The fact that the decline in the value of primary products was world-wide and that older and richer countries, particularly those with economies not so fully dependent on agriculture, were able to take emergency measures—such as subsidies and currency revaluation—to alleviate the lot of their producers; made it all the more difficult for Kenya's farmers, with no such alleviation, to compete on the world's markets. The primary producers of other colonies were, to a greater or lesser degree, on the same boat. In many cases they were competing with other Empire producers on shipping and other services markets. The world was living in a lunacy of government and international amity amidst plenty, of starvation and unemployment amidst a babel about over-production. International agreements, schemes of restriction, were dictated rather by the vested interests created than by the interests of millions entitled to benefit from the riches of the earth. To the Empire, the world was all the more fantastic because by far the greater part of foodstuffs entering world markets was produced in the United Kingdom. Within the Empire there is an immense range and quantity of primary production and immense markets for almost every commodity. There exist the basic essentials for the successful application of the Imperial Agricultural Policy—the ability to produce and the capacity to consume.

### Big Attacks On Enemy Aerodromes

### BRITISH PRESS ON FR EAST REVERSES

January 12. THE news of the Allied Air Force in the Pacific war zone, the American and Netherlands forces have been attacking the Japanese bases in the Philippines, and have resulted in the destruction of a number of aerodromes and the capture of a number of aerodromes.

The Washington communication says that the enemy bases destroyed included 10 bomber aerodromes and 10 fighter aerodromes. The damage was done by a number of heavy bombers.

Messages from Baguio say that among the enemy-occupied air bases destroyed were the aerodromes at Baguio, Zamboanga, and Zamboanga.

## Sweden's Defences

### A FIVE-YEAR PLAN

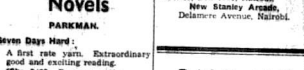

There is no doubt that the vexed question of petrol rationing has perplexed and irritated the people of Kenya to a great extent than any other of the emergency measures dictated by the exigencies of war. It was never easy to explain to the public why it was deemed necessary to ration petrol in Kenya and not in South Africa or Southern Rhodesia. Secondly, it was not easy to convince the Kenya public that the consumption of petrol involved a real danger, irrespective of the source of supply; and that argument appeared less convincing after the passing of the Lease and Lend Bill. Thirdly, the difficulty of avoiding inequity in the assessment of petrol rations, the difficulty of avoiding disparity between the policy and practice of the several rationing offices, and the apparent lavish use of petrol by the armed forces, all tended to lessen that measure of public support and confidence which is so necessary to the smooth working of any scheme of this nature. The entry of Japan into the war so changed the supply position that the need to conserve petrol throughout Africa must now be clear to all. Nevertheless the public remains dissatisfied with the practical application of the petrol rationing scheme. It was recently decided—and no doubt rightly so—that the consumption of petrol by the civil population of Kenya should be radically reduced. This decision was implemented, with scant warning or explanation to the public, by a 50 per cent reduction of petrol rations. The weight of the Petrol Controller's subsequent broadcast talk, which sought to explain the reasons and to enlist the public's full cooperation, was somewhat discounted by the prompt contradiction by the petrol companies of certain statements which he made. Moreover it was speedily alleged that the drastic reduction of the petrol ration was exercising a restrictive influence on production in certain farming districts. And the spate of stories—no doubt mainly apocryphal—alleging inequity in the assessment of petrol rations continued to spread through the public mouth and mind. In all due justice it must be admitted that in general terms those responsible for the administration of petrol control have tackled an extremely difficult and complex task, with courtesy, consideration and efficiency. Where they have failed, it is in the present system of petrol control. To some extent in a system which leads the individual to plead his case before the rationing authority and provides him with no guidance as to the ration to which he is entitled without any call for special consideration. To a greater extent in the failure adequately to inform the public of the policy which governs the issue of petrol coupons. It is understood that the civilian car-owner is granted petrol for his essential agricultural or agricultural activities, but is entitled to no petrol for recreation unless he can describe, satisfactorily to the rationing authority, a need to scribble and save from his "essential" ration. A different principle appears to govern the issue of military cars to officers in their leisure hours. It is understood that all special issues of petrol have been stopped. Does this mean that a business man, who was previously granted a special issue to visit occasionally a farm which he owns, or for the management of which he is responsible, will no longer be granted petrol for the purpose? And what is the policy in respect of buses which ply along routes parallel to the Railway? These are some of the questions perplexing the public mind. It is time that the Petrol Controller should be asked to issue a definitive statement, clearly stating the principles and practice governing the assessment of petrol rations. It is also probable that the military authorities who govern the issue of military cars by officers of the Army and the Air Force for social and recreational purposes, should be asked to issue a statement if such statements were issued there is little doubt that there would be a great change in the public's attitude towards the rationing of petrol.

