taken into consideration the practical results inevitably following the theory extremely clearly. I have, however, speaking, found myself in a very hot water. The trouble is that in a large number of instances not had the factors taken into account in others, they are not all considered.

Case in Point

A case in point concerned a friend of mine who, after having been advised by a lecturer about an extra tuned aerial, had decided to construct one. He was doing this in order to improve the reception of the wireless. I warned him that owing to the losses in the aerial, it would probably not be quite so sensitive as he anticipated. He, however, was of the opinion that his own strength was to be amplified.

However, he decided to put up with this and went off to make the necessary alterations. A few days later he came back full of joy and said that he had achieved his objective. Bad Coupling

What had happened was that in order to secure a reasonable degree of selectivity the original arrangement consisted of a very small aerial, which was coupled to the receiver and giving nothing like the bad coupling. On making the alteration, the coupling was increased and this was very considerably in excess of what was required. The result was that the aerial circuit was over-coupled and this, in turn, led to the appearance of a "beat" note, which is not desirable. This is a very common fault, and it is one which can be avoided by careful attention to the design of the aerial circuit.

Elementary Theory

It is not as if the kind of theory (the elementary theory) practically devoid of mathematical of a higher order than the third (3) which we are talking is the kind of thing which has taken years of close study to master. It is, in fact, sufficiently simple to pick up in a short time by anyone who has a little of a first-hand experience of the subject.

The 1935 Budget

MUST CALL A HALT TO THE POLICY OF DRIFT

Courageous Reconstruction Required

The Kenya Budget for 1935 will be presented to the country on Tuesday next week. It is important and necessary that in view of the continuing gravity of the financial and economic outlook the Government and the people of the Colony should be left in no doubt on the main issues which should be raised at the Budget session.

The present depression began in 1929. It has continued with untiring intensity for five years.

Effective development of this country only began after the war. For one quarter of the period, therefore, Kenya has been facing abnormal conditions.

What is the situation to-day?

Gold-mining is still in the expensive prospecting and development stage. But it has been estimated, that during the last two years no less than £5,000,000 has been invested in Kenya goldmining alone. Gold will play its part—probably a great part—in the development of Kenya and it must continue to receive every necessary assistance and encouragement.

THE MINERAL INDUSTRY

The agriculture industry is, however, still the main industry in Kenya. It represents the real wealth-producing sources and since gold cannot be an immediate factor in restoring prosperity, consideration in all Budget questions must be given to the land and the farmer.

Coffee, which has been the mainstay of the Colony, is now suffering from a lengthening period of depressed prices and three years of drought. During the year 1935 the value of coffee exports was £223 compared with £1,214,392 in 1932—a drop in one industry alone of £1,000,000.

The Dairy Industry is losing money on every pound of milk it produces. The Colony has a normal rainy season, the production will increase by leaps and bounds and the greater will be the loss.

There is no outlet for the large herds of cattle in the country. The Native Reserves, too, are overcrowded to a point which is causing the loss of irreplaceable assets in soil fertility and grazing.

The Sugar Industry is in a precarious state. It is now the subject of international restriction of planting and export. Uganda, where a soft cane is used with a high sucrose content, could flood the Kenya market. Kenya plantations, are at serious disadvantage.

Tea, one of the brightest and most promising of the Colony's new industries, is no longer able to expand normally. It, too, has come under the ban on new planting (except to a limited extent) imposed by international agreements.

Sisal is unable to produce at a profit and there is no sign of real improvement in prices. It has been difficult enough to meet even maintenance costs and there is a pressing job of replanting programmes. There is a movement in the Sisal Industry also to restrict export.

Cereals, after experiencing an encouraging rise in prices are again suffering from depression. The promise of improvement through the expected adverse effects of drought in several countries has not been fulfilled. Maize values are lower and the wheat market is sagging. The demand for barley has also declined.

LAND LOSSES.

The total acreage in European occupation in Kenya is 60,000 less than last year and 175,000 acres below the figure for 1921.

