Anniversary of 1934 P

Turbulent scenes were again enacted in Paris on Wednesday on the anniversary of the 1934 riots. 1,200 were fired at the police by armed Communists and 1,200 arrests were made.

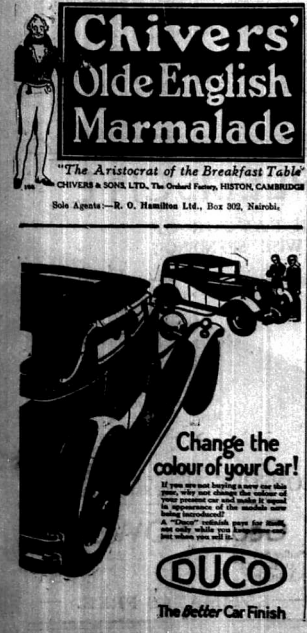

WIRELESS LICENCES
To the Editor, "E.A. Standard,"
Sir—The word "premature" has come as a surprise to "Pip" country listeners and all my licence was due yesterday. I first saw the notice in the paper and was so disappointed that I had to go to the post office to get a licence for the wireless licence for £10.

(1) In this district about a dozen or so sets are used for listening to the wireless licence for £10.
(2) If the person who is responsible for the word "premature" would use constructive energy it should be possible for each home to possess its wireless set.
(3) Wireless sets are taxed on entering the Colony and, plus 5% of the P.M.C. to share, give general revenue so that it does not require any extra on the part of its Department to sit tight and collect the duties.
(4) Presumably the listener and one suspects the Wireless Company Cable and Wireless Ltd. are the only losers in the game.
(5) The listener outside the £20 radius cannot always receive the programmes but has to pay the same licence as the Nairobi listener. At the same time, the transmitting station cannot improve matters until adequate funds are forthcoming.

(6) Here are a few suggestions:
(a) Include all British Territories in Eastern Africa in the respective zone as when the short-wave listeners in Kenya can receive the broadcasts.

RURAL TELEPHONES

Revised Rates Being Considered

"STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.

It is understood that the postal authorities have received information from the public that the postal rates for rural telephony are too high, and the question of revising the rates for rural telephony has been brought to the notice of Government. Enquiries into rural telephony have been completed by the telephone department which now is in a position to put forward proposals to Government. This however does not explain the fact that final minutes for payment of the bills have recently been circulated to the Post Office by subscribers.

It is believed that the proposed revisions will be of a general character and will apply, if approved by Government, to all rural telephony services operating in the Colony. The 1925 telephony rates were based on the regulations governing the service as it existed on January 1, 1925, and the new rates will only come into force on or from the date of introduction. It is not known what percentage reductions in rentals are likely to be made, nor what, if any, extension of the hours of service is to be. The scheme has been forwarded for Government decision and subscribers in the District are anxiously awaiting information that substantial reductions in charges are to be made and an all night service be put into operation.

Problem No. 1000, by R. Gevers (No. 7, special), Key, 1, R-e7. This is a complete block change mate with several good tries, notably Q-c3 beaten by 1...P-P and Q-d3 beaten by 1...K-K3. It is caught nobly.

Problem No. 1001, by A. J. Funk (No. 8 special), Key, 1, K-g7. A good retiring move gaining time and preventing White Q being pinned by 1...P-R. Contains several tries which the competitors surely avoided. Most of the variations are unchanged by the key.

Problem No. 1002, by E. E. Furehian, Key, 1, R-a8. This is a remarkable move seeming to have no possible bearing upon the desired mate in 2. The strategy is appreciated when the variations are explored. They depend upon the various promotions Black P may get at a1—If 1...P-e2, 2, R-h2; etc. If 1...P-g2, 2, R-e8, etc. These variations are very cleverly arranged to prevent Black stalemating. There is a

good trap in 1. Q-g2, defeated by 1...K-a1. Solutions traced out from G. Turner and E. Hepp, and from C. A. Herley (cont).

KEYTA CHAMPIONSHIP. This was the second time since the proper organization of the Kenya championship tournaments. In 1929 the Indian competitor had defeated the European in the final match, the previous occasion being in 1925 when Mr. Barkat Ali beat Mr. S. Mehta in two straight games.

