The "main object," the Minister said, "is to increase greatly the income earned by the African from the land and thereby, the economy of Kenya, and to give the African a more diversified income."

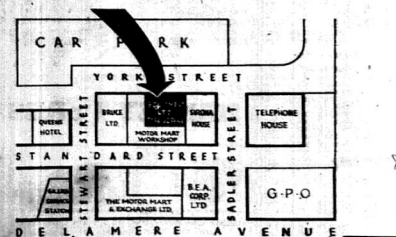

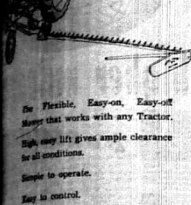

**British firms, win  
£7,000,000  
Russian contract**

BRITAIN has secured a £7,000,000 contract to supply textile machinery to Russia, a Lancashire business man announced in Moscow.

It is believed to be the largest single order placed by the Soviet Union with British firms.

Mr. F. C. Seward, Director at British House of Commons, said "a number of companies in Yorkshire and Lancashire would share work on the Soviet order."

Earlier contact was made with the Soviet Union, but the order was not placed until the Soviet Union had decided to buy British machinery.

Mr. Seward did not disclose the exact figure of the contract, but said it was approximately £7,000,000.

It is a long-term contract for textile machinery worth about £2,500,000, which will be completed in three weeks in January.

It expressed general agreement with proposals to remove export barriers, ease monetary restrictions and hasten the advance towards convertibility of currency.

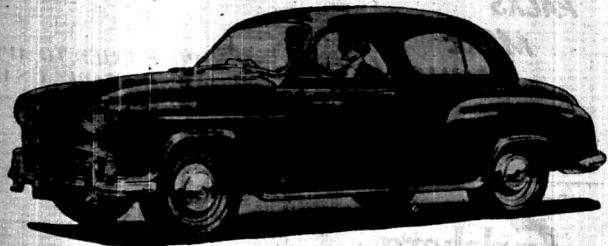

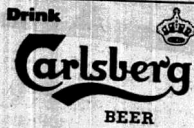

# REASONS FOR TRANSFER OF CORPORATION

## Sentence of death for consorting

**KIKUYU WAS GANG LOAD CARRIER**

# OF CORPORATION

## Farm experiments of most benefit to Tanganyika

**DETAILS** of the new Tanganyika Agricultural Corporation which is to take over as a general concern the Overseas Food Corporation's organization, assets and liabilities in Tanganyika were published in London. The transfer was announced by the Colonial Secretary, Mr. Griffiths, in March.

The White Paper said that the change-over would take effect from October 1, 1954. The Tanganyika Agricultural Corporation, provided for by the Tanganyika (Agriculture) Corporation Act, 1953, was established on that date.

Three reasons are given for the transfer. In 1953 the functions of the Corporation were radically altered from large scale commercial production of food crops to the investigation of the economic possibilities of mechanized agriculture under tropical conditions.

**Early plans needed**

It had become increasingly clear that the chief beneficiaries of the Corporation were the agriculturists to whom the Corporation was to be transferred. These advantages could be fully realized only through a closer association in the Corporation's operations with the work of the Corporation's parent organization.

The present scheme was outlined in an annual report, which was published in London in September, 1953. It was decided to transfer the Corporation to Tanganyika to be made in good time.

The chief reason given was that Tanganyika, with its vast land areas, is vitally interested in expanding its agricultural development and in the new Corporation it will have a ready instrument through which to carry out its own experiments and schemes of development.

**No extra burden**

The transfer will involve no additional liability for the Government or extra cost to the Tanganyika Government. The new Corporation will carry on the experimental work as a separate organization.

The funds to be used are not to exceed the amount committed for the undertaking in 1953 when the Government assumed the original responsibilities.

**Control for the policy**

The new Corporation will be controlled by a Board of Directors and Welfare scheme will be operated by the Tanganyika Government through the Tanganyika Agricultural Corporation.



Repayment waived

The legislation will also provide for the waiving of repayment of advances of £2,611,432 and interest made up to March 31, 1953, by the Overseas Food Corporation to the East African Railways and Harbours Administration for the East African of the Southern Province port and railways.

In turn the Corporation is released of its obligations in respect of further capital aid up to the amount of £1,000,000 in respect of the operating costs of the railway The East African is to accept to the East African authorities.

# ASIA DEFENCE PACT POSSIBLE WITHOUT U.K. ASSISTANCE

**PRESIDENT Eisenhower** has stated that it might be possible to have a workable South-East Asia defence pact without Britain though it would not be as satisfactory or so broad as he would wish.

Mr. Eisenhower was asked about the current conversations going on in Paris between the United States and France regarding the conditions under which the United States might enter into the Indo-China war.

He said that the United States could say about the conversations that there was nothing to them at present.