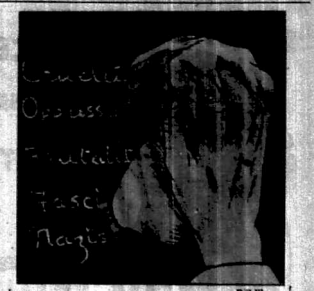

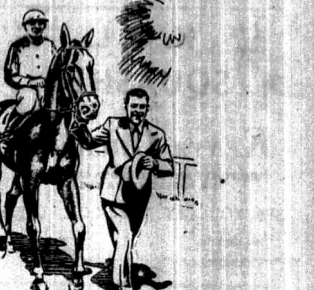

**Dear Food**  
 I hope that in peace food will be as good as now. House hold bills are only kept within reasonable proportions by the avoidance of all luxuries—luxuries which are regarded as everyday fare.  
 It is thought, quite rightly, that the industrial workers should come first in the care of the Ministry of Food. Their workers are to have bigger meals, the price allowance per pound of all essential foods being increased. Household is in demand. There is a price control for such food when sold for human consumption at 1/- a 10 maximum. However, meat is to be used in great quantities, some meat will or guarantee, ready or prepared, in quantities, ready pieces of other food products for human consumption. Liquid milk, being of two pints per head (adults) per week. Children and expectant mothers still receive full allowance. London calls will now serve morning coffee only while the milk supply lasts. The early cutbacks, in other words, will get the drink.

**Bankstering**  
 There is scandalous racketeering in wine and spirits, and the authorities do not seem able to intervene at all. It is not clear to do so. Perhaps, originally the Board of Trade has successfully initiated prosecution for the sale of clothing coupons. Lots of people give away coupons at least some of them. Domestic servants seem to want fewer than the statutory minimum. It still costs a little more every month to live in this country. It will cost a little more for several months. Clothing is more expensive as shoplifting gangs are back again in London from many overseas areas where they avoided during the heavy bombing of last winter. The law has been the "no-wrapping" order, and the gangs have come back with new tactics and dodge about which hoodlums have officers and men in electric uniforms. These unaccountable hoodlums have been the cause of the recent 23 per cent rise in shop-lifting rates. Naturally, there is also more unemployment, especially employes.

# Tactics And Unorthodox Aircraft

(By Major Oliver Stewart, Editor of "Aeronautics")

UNCONVENTIONAL aircraft designs do not often succeed as so often the amazing invention which appears to have no counter in the field of fiction - wins as many wars as usually have. No counter in the field of aviation especially it is usually the underdeveloped aeroplane that proves the best in service. An example is the Armstrong Whitworth Whitley, a bombing aeroplane of perfectly normal conventional design built by conventional methods. At the outbreak of war in September, 1939, the Whitley was looked upon by many people as obsolete if not obsolete. Yet a year later it was one of the mainstays of the British bombing force.

The Whitley was given a fresh lease of life by being slightly modified and re-engineered. In this form it proved completely successful and showed itself capable of operating under different conditions.

**British War First**

But although a conventional aeroplane appropriately developed and modified seems unlikely to play the leading part in wars or operations where unconventional designs or structural methods or novel equipment come into play, the successful results.

In the operations of the Royal Air Force as studied, it will be seen that they owe their success mainly to steady development of aircraft, and aircraft equipment, but also to some extent to strikingly original thinking and to the introduction of unorthodox features.

The power-operated gun turret, which has been long beginning to feature of the big British aircraft, and which is fitted particularly on the heavy bombers but also to the medium bombers, is an example of a bold unconventional piece of design work.

No other country in the world thought it possible to introduce a power-operated turret. But British designers went forward with this component, developed it both for electrical operation and for hydraulic operation, and finally brought it to the stage of full efficiency.

As few many different theories were held about the method of operating such turrets, and one of the early British gun turrets was so arranged that the entire working of the rotatable part was brought about simply by the action of the gunner in aiming his gun. Thus, by swinging the gun to the right, power would be directed in to the turret and the turret would turn to the right.