The cultivated area is 100,000 acres less than it was in 1930—a decline of nearly one-sixth.

Five hundred Europeans (landowners and employees) have disappeared from the land compared with the 1933 figures.

That is the background against which the Budget must be studied by the country this year.

The Budget Session is regarded by the country as the appropriate occasion for the reported estimate of the Government's financial policy and of its economic plans.

The 1935 Budget can be no exception.

There is an urgent need for emphasis on two cardinal principles—firstly recognition of the inability of the country to continue to finance its present administrative machine, and secondly the urgent need for a policy of reconstruction for immediate application.

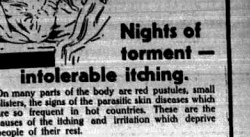

THE 1933 BUDGET

LIGHTENING THE BURDEN OF COSTS OF GOVERNMENT

East African Unification

The last paragraph of the article yesterday on the problems of the 1933 Budget read as follows:—

"There is an urgent need for emphasis on two cardinal principles: firstly recognition of the unity of the country to continue to finance its present administrative machine and, secondly, the urgent need for a policy of reconstruction for immediate application."

There is only one direction in which there is any real hope of effecting large decreases in overhead charges and of providing services without impairing the value and efficiency of these services.

This direction is in the unification of the East African Territories under a single Government.

THE MANDATE

The Mandate for Tanganyika Territory gives full power and freedom to bring about this money-saving change. Section 10 reads:—

"The Mandatory shall be authorised to constitute the Territory into a Customs, Fiscal and Administrative Union or Federation with the adjoining Territories under his own sovereignty or control provided always that the measures adopted to that end do not infringe the provisions of the Mandate."

Consider the history of ten years of vacillation and try to reckon what would have been saved these three Dependencies if for a decade they had been carrying jointly the cost of a single Government, with one Governor instead of three and one service where each has its own today.

TEN YEARS OF HISTORY

In 1924 the Ormsby-Gore Commission reported in favour of closer co-operation and proposed a system of inter-territorial conferences to maintain and improve contact.

Later the Hilton Young Commission approved the principle but the members disagreed on the constitution to be applied in Kenya.

The Permanent Under Secretary of State for the Colonies

nies at the time, Sir Samuel Wilson, came out to compare those differences, obtained an agreement on federation and suggested the appointment of a High Commissioner with certain reserved powers, to be imposed on top of the existing Legislatures.

Still later (in 1931) the Joint Select Committee of both Houses of Parliament came to the conclusion that the time was not ripe for formal union but considered that close co-operation and contact should be continued.

In ten years progress has been made to an extent not generally realised.

East Africa has a single currency, a unified Postal Service, a Customs Union, an East African Medical Service, a jointly financed agricultural research centre, a Government Conference system, regular conferences between the officers from every Dependency, including the Chief Native Commissioners, common principles of taxation, co-ordinated commercial law and practice, a common Languages Board, a common basis of legislation.

But co-ordination by these means has reached its natural limits.

The only way step which faces East Africa is the introduction of a single Government over the three Dependencies and the complete application of that principle to every public service with the abolition of the present posts of Territorial Governors and of separate and costly departmental organisations, whilst preserving intact the special features of each territory.

RETRENCHMENT LIMITATIONS.

A policy of further drastic retrenchment in the ranks of the Civil Service will sever provide a solution of the economic difficulties.

A position is very soon reached by this system of budgeting when the savings effected bear no relation to Budget problems but their results impose grave and harmful disabilities and effects on the general structure of the country concerned. After the initial retrenchment has taken place, further reductions create difficulties out of all proportion to the savings.

Having regard to the burden of taxation which is carried to-day, the people of Kenya are entitled to better services than they get for the money. These services have been curtailed by the policy of retrenchment and their efficiency impaired. Yet in relation to the value of money and to the capacity of the country to pay, there has in fact a greater burden in 1933 than in 1925 when they were being expanded simultaneously with easily earned revenue.

