QUESTION OF SELF-DEFENCE

In the Supreme Court, Nairobi, yesterday, a Mombasa native, Mshami (A. K. M.), pleaded against a sentence of 12 months' hard labour imposed on him in the District Magistrate Court, Mombasa. The allegation in the charge was that on October 27 last he was assaulted by two natives with a stick and a knife resulting there being bodily harm.

U.S. Army Will Be Doubled This Year

The size of the United States army is to be doubled this year, Mr. Henry Stimson, Secretary for War, said the ground and air forces would be extended to 2,000,000 officers and men. The completion of combat units and armored units would be done by the end of the year.

Great if United

The military, political and economic pact between Greece and Yugoslavia which was signed by the two monarchs and reported yesterday, was referred to in a broadcast night message from London to the Greek people by Mr. T. S. Rieu, the Greek Prime Minister. He said that their recent suffering must have taught the Balkan countries that collaboration between them brings about their destruction at the hands of larger powers.

GERMAN MORALE? Effect Of Russian Campaign

Writing on the subject of German morale, the diplomatic correspondence of The Times says: "The truth about the German High Command is hard to discover. Officially it remains silent that changes are being made, and that an evacuation may soon be issued. Until then the British Government are heavily discounting possibilities of any serious change of German leaders. The correspondence says it is safer to overestimate the degree of unity around Hitler than to fall back to the habit of overestimating Hitler's hope. The dismissed generals in Germany, who have not been watched by the Gestapo, but anyone who falls out of Hitler's disfavour is almost automatically put under surveillance. Strong points appear to be established throughout Berlin but defensive posts have been established in the cities of other countries as a necessary precaution for national defence.

PETROL RATIONING

Since the order to cut when the civilian consumption of petrol was issued nearly a month ago over 3,000 ration coupons have been cancelled in the Nairobi motor alone.

The East African Standard is informed that every consideration has been given to users, in consequence with the definition "essential needs" referred to in the rationing order on assessment has been made.

The ration for each applicant is governed by such factors as distance from place of residence to a public size of car, necessity to a bus route and so forth. "Where it is possible for people to save on their ration by means of public transport with neighbours there is no objection to the petrol saved being used for recreational purposes.

In no instance, it is stated, has a trial production been prohibited by rationing and where a consumer can prove that in connection with his business a certain minimum of petrol is necessary for it to be run efficiently he is granted the necessary number of permits.

It is emphasized that the new rationing allowance is governed by the supplies of petrol available for civilian use. There can be no guarantee that supplies will continue on the existing basis and the public must be prepared for a revision of the present scale at any time and, possibly, at short notice.

January 16. A Canadian official speaking in London today said that contracts for the building of more than 8,000 aircraft in Canada have been given since the war began. Current production is confined to seven types compared with 15 types in the past.

PREMIER'S RETURN FROM UNITED STATES

London's Rousing "Welcome Back"

MR. CHURCHILL has returned from his visit to the United States accompanied by a large party. He arrived in London yesterday from his tour of the United States. He was met at the airport by a large number of people, including the Prime Minister's wife, Mrs. Churchill, and other members of the Government. The Prime Minister's return was greeted with a rousing "welcome back" from the Londoners. He is expected to remain in London for some time before returning to his duties in the Government.

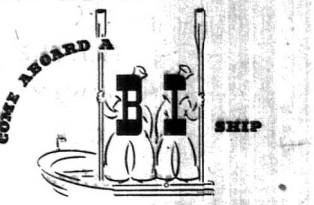

(a) The said preference shares shall confer the right to a fixed cumulative preference dividend at the rate of 4 per cent per annum on the capital for the time being paid up thereon, respectively, and shall rank as a first charge on the assets of the company in priority to the ordinary shares, but shall not confer the right to any further participation in profits or assets.

(b) The said preference shares shall not confer on the holders the right to attend or vote, either in person or by proxy at any general meeting or to have notice of such meeting or to have any say in the management of the business or control of the company, unless the holder thereof shall be entitled for a special dividend at the end of the company's financial year, in which case the holders of the said preference shares shall have the same rights as to receiving notices, attending meetings and voting as the holders of the ordinary shares until the said dividend shall be paid in full.

The said preference shares shall be redeemable in such a manner and at such times as the directors may determine, provided always that such redemption shall be effected on or before August 31, 1950, and it shall be the duty of the directors to act as aforesaid, provided that the cumulative total of all such shares so redeemed shall not exceed 100,000.

"Preference" Priority shall be added to be numbered, a (c) to be added to the Articles of Association. Notwithstanding anything in these provisions contained to the contrary any share or shares in the capital of the company may, with the sanction of the directors by special resolution, be issued as preference shares redeemable out of the proceeds of a fresh issue of shares, and that any preference shares issued by the company shall have priority over the ordinary shares in the capital of the company not only with regard to dividends but also upon a winding up with regard to return of share capital. That the following new regulation, to be numbered a (a) to be added to the Resolutions. The provisions in these Regulations contained or referred to in the Resolutions. 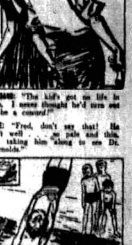

Failed To Submit Income Tax Returns

The Commissioner of Income Tax was the prosecutor in a case in the Resident Magistrate's Court, Nairobi, yesterday when Charles George Klug, advocate, Klug was fined 100/- in respect of the unpaid income tax returns of his client.

Mombasa Native On Murder Charge

In the Resident Magistrate's Court, Mombasa, on Monday, before Mr. Kelly, Joseph Mwangi Nguni was accused of murdering Sewe Osei by the stabbing of the latter at the house where he was living on December 17, 1941.

Assistant Superintendent Griffiths, who was the first witness called, had evidence to show that Nguni was previously a very good character, and was well known to the community before the trial. He said that on December 17, 1941, he was at the house where the alleged crime was committed, and that he saw Nguni enter the house with a knife in his hand. He saw Nguni stab Sewe Osei in the chest, and that Sewe Osei fell to the ground. Nguni then fled from the scene, and was later captured by the police.

Nguni's defence was that he was with Sewe Osei at the time of the murder, but that he did not know who stabbed him. He said that he was with Sewe Osei at the house where he was living on December 17, 1941, and that he saw Sewe Osei being stabbed by another man.

The Resident Magistrate found Nguni guilty of the murder, and sentenced him to 30 days in prison, with a fine of 100/- in default.

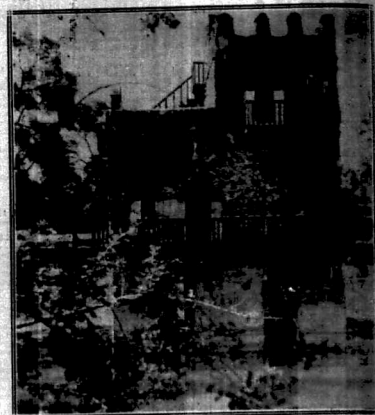

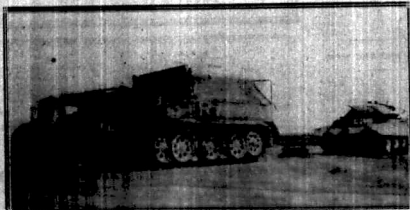