Our methods employed the test grip similar to that found in screw motor-turrets. All these methods were quickly tested out under stress of war and the power-operated gun turret is now incorporated in vast numbers of British aircraft and has been responsible more than anything else for enabling Britain's biggest machines to beat off fighter attacks.

**War's Most Successful Bomber**

Here then is one example of original unconventional thinking brought to a highly successful conclusion in war. It is matched, so far as the structural side is concerned, by the gull-wing construction of the Vickers-Armstrong Wellington. This form of construction has frequently been described and it is not necessary here to repeat the details. In essence it consisted of a backbone of cross-bracing metal members which themselves give the aircraft not only its strength but also its shape. In other words, the gull-wing construction places the strength of the machine where it is needed most, in the parts of the aerodynamic shapes. In this it contrasts with more conventional construction wherein the strength is carried through girders and struts which are inside the wings or fuselage and which do nothing to impart to them their aerodynamic shape.

The Wellington has a right claim to be the most successful heavy bombing aircraft of the whole war. It has worked in many theatres and under different conditions. It has been employed on most of the very long

# WAR WEAPONS CHALLENGE

## America's Great Role

London, January 14 (Times Service). "American industry has been invited by the vast programme set for it by the President. The leaders of industry are confident that they can do the job, provided there is a continuous flow of materials and no interruption by labor disputes. Much experience has been gained during the period of non-belligerency. The foundation has been laid on the difficulties which imposed structure can now be built. Many of the difficulties which imposed the flow of supplies to Great Britain and other countries who are the victims of aggression, have been overcome already and the current production is to be expanded on a colossal scale.

"There are problems still to be solved. Among them American industrialists regard as the most pressing the problem of an over-riding coordinating authority which is to direct the industrial effort into the required channels and so to allocate and balance and to make sure that the supplies needed for the military and for the war are available as they are needed. Since the successful conference in Washington between representatives of employers and labour there seems little reason to fear any serious interruption of work through industrial disputes.

"American industrialists can be trusted to make the best possible use of overlapping, the provision by the war industries of the tools needed by those who direct the operations on land, sea and air and of the most effective way of organizing the industries themselves. They are accustomed to thinking on big lines and to taking far-reaching decisions with the least delay and carrying them out with great efficiency at speed. They are trained to deliver both in the huge quantities required to overwhelm both the Germans and the Japanese.

"Mr. Churchill and Lord Beaverbrook are expected to bring back with them some agreement for the pooling of supplies, distribution of work and allocation of raw materials between the allies' nations. One such agreement has already been concluded between the United States and Canada. The effectiveness of the pooling of resources will depend very largely upon what materials there are to pool. It will constitute a challenge to the United States, Great Britain, and, indeed, so all the Allies, to make the largest possible contribution to the common stock, a challenge not merely to their manpower, but, even more, to their skill in organization.

- The Kenya Information Office in a memorandum drawn attention to Government Notice No. 38 published in the Official Gazette of January 12. This order which is entitled the Defence (Steel Goods) Order, 1942, follows in general the lines of the Defence (Control of Iron and Steel Articles) Order, 1941, Government Notice No. 74 of August 26, 1941, which is now revoked.
- Apart from retail transactions for the ordinary use of the public, the Schedule to the Order can now be bought into the purchaser's possession of a purchasing certificate. The Controller from whom forms of application can be obtained.
- The Order further requires approved traders that, in so far as any importer, any branch of an importer's business, or any person who has been appointed to obtain stocks of specified articles, to obtain purchasing permits before transferring any portion of the stock to a retail business. Approved traders are also required to submit to the appropriate Controller monthly accounts of the stocks of specified articles which have been received into stock during the preceding month.

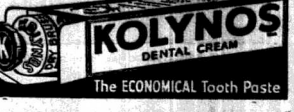

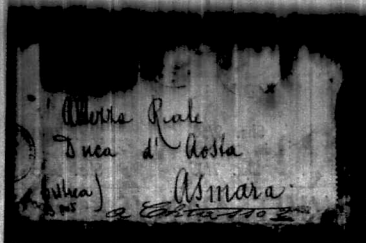

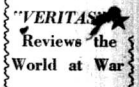

They can be used in place of cornmeal. A recipe calls for 1 tablespoon of cornmeal, use 2 tablespoons of white flour.