RECONSTRUCTION

It must, however, be emphasised that the unification of Eastern Africa is not an answer to the urgent need for reconstruction. It will only lighten the burden of overhead costs of administering departments and bring these costs more into line with the reduced capacity of the countries to meet them. It will not raise the price of commodities but it will enable these Territories to provide more closely administered and better distributed services—with the saving of a large sum of money.

It must be recognised that owing to the urgency of the need, steps to bring about large-scale savings in the cost of the structure of government must be taken at the earliest possible moment.

During the past ten years courage has been lacking in examining the advantages. Energy and thought have mainly been expended on the task of piling up a record of the difficulties.

After five years of depression, which shows no sign of disappearing, no stronger case could be made out for a reduction in the costs of government by unification than present day difficulties in public and private finance provide.

The 1935 Budget

ALTERNATIVE TAXATION MUST GO

The second article in the 1935 Budget problems, published yesterday, indicated the one major step open to the East African Governments, including Kenya, to effect a large-scale reduction of the overhead costs of their various Territories.

That step is the early unification of the Dependencies under one Governor and the complete application of the same principle to every department of the Public Service.

But even if a decision were taken to-day and courage was not wanting, the unification process would take time.

Relief from the present burden of costs is an urgent need. The plain and inescapable fact is that the country cannot pay for an administrative structure on the present scale. It has not got the financial capacity.

Three of the emergency alternative taxes alone—The Graduated Non-Native Poll Tax, the Package Tax, and the additions to the Trades Licences and Professional Licences Tax—represent a burden in a full year of about £90,000.

That sum, additional to the previously existing taxes, has been taken from the pockets of taxpayers during a year at the height of the depression and at a time when taxable incomes are at their lowest level.

DEPRESSION TAXATION

Since the depression began, numerous new taxes have been imposed. These include:

- Increased Excise Duties on Sugar, Tea and Tobacco
- Entertainment Tax
- Increased Petrol Tax
- Revision Education fees.
- Increased Upwards of Customs Duties on cheap goods.

A study of the following figures, however, offers no escape from the conclusion that the purchasing power and taxable capacity of the country have reached a dangerously low level and that the position is no longer dependent on genuinely created wealth but on imported capital, remittances, pensions and other sums outside the normal earnings from production and exports.

Kenya's trade imports, excluding re-exports from the Colony, before and during the depression disclose the following startling position:

1928	£2,456,377
1931	£2,690,756
1933	£1,938,148

These figures show that during the past five years the purchasing power of Kenya has fallen by £3,000,000 a year.

Business institutions are attempting to maintain themselves with the reduced turnover represented by this serious fall. The majority can only do so by facing heavy losses. That is a position which obviously cannot continue much longer.

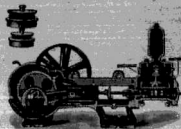

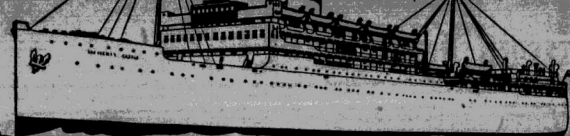

HIS EXCELLENCY REVIEWS THE BUDGET POSITION

Graduated Poll Tax Remains

His Excellency the Governor of Uganda, Sir Bernard Bourdillon, in his Budget speech to the Legislative Council on Thursday said that it was safe to anticipate that at the end of this year at least £110,000 would be added to the Country's surplus balances.

The Graduated non-Native Poll Tax is to remain in force during 1955 but His Excellency stated that a general review of the existing methods of taxation would probably be undertaken in 1956.

A large part of the increased expenditure in the 1955 Estimates is allocated to the Agricultural Department while provision is made for drainage and water supply schemes for Kampala. A hydro-electric scheme at the Murchison Falls is also under consideration.

Increased Agricultural Expenditure

Kampala, Nov. 22.

The new session of the Uganda Legislative Council opened at Entebbe to-day with full ceremony. The guard of honour was commanded by Captain Howard.