Asked if the United States would support a pact which would include the United States and Cambodia in an overall settlement, Mr. Eisenhower said that the United States would support such a pact only if it was a collective arrangement for assuring the security of South-East Asia.

That was still the basic policy of the United States, he said.

# TRIBUTE TO KENYA

**IN JUNCTION** with the return of the Kenya Bill to the House of Commons, the Government has received a tribute to the Kenyan people from the British Commonwealth of Nations.

The tribute, which was presented to the House of Commons on May 19, 1954, was a resolution of the Commonwealth Parliament.

The resolution expressed the admiration and respect of the Commonwealth for the Kenyan people and their achievements in the field of agriculture, industry, and education.

The resolution also expressed the confidence of the Commonwealth in the Kenyan people and their ability to build a free and prosperous Kenya.

# BEWARE OF FOOT FAULTS

Mary G. Doherty

**A** DOWN-DRAWN mouth and a wispish expression are always tell-tale signs of an embittered character. They are the indications of painful feet, for the strain of walking back shoes that do not fit on the face and spoils the effect of the most careful arrangement of hair and complexion. And yet, how often are these faults neglected until they become a permanent feature as part of a woman's beauty treatment?

They are washed, the nails and corns are not, apart from such necessary details, no further thought is given to these small structures upon which the whole of our activities depend.

Walking without shoes or stockings, is extremely beneficial to the feet. The muscles have free play, the toes lie in their natural position and the feet become supple. Faults are usually developed by the wearing of ill-fitting shoes or constantly worn stockings which do not give the feet the normal foot rain relief. Wearing a small well-balanced shoe is even wiser.

**Exercises**  
To counteract these pressure and to strengthen the feet, treatment changes of shoes and stockings are advisable during the day. At each change massage the feet with firm circular movements of the thumbs, and finish with by exercising the toes and ankles until the blood flows to the ends.

There is a great plenty of opportunity to attend to the feet during the day. Do some exercises to preserve the elasticity of the muscles. The feet will be more comfortable if the daily routine is observed. Wash the feet in the warm water. Bend and stretch the toes without moving the ankles. Bend and stretch the ankles as far as possible. Finally describe a circle with the toes so that the ankle is taken through the full range of movement.

## Nail varnish

**W**earing a good quality varnish on your feet and dusting them with talc will prevent imperfections can be noticed and destroyed. The varnish is preferably kept flat straight for the feet. The toes and edges smoothed with an emery board, or a manure. Press the skin back gently from the nail, with an orange stick and a little oil. This will help to improve the nail, which often forms there, and to additional smoothing the nail. Nail varnish should only be used on perfectly clean and dry nails.

# LESLEY CLAY writes on **HOMES AND GARDENS OF KENYA**

A LITTLE house on top of a hill, in an apt description for the space-and-time saving residence planned by Mrs. H. O. Kalliner in Brooklands, Upper Parklands, Nairobi.

There is no spacious drawing place but a small cosy and comfortable home built to the owner's design with the decorative work carried out by the designer, Vansco. To build a house just as you like and to furnish it to your own taste is, however, a challenging thing, and this the business here accomplished.

They started building on their three-quarter acre plot in 1950 and finished floor and a half finishing later without the amazingly inevitable snag that most people say of the rooms is large, careful, or thoughtful arrangement of the furnishings was necessary.

### The lounge

In the lounge the red brick fireplace does not dominate the room, but is decorative as well as useful. The room is lighted, on either side

of the fireplace, with parchment-covered lamps held in place by wrought iron brackets. The suite is covered in deep red natural cottons that do not, in spite of the curtains covering the verandah, age of the same natural tone in heavy damask. An interior-lacquered china cabinet of Canadian walnut is its own wall, the collection being borrowed from the Continent and the Middle East, where Mrs. Kalliner spent 14 years (part of it with the A.F.S.)

In the dining room is a large sideboard, also of Canadian walnut. It has a novel feature. The top has glass, which supports a complete set by chairs of the same wood.

### Her own idea

From the dining room you enter the service verandah which is done, like the two very interesting ones here, by Mrs. Kalliner's own idea.

The verandah is kept roofed with heavy frames. The adjoining kitchen is tiled and has many built-in cup-

boards, while all table and sink tops are covered in stainless steel.

Adjacent is the store, and the garage each directly into the kitchen, a third of its roof space forming a spacious lock-up for luggage and many other things not in immediate use.

Many terraced passages lead into the small hall, where one set opens out side the lounge door.

A large window of glass faced with a sill on which stand various ornamental plants, and a small cloakroom complete this part of the house. The cloakroom is screened in with blue tiles and is also a larger counterpane further down the passage. In the sleeping wing, which is divided from the hall by long linen curtains, is a study, its divan bed for occasional guests covered in a heavy, downy, five-way-walrus material. There is a built-in wardrobe and a convenient writing and bedside table.

