CONCESSIONS BY CHINESE Last-minute move at Geneva

WEST STUDYING NEW INDO-CHINA PLAN

LAST-MINUTE concessions by the Communists have raised hopes among Western delegates at the Indo-China conference press talks in Geneva that the five-week-old conference may not, after all, have been in vain.

The non-Communist Powers—who are analysing the proposals—feel that although the Ministerial talks are now bound to be protracted, there is no means certain that agreement will not be reached on the crucial issues.

George Bidault, the outgoing French Foreign Minister, who returned to Paris later, said in the Commons that the British Foreign Secretary, Mr. Bevin, had been surprised by the concessions, and Soviet and Chinese leaders. The concessions were described as "historic" and "surprisingly conciliatory in tone" and "well worthy studying further."

The surprise positive change in the mood came after a "brilliant and important conversation" between Mr. Eden and Zhou En-lai, the Chinese Prime Minister and Foreign Minister.

Mr. Chou was said to have put forward new proposals which suggested the Communists might now agree to withdraw the Vietnamese "invading forces" which the non-Communist nations say are in Laos and Cambodia. CURRENT reports that the recent spate of Meru oath-taking in the Meru Reserve is a preamble to a terrorist offensive, timed to take place in the next few months, have been refuted by the District Commissioner, Mr. William Rayner. Although it subsided in recent weeks, the outbreak, which has been reported to have continued for several months and at its peak involved up to a thousand Africans a day, is estimated that about 200 Meru have taken the oath. Mr. Rayner said he believed that the oath-taking was a result of a "turn in the tide" in the Meru Reserve, which is normally reported to lag behind "Christians" in its general set-up.

In most cases the second oath-takers have been women, but it is known that a number of the oath-takers in the Meru Reserve are men who have taken all seven degrees of initiation.

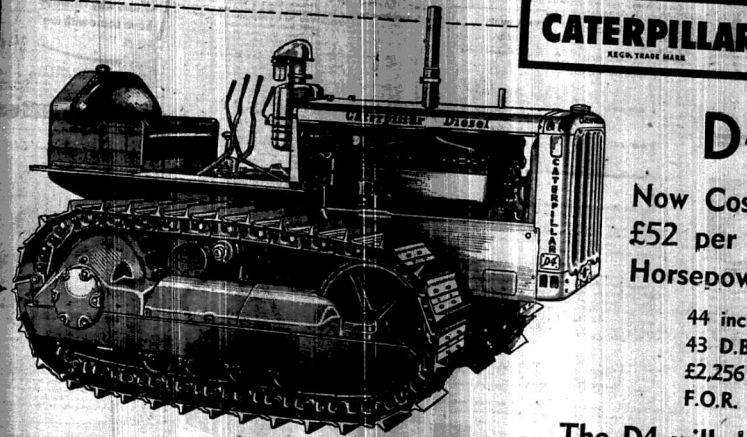

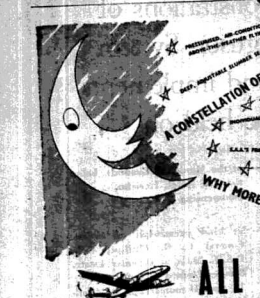

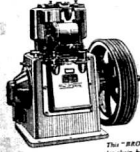

Bill passed to curb sedition

COURTS AUTHORISED TO RESTRAIN EDITORS

UGANDA LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL approved on Saturday a measure to give the criminal procedure (dissemination of seditious matter) which is considered to be a dangerous and disruptive force.

The Acting Administrator, Mr. P. E. H. Pike, said that it was only one of a number of amendments that he intended to introduce into the Criminal Procedure Bill. It was not aimed only at the Press, but at any person who published or disseminated seditious matter.

There was already provision for dealing with cases of sedition, said Mr. Pike, but there were many instances in which, though not seditious, articles, might do much harm. He said that the Bill was intended to deal with such cases.

Unbridled license—This Bill is to try to prevent the dissemination of seditious matter which, either by its nature or by the manner in which it is disseminated, is likely to do much harm. It is intended to deal with such cases as those in which a person writes or publishes an article which is intended to do much harm. The Bill was passed through the Council without a dissenting vote.

Students discuss Lyttelton Plan

THE Lyttelton Plan's failure to meet legitimate African aspirations even halfway, leaving them in intractable opposition, regarding the chances of arriving at a satisfactory factory settlement by 1966, it was stated at a meeting of the National Kenya Marketing Students' Union.

It was felt that at a time when most leaders were prepared to drop an inter-racial government, a unique historical opportunity for laying a firm and sure foundation for the eventual establishment of a truly representative and democratic government in Kenya regrettably had been lost.

Labouring Day

While the Lyttelton Plan might be hailed as an inter-racial settlement, it is in fact the antithesis of all principles of inter-racial co-operation. It is a mere attempt to create a single "representative" in a manner which would perpetuate the principle of European minority rule.

The plan could not be changed before 1966, it allowed scope for the growth of various inter-racial groups, and to the extent that this happens, the realisation of a truly national democratic government in Kenya was hopelessly postponed.

Portfolios criticised

Instead it was difficult to see how the plan could be expected to bring about a better understanding of the people of Kenya and a more effective and more united government. The plan was criticised for its failure to provide for the needs of the African people, and for its failure to provide for the needs of the European people.

Six-year lease

But the present distribution of portfolios was a result of a failure to take into account the virtual non-representation by the African people in the Government. It was considered ill-advised that it gave such key ministries to a Government. Health is given to the East African White and the East African Black and the East African Indian.

This should not be taken to mean that the Lyttelton Plan is a failure. It is a failure only in so far as it does not provide for the needs of the African people, and for the needs of the European people.

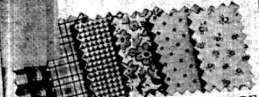