A large number of people were present at His Excellency the Governor's speech. He stated that it was quite safe to anticipate that during 1954 Uganda would have added at least £110,000 to the surplus balances. There was no intention on the part of Government to explore new sources of taxation during 1955.

He added that a general review of existing taxation would probably be undertaken early in 1956. It would simply be in the form of an inquiry as to whether the existing system of taxation was the best method for production for Government an income approximately equal to that derived under the present system.

His Excellency stated the hope that the Graduated Non-Native Poll Tax would be removed. It was the definite intention of Government that the tax should remain in force until replaced by some more scientific measure.

Expenditure

In the 1955 estimates the chief increases of expenditure were in respect of two new Agricultural Officers, £200 for the development of the tea industry, additional £200 for the upkeep of Government plantations, permitting the carrying out of comprehensive experiments, £200 for the development of the beeswax industry; an additional assistant entomologist for the investigation of the pink borer pest; two new entomologists; an additional forest officer; an additional instructor of hygiene; four European sanitary inspectors and five nursing sisters in the Medical Department.

The estimates, he said, also provided for a partial scheme covering sewerage, surface drainage and road construction in the municipal or congested areas of Kampala township, and experimental drainage works over part of the rural drainage area. Provision was also made for a second main from the Kampala water works. The Government proposed to proceed with these works during 1955, subject to the estimates not greatly exceeding expectations and to the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

ACTION FOR DAMAGES

Kenya Courts

Bailey vs. Carr

His Honour the Chief Justice, Sir Joseph Sheridan, in the Supreme Court, Nairobi on Wednesday 14th inst. began the hearing of an action for damages brought by John Ernest Clayton Bailey, accountant, and his wife, Hilda, against Ernest Carr, a director of Messrs. Carr, Lawson and Co., Nairobi. The plaintiff who now lives at Ashford, Middlesex, formerly resided in Nairobi where J. E. C. Bailey was employed by defendant's company. The action arises out of certain alleged statements said to have been made falsely and maliciously by the defendant.

Mr. F. S. Modera appears for the plaintiffs and Mr. L. Kupfer for the defendant.

The Pleint

Plaintiffs in their plaint state that on or about July, 1952, J. E. C. Bailey was employed by Messrs. Carr, Lawson and Co. and in that capacity was on a visit to the United Kingdom. His wife resided behind in Nairobi. He is about 71 years of age. It is alleged, went to the plaintiffs home and falsely and maliciously stated to Mrs. Belle, that her husband had on two occasions received company money for which he had been unable to account; that he had misused the company's money and was not to be trusted; that he had debts in Nairobi; that he was being dismissed from his employment with the company; and that Mrs. Bailey could stay in Nairobi but that it would be better for her to leave the country at once.

It is alleged that these statements were, to the defendant's knowledge, false and were spoken to him with intent maliciously to injure, insult and annoy Mrs. Bailey.

Further, it is declared that the defendant made the statements at a time when he knew that Mrs. Bailey was pregnant. By reason of the alleged statements Mrs. Bailey was stated to have suffered a very severe shock to her

nervous system and was made seriously ill; as a result of them she was compelled to leave her home in Nairobi and to live with her husband in England; and further as a result of the severe shock to her nervous system she gave birth prematurely to her child and her health had been permanently injured.

The Claim

By reason of these occurrences it is claimed that J. E. C. Bailey suffered distress of mind on account of his wife's health and condition; had incurred considerable expenses for passage and medical travelling expenses and medical attendance on his wife; had lost the services of his wife and had other losses defined.

The plaintiffs claimed special damages amounting to Shs. 2,784/50.

The defence is a denial of the alleged slander. The defendant in his reply to the plaint states that J. E. C. Bailey was not employed as manager, or as secretary, and accountant to Messrs. Carr, Lawson and Co.