This time Mr. R. Middlefield was the winner of the European Championship with such a good margin of points over all other competitors that it was expected he would win the Kenya title, although it was realized that Mr. Barkat Ali had vastly increased his chess powers lately by the result of the Indian Section of the tournament, where he not only topped all his Indian competitors and came through without losing one game.

The first game of the final match went to Middlefield as he was the more experienced European. The match depended on their Champion getting a draw in the second game which would have been the case had the Indian, however, as well as seen from the score below, played for a win and got it. The score thus was all square at the second game. The third game began at 4.15 p.m. and lasted continuously until 10.30—the most strenuous encounter we remember seeing in Kenya Chess. Barkat Ali played more defensively than in the other games, being content to maintain his own position until Middlefield sought weak spots by attacking. After some really fine strategic manoeuvres on both sides, the game was drawn.

Queen's Pawn Opening. This is the score of the second game in the match. The Indian, level at the great disadvantage of having to win in order to get level, whereas the European only needed to draw to decide the championship in his favour. Barkat Ali therefore did well in playing his Rooks out earlier than his usual custom is, and before his opponent could well do so. Black's 14th move, R-B5, came as rather a surprise to those familiar with the patient Indian style. 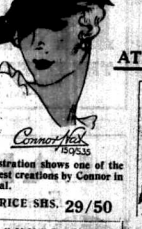

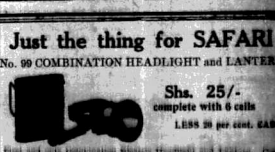

An Old Problem

"I notice that on your agenda
there are to be proposals for a

inducing up-country members to

sident, and I expect it is still a
problem now. It is very diffi-
cult for up-country people to
believe that people sitting in
their offices in Nairobi can pos-

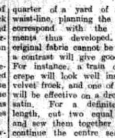

Growth of Traffic at London's Air Port

IMPRESSIVE FIGURES

[FROM A SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT]

London (By Air Mail). In business which has just become available, two facts are to be observed which have done much to bring the growing use of air transport by the public.

One is that during 1931 more than 100,000 passengers, inward and outward, were carried through the London air-port at Croydon. The other is that during the same period nearly 5,000,000 letters were despatched from this country by air.

From an examination of the traffic figures at Croydon it can be seen that the majority of the passengers who used the air-port during 1931 were either second class or returning from flights abroad. The commercial air-line Others were travelling over the long-distance Empire services. Others again were passengers by the British internal flights which operate to and from Croydon, establishing connections with the European and Empire routes. Approximately 50,000 of the passengers passing through Croydon during 1931 made aerial voyages to and from the Channel, the English and Empire routes. Approximately 20,000 of the passengers of these Channel air travellers were now carried in British air-liners.

Tourist Traffic

The popularity of flying with tourists and pleasure travellers was shown particularly during the summer months. At periods of pressure in the holiday season, and during the course of a flight day, the traffic staff at Croydon was dealing with 60 or more incoming or outgoing aircraft.

A romantic feature of the air traffic in and out of Croydon, is the number of specially-chartered aircraft which, in addition to the scheduled services, now set off on great journeys across Europe, or to India or the heart of Africa. These powerful machines, these big specials are always standing ready to leave at a moment's notice. Meeting ocean passengers at Cherbourg and flying them to London; carrying film producers and their equipment to almost special centres in far-off Alaska; pushing business men to appointments hundreds of miles distant; dealing with jockeys to non-motoring on the continent; flying with doctors and surgeons to urgent cases.

Ready Growth

"Traffic continues to grow steadily on our Empire routes," explained an Imperial Airways official. "Heavy bookings have been recorded on all our duplicated routes. Recent figures show an all-round increase of more than 20 per cent on the route to India, and on the East, and of over 40 per cent on the Africa service; while statistics which have just been compiled show that aircraft at Christmas-time established new records on the Empire routes, their total weight in and out of Croydon, amounting to approximately 15,000 tons. It is interesting to note, from comparative figures, how aerial despatches from this country have been getting in record years. In 1931 the number of letters despatched from this country by air was a little over 5,000,000. By 1932 the figure had gone up to 6,000,000. By 1933 it was 6,000,000. And by the end of 1934, or already near the end, the annual total had reached 6,000,000.