The bathroom for glass walls is again enclosed in the small window high up in the left-hand wall; the main window looks out on to the main road and the open spaces beyond.

### Space-saving

In the principal bedroom the colour scheme is blue and natural colour again. Cosmetics jars are concealed under a flap which rises to reveal a mirror; there is strip lighting (see page 22).



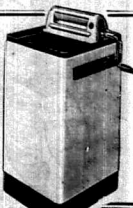

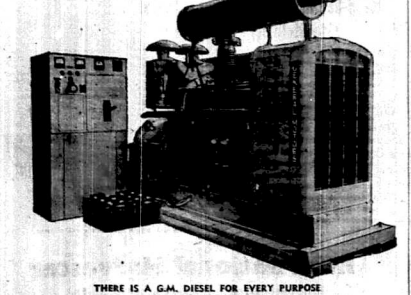

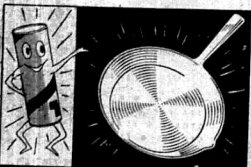

## This Man Studies The Soil Of East Africa

**A PROBLEM** facing scientists and agriculturalists throughout the world—and in East Africa no less than anywhere else—is the growing shortage of food.

Everywhere populations are rapidly increasing—but food production is not increasing at the same rate. Only in Uganda was a conference held at Mukuru College recently when scientists from many countries met to discuss ways and means of tackling the problem, and to pool their ideas.

**Nitrates**

ANY modern farmer knows that before his soil will grow good crops it must be enriched with nitrates, but so too many people realize now that nitrates are not only a human benefit, but a modern housewife knows the importance of nitrates in her diet. It has been proved that a growth diet is not so much more necessary for the young as they are very largely made up of nitrogen.

Nitrogen, therefore, has an extremely important part to play both in the growth of human beings and in the development of plants.

Microbiologists at Mukuru College, Mr. Alan Calder, has been working for three years on the soil of East Africa. 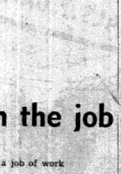

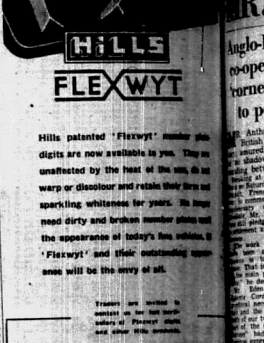

## EDEN SET BRIMS TO SEE SP WINSTON

### Weekend talks on Geneva prospects

#### CONFERENCE 'DIFFICULT'

MR EDEN, who arrived in London by air from Paris on Saturday, continued his talks with Sir Winston Churchill over the weekend. The Foreign Minister said on his return from the Far Eastern conference that the meeting had so far proved 'very difficult indeed.'

He added: 'We will still hard at work on attempts to bring about an agreed settlement which could be a prelude to peace in the Far East. We shall return that effort on Tuesday. Today Mr Eden is to attend a Cabinet meeting at 10 Downing Street before flying back to Switzerland.'

One man problem facing the British leaders was what British military and diplomatic policy would be if the Geneva talks break down. They also gave a searching review to British forces with the United States and France over stemming the spread of Communism in South-East Asia.

### Meeting with Indian delegate

So far Britain has bluntly stated that no move should be made to set up a South-East Asian defence pact—as the British Government has long opposed such a pact.

Sir Winston and Mr Eden believe that the Indo-China problem cannot be solved without Asian support.

Though they have agreed to examine the possibility of setting up such a defence pact, they feel that Asian countries will not back it until victory efforts have been made to get an Indo-China peace with the Geneva conference. It is realised that the policy of waiting until the outcome of Geneva in hopes may soon be a moot point.

In Paris on his way to London, Mr Eden discussed the Indo-China problem and the future of the Geneva conference with M. Laniel, the French Premier, and senior French Ministers. He also had two talks with Mr Krishna Menon, Permanent Indian representative to the United Nations, who flew from Cairo to see the Foreign Secretary.

Mr Menon called on Mr Chou en-Lai, Chinese Communist Prime Minister and Foreign Minister in Peking last night, an Indian spokesman announced.

## PROGRESS MADE OVER KOREA DISPUTE

THE Communist and United Nations sides, in their 11th plenary session on the future of Korea, opened on Saturday to find at least some common ground.

Proposals by Communist China and anti-Communist South Korea injected the first new ideas into the Korean conference since it opened on April 28.

But though South Korea has accepted the United Nations supervision, it has also-Korea would never agree to U.N. supervision, says the United Nations press release.

Mr Chou himself put forward a new proposal—that countries which did not take part in the war should represent the United Nations, with equal representation of both sides despite North Korea's smaller population.



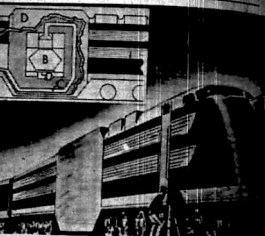