Mr. Bailey was requested to go to Nairobi in connection with one of the firm's agencies and on his return was asked to negotiate certain business in the United Kingdom on behalf of his employers. Defendant denies that he had stated to Mrs. Bailey that her husband had on two occasions received money from the company for which he had been unable to account or that he had misused the company's money or that he had debts in Nairobi. He had not suggested that it would be better for Mrs. Bailey to leave Nairobi at once but had offered to let her free use of a bungalow at "Woodlands" for so long as she required it.

Defendant further denied the offer. Defendant further denies that he had spoken any words or made any statements or uttered any words which were false or which he knew to be false or with the intention to injure, insult or annoy her. He also denies that the interview on July 25 he was aware that Mrs. Bailey was pregnant. He does not admit that she suffered a shock or was made ill by reason of any statements he made or that she was compelled to leave her home for any reason of reputation or health. Defendant further denies that as a result of any of the matters complained of the plaintiff or any of the persons named therein suffered any damages; alternatively damage was not the result of any act or defendant's conduct and was too remote in law. He asks that the plaintiffs' suit be dismissed with costs.

During the course of hearing which lasted a week and is fully reported in the daily edition, it was stated that claim was for £5,000. The claim was reduced to £1,000 on Tuesday and given on Thursday morning.

JUDGMENT IN ACTION FOR DAMAGES

Finding for Defendant

The Court, after having heard the plea in law and the evidence, found in favour of the defendant. His Honour the Chief Justice, Sir Joseph Sheridan, dismissed the action with costs.

His Honour stated that the statements alleged to have been made had not been proved, and that therefore the issue of liability and malice did not arise. Looking at the evidence as a whole, he was of the opinion that far from the defendant in his conduct towards Mrs. Bailey having been actuated by a base, malicious motive, he was to carry out what to him was an unpleasant duty as delicately as possible.

PLATE MAIZE DECLINES

After a very rough preliminary examination of the Murchison Falls it is apparent that if there was a really large demand for power the initial capital cost of a hydro-electric scheme at the Murchison Falls would be much less, and the total power available much greater and in spite of the dilution would prove better than the Tilpin Falls.

Greater Prosperity

His Excellency concluded his speech by saying: "I take great pleasure in expressing the hope that the Budget, which we have met to-day to discuss, will prove, as it appears likely to prove, a first step in resumed progress towards greater prosperity."

The Chief Secretary followed with his speech introducing the Budget Bill and the Council then adjourned until November 25 for the Budget debate.

Resolution Adopted on Closer Union

Mombasa, Thursday. After a debate lasting two hours the session adopted, with two slight amendments, the resolution on "Closer Union." This adopted resolution reads as follows:—

"That in the opinion of this Association of Chambers of Commerce of Eastern Africa the time has now arrived when the community of economic and social interests of the territories of Kenya, Uganda, Tanganyika and Malawi, under a completely unified system of administration, together with the welfare of all may be the more certainly assured.

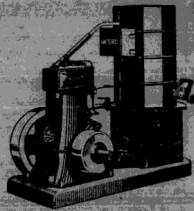
"Furthermore, the degree of co-ordination and co-operation in the policies promoted by the several Governments that has already been secured, warrants in the interests of economy of time and money, a further step in the unification of administration. Not only would there be provided very considerable and much needed relief in the existing financial burden of the administrations but their territories would obtain immeasurable benefits by treating larger economic questions at one time and place and

in an assembly consisting of the most experienced representatives of each territory. Such unification would enable the existing rules to be applied consistently without conflict or jealousy to the many questions of common interest which cannot be satisfactorily settled by one of the individual Governments separated as they are by frontiers arbitrarily ruled across the sea.

"This Association, therefore, urges the Imperial Government to constitute the territories of Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika into a new one, and to extend the same union under its own sovereignty and control, provided that the measures adopted to that end, in this regard, do not infringe the provisions of Tanganyika Mandate, and in the case of the other two Territories will insure just provision for the preservation of their special characteristics as defined by agreement and treaty."

The resolution was officially recorded in the minutes as having been passed unanimously by delegates from Mombasa, having no abstentions, did not vote.
