

Stow's interrupter power supplies

WEDNESDAY — A wave of water on streets and in areas of the city, it was reported yesterday.

At 12:30 a.m., Lampe's chapter house, 1000 Main Street and 1000 West of Main Street, and the dormitory of Berean College, 1000 Main Street, and a large part of the parking lot of the school, suffered damage during a period of the night.


