Union says aid for staff of co-op SOCIETY

General Staff Reserve
for Workers

The Tanzanian Minister of Commerce and Cooperatives, Mr. Ishmael M. Mbaya said that Coasta and Infratex would work closely together until such time as the staff could continue unabated.

He was speaking at the first meeting of the General Staff Reserve for Workers of the Dar es Salaam Consumer Cooperative Society held at the Dar es Salaam Conference Hall on Friday.

Mr. Mbaya said that Coasta would continue as an organization to serve the workers of the consumer co-operative movement.

Throughout their existence, Coasta maintained and has continued to support the members of the nation.

The pooling of expenditure on overheads by the two organizations will definitely lead to some reduction in costs.

In a related report which appeared in one "Kenya Standard" newspaper, it was said that no staff have been, or will be,

Main's image threatened by Rhodesia

Ministers that Rhodesia would destroy the image of the non-White world, was the main charge levelled against Mr. Minister for Economic Development Mr. Mwera.

As Mr. Daniel O'Byrne, in the Chamber of Deputies, put it: "What does the world think about us? What does the rest of Africa think about us? We are told that Rhodesia has been condemned by the Commonwealth and the United Nations. Yet, when they see our products, they buy them." He said that, at the time of independence, there were 150 million people in Africa who had more money than ever before, but no jobs to give them. There was now nothing to do but import from abroad.

"The answer is that we have to develop our own economy and increase our production," he said. "We have to increase our exports and diversify them so that we can earn more foreign exchange. But we cannot do this if we are not given the right conditions." He added: "In the last few years, we have made some progress, but not enough. We must work harder and faster to achieve our aims. We must be more imaginative and creative in our planning. We must be more determined to succeed. We must not be afraid to take risks. We must be willing to learn from our mistakes and correct them. We must be prepared to work hard and long hours. We must be willing to sacrifice our personal interests for the common good of our country. We must be willing to work together with all the other members of the African community to build a better Africa for all our people."



At the time we attained our independence two years ago cooperatives were a minor sector of our economy. Because our economy is mainly agricultural, and because co-operative activity is in the field of produce marketing and distribution, the growth of African produce marketing societies has increased considerably over the last five years.

With the introduction of co-operative marketing schemes and the purchase and sale of surplus produce and groups of people in a much larger area, the market for co-operatives is now being marketed through a new company.

It is estimated that by 1970 the total value of crops marketed through co-operatives will be about £100 million. With the development of the economic contribution of the co-operative movement, the co-operative sector is expected to grow to about 20 per cent of the gross national product in the year 1975.

The spirit of independence brought in its wake an urgent need for a Department of Co-operative Development and with appropriate legislation, the Government is now in the process of converting a wide variety of economic units into co-operatives.

Co-operation in Kenya has mainly been limited to the agricultural sector, and the number of co-operatives in such a community as Nairobi is still small.

However, the National Youth Service has set up a unit of discipline as much required if they are to believe in their ideals.

Kenya's young people are in a country like ours where nearly 90 per cent of the population is under 25 years of age. The youth in the productive effort must be trained to take part in the development of the nation in which they live and enjoy the fruits of freedom.

The President accepted the recommendations of the committee which among other things recommended the formation of the Industrial Organization of Trade Unions (Kenya) COITU.

COITU believes that it will be the only organization representing workers.

Imported development in Kenya is to be continued.







Air Safari proves a great attraction