That night at London's air-port, when darkness begins to fall, the Traffic Controller in his tower moves over certain activities, and the aerodrome is illuminated for night-flying. Then you see the great air-liners of Imperial Airways, flying in by day, and the smaller night service brings passengers by air from Paris to London.

In addition to night passenger-planes, powerful air-liners fly off from Croydon during the hours of darkness for destinations far across the continent, carrying mails and specially-compiled goods. The moment that letters and parcels posted in London, after business hours close, are delivered early next morning at offices hundreds of miles across Europe.

Italy May Send Ultimatum to Abyssinia

SIGNIFICANT MOBILISATION OF TROOPS IN SOUTH

"A Precautionary Measure"

LEAGUE AUTHORITIES PERTURBED BY LATEST DEVELOPMENTS

The tension between Italy and Abyssinia has become much greater during the last day or two consequent on a renewal of frontier incidents reported yesterday.

Italian troops are marching in Southern Italy "as a precautionary measure" it is stated officially that an ultimatum may be sent to Abyssinia.

A serious view of the situation is taken by League of Nations authorities at Geneva, especially in view of the fact that both sides to the dispute have promised to refrain from provocative measures whilst negotiations for a settlement are proceeding.

An Official Denial

[REUTERS BUREAU'S AGENCY.]

Rome, Feb. 11. It is not believed that the Government intend to send an ultimatum to Abyssinia if it is officially explained that as Abyssinia has not leave Italy much to have made a force of 20,000 on the frontier and to pay 100,000 in the field, it is considered essential that Italian reinforcements should be ready to defend Italian possessions and avoid further frontier incidents.

Two divisions, one at Florence and another at Messina, totaling 20,000 men are ready to go to Abyssinia at any moment.

The Abyssinian Chief of Affairs visited the Foreign Office this morning and this afternoon.

Mobilisation Order. A later message says that a military mobilisation order was given only 48 hours to send 20,000 men and 50,000 doctors, officers and non-commissioned officers.

The purpose of the order is to enable the Italian Government to send reinforcements to the frontier in the event of any incident.

Italy for transportation overseas. It is understood that troops have been sent out or being sent for the purpose of any action in Abyssinia but admit that more reinforcements will be sent if necessary.

Although there is much talk of the possibility of Italy sending an ultimatum to Abyssinia it is not likely such a step will be taken. Italy has recently signed a treaty with Abyssinia in March.

Official Statement. Rome letter. An official communication has been issued suggesting that two divisions were mobilized as a precautionary measure between February 2 and 11. All the 1011 cases of influenza in the last 10 days have also been treated in the military hospitals.

BANK INTEREST RATE To the Editor, "E.A. Standard," Sir—I was indeed pleased to read in your today's daily, due to believe chiefly to the fact that the Governor, that the Bank rate of interest had been reduced to 8 per cent—that that affects us directly at present as I am under no obligation for interest to either Banks or Mortgage Companies. If, however, in the past was a serious item and compelled me to sell my farm at 50 per cent. The fact was I was paying my Bankers the equivalent of over 250 per cent interest on an overdraft which in 1921 was increased by change of currency from 7 per cent to 10 per cent and still I could no longer continue doing so. I applied early in November last year for a reduction of interest from 7 per cent and received from the Manager of the Bank in Nakuru this curt reply: "In reply to your letter of the 26th inst., we regret that we are unable to reduce your rate of interest." Of course, I am aware of the fact that the managers of local banks have to follow orders. I am afraid many farmers are over-indebted and so mortgages, although of course it is a somewhat painful with my farm after 27 years occupation. I believe a great many farms have been bought in by the various banks at ridiculous prices. It would be interesting to know how many farms stand in the names of the banks. 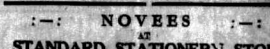

The Italo-Abyssinian dispute is still in a highly critical stage and important developments have taken place lately.
