MR. EDEN'S BLUNT WARNING AT GENEVA Resolve differences or admit failure

BEGINNING-OF-THE-END MOOD IN TALKS

MR. EDEN, the British Foreign Secretary, has called on the nine-nation Indo-China Conference at Geneva to resolve the differences laid bare in two days of open sessions or "admit our failure."

His blunt warning, backed by Mr. Bedell Smith, the US Secretary of State, has been taken in Western circles as the "beginning-of-the-end" mood at Geneva, now nearly five days after the conference opened.

That the conference should discuss the political as well as the economic issues in Indo-China was agreed by Mr. Molotov, the Soviet Foreign Minister, said that seven years' war, when the foreign powers were invited to send their experts to help the French, had shown that even strict neutrality could not be maintained.

Mr. Eden told the conference it had a "grave responsibility" to settle the differences between the non-Communist nations and the Vietnamese regime over armistice supervision and local autonomy.

Britain was still willing to try to resolve the issues, he said, "as far as they are able, then if it is our clear duty to say so to the world and do what we can."

Mr. Molotov backed a proposal by Mr. Richard Nixon, US Vice-President, for setting up a committee of experts to settle the differences.

Britain's position was that the differences between the non-Communist nations and the Vietnamese regime over armistice supervision and local autonomy should be settled by the conference.

He stated: "The policy of the presence in the Indo-Chinese area and the whereabouts of a large number of Frenchmen in the possession of the Vietnamese is a question which must be taken to ensure that the situation in the area will not deteriorate where we have been staying."

FALL TO APPLY It was also agreed that a minimum of 2,000 British troops would be sent to the area, and that the British government would be responsible for the enforcement of the armistice.

Mr. Eden also agreed that the Chinese Communists should be given a chance to take part in the peace conference.

He said: "I am sure that the Chinese Communists will be represented at the conference, and I hope that they will be given a chance to take part in the peace conference."

VETO STILL A MAJOR ISSUE The Chinese demand a Commission on Korean lines, with three Commissars, one of whom would be the Chinese representative.

Mr. Bedell Smith, who presided over the opening session of the conference on Thursday afternoon, said: "We are determined to see that the conference succeeds in its purpose of ending the conflict in Indo-China."

Mr. Bedell Smith, US Secretary of State, Britain, Australia, France and New Zealand, was proceeding at Defence Headquarters in Washington on June 2.



GOVERNMENT 'SLOW TO ACCEPT ADVICE'

"... because," said Mr. Maini, "the Government was not prepared to accept advice from any section of society." He added: "The Government gives low priority to the advice of the Unofficial element with that of the official element of vital importance that his association should continue."

Mr. Maini went on to refer to the Cross-Bench Members of Parliament. "I have been told," he said, "that in order to be effective, the Government and Council must profit from the services of members who are free to speak, and vote as they liked except on minor issues, and that the Government as a body of confidence."

It has been seen that, in practice, the Cross-Bench is beginning to develop into an organized group within the Council," said Mr. Maini.

TREND ON THE CROSS-BENCH

The Government must develop a trend on the Cross-Bench, Mr. Gordon suggested that the Budget should, in future, be submitted to the place for the Cross-Bench Members of Parliament to consider the back of the Government bench.

Mr. Maini then went on to urge that the Government must provide sufficient revenue to meet its expenses. "There would seem to be no difficulty in this," he said, "but the country was in need of more revenue." (Cont'd. on page 2)

DR. MALAN FAILS AGAIN BY NINE VOTES Coloured Poll Bill beaten

The Prime Minister, Dr. Malan, has failed again—by nine votes—in his attempt to get the required two-thirds majority in Parliament to amend the Constitution so as to provide for the separate representation of Coloured voters in Parliament. Including the Speaker, Mr. Conradie, the Government voted 129 votes while the Opposition voted 78 voted for the Bill. Opponents against the Third Reading of the Bill were:

The Government required 126 votes for the two-thirds majority.

Separate roll

The Bill sought to establish a separate roll for Coloured voters of whom there are 1,250,000.

Dr. Malan accepted amendment put forward by the Coloured Party to prevent the Coloured from voting in the same election as the white voters who become eligible after the age of 21 under the new race roll.

Of the seven members of the United Party who voted for the amendment, five came from the anti-coloured section of the Government. (Seeater)

United Party can hold Premier 'in check'

Writing on Dr. Malan's failure to get the required two-thirds majority to establish a separate roll for Coloured voters on a separate roll, the *Kenya Standard* says: "Yesterday the race roll was introduced in the United Party, and it is up to us to see that the bill is not passed."

Six of the seven members of the United Party who voted for the Government, the seventh being absent, voted for the amendment, if he had been present, with Dr. Malan.

Judges for show jumping

Writing on Dr. Malan's need only eight votes to get the Bill through, the *Kenya Standard* adds: "He has not been able to get a majority for him to do what he wants to do."

Yesterday the race court of the Supreme Court stand in the way of the Government's proposal, even though, with patience Dr. Malan could have got his Bill through the right committee. The Coloured people of Kenya will have to wait for another day to have their voices heard at the hands of the clock." (Seeater)

There is now a new making factory situated in the Reserve. There it serves as a distribution centre for the traders in the district who buy the goods in large quantities which will allow them to sell at lower prices.

A trial roadside store has been opened at the junction of the main road and the mobile shop.

Minimum profit

According to Mr. C. H. East, Assistant Registrar of Cooperatives, the new venture, "name" products will be sold at minimum profit. It is a pronounced preference for good quality over quantity. In fact, despite the fact that local produce is available, the co-operative will not buy it.
