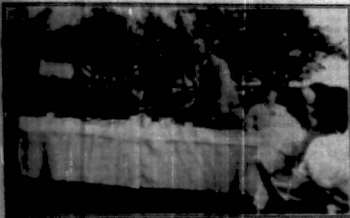

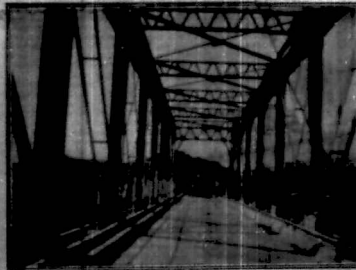

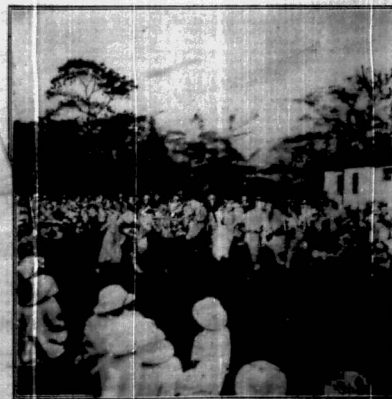

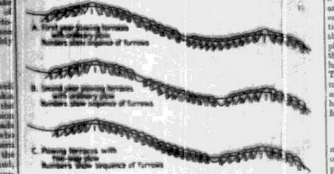


FIG. 118.—Method of ploughing with ordinary plow and subsoiler.

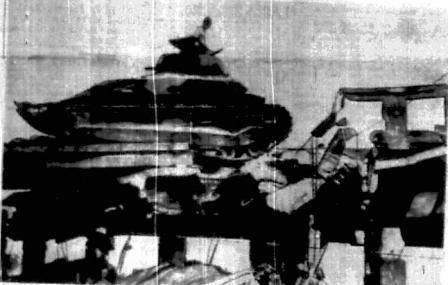

THE WEATHER

The British East African Meteorological Service reported yesterday as follows:

At Nairobi and evening showers were general in Uganda, round the Lake and in Tanganyika yesterday but the night rain of the 11th was lighter than anticipated. The total rainfall in Uganda, from March 1st to 11th, was 1.26 inches, in Tanganyika from the Lake shore to the coast, 0.46 inches, and at Mombasa 0.01 inch.

The South-Eastern winds still prevailed on the Coast up to midnight with North-Easterly above 1,000 feet but the north easterly breeze weakened. Instead of a steady on-shore wind, a light breeze from the East and evening showers will again occur in Uganda, the Lake area and Central Tanganyika. East of the Rift and at the Coast night and morning showers will occur but rain will probably be light and there will be few weather during the day.

The Secretary of State in not overlooking the new... had confirmed to one of the biggest premises for which they in the early days of the House had always fought.

Keeping Agreements

"It is my job," went on Lord Francis, "to see that agreements entered into between us and the Secretary of State are kept in full the spirit and the letter, and nothing could be more essential or demanded to any future agreement of the same sort if we are to get out of what has been called a 'black hole' by trying to twist something to suit the convenience of the Government."

"High-Sounding Title"

He also criticized the tendency to re-introduce high-sounding titles for Number 1 of the Budget with a resulting increase in the price list as a subsequent date.

Revenue Reductions

In dealing with the Budget generally, Lord Francis pointed out that, when comparing the estimates of revenue and expenditure for 1934 with the actuals for 1933, which was the last financial year they had, they were £1,000,000 less than in 1933, which was actually over in 1933.

At first sight this might seem that Government was being ungenerous but in actual fact there was a very large reduction this year in direct taxation.

Uganda Governor's Outlook

Mr. Pandyia had not heard the mover made any mention of reduction of taxation when revenue was over the estimate, and he quoted extracts from Sir Philip Mitchell's Memorandum. The Government of Uganda had stated: "All my services in East Africa confirm me that the more money you leave in the taxpayer's pocket the better... and that an increase in revenue was something to be used in relieving taxes."

Working Balance

He asked for an explanation as to why it was now considered necessary to put aside £200,000 for working balance at the end of the year. £100,000 was considered necessary. No doubt there was a good explanation but he wanted to hear it.

Indian Viewpoint

Mr. J. B. Pandyia, India Elected Member, commenced his speech by saying it was fortunate that Council had no major taxation issue to discuss, adding that Council of Government was absolutely essential. The revenue sections of the estimates, he said, were on the conservative side.

India and Settlement

When the settlement question came to the floor, he asked the speaker, apparently in an official and somewhat stilted manner, how much this would be derived from if it would be much greater than estimated, but before figures were available would be further reduction of our taxation during the coming year.

Government's policy should be based on a reduction of taxation, and the first thing to create attention in this regard was the Customs Duty. "We are," he said, "not to be grudging at the building up of a reserve, which should be Government's policy in prosperous times; next year they were likely to make a surplus of half a million."

Education Needs

The speaker then proceeded to deal with needs of opportunity in the estimate. He urged for education, he stated, that the increased needs for Indian education could not be met under the present grant-in-aid. To Indian community was saving Government a tremendous amount of money by providing private schools but Mr. Pandyia felt that a more progressive Government should take over some of them, of these schools every year.

"Designating Mania"

Mr. Pandyia agreed with the Member for East Valley in regard to the high sounding titles in the estimates. He referred to this as "designating mania" which had been present under several of the years of depression but which now appeared to be getting the most danger. In the estimates there were seven new and important designations, which in many cases might lead to increased expenditure, and he wished to bring to the notice of Council that it was not a wise policy to bring out these new designations every year.

Referring to the question of the White Highlands and the recent announcement by the Secretary of State for the Colonies that the Order in Council in regard to the White Highlands would be presented very soon, Mr. Pandyia said the Indian community had always been opposed to the principle of "white highlands" and when the question was referred to the Governor the Indian community should be allowed to submit their own view before his final decision was conveyed to the Secretary of State.

FLY ON TELL PETROL IS EXHAUSTED
Young Pilot's Three-Hour Ordeal

"STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.
London, Nov. 1.
People living near Tanganyika aerodromes, three miles from Chichester, heard yesterday by wind in a drum of the air, and saw a wonderful exhibition of skill and nerve by a young Royal Air Force pilot.

Those who possessed a wireless set might in imagination sit in the cockpit of an A.P.F. fighter, while the pilot, flying round and round, and facing the possibility of a death crash, played radio odds down below.

While piloting a Hawker-Pey single-engine fighter Pilot-Observer Charles Tucker, aged 19, of No. 1 Squadron, had a mishap in which his undercarriage was damaged. The undercarriage being sideways and to attempt an ordinary landing would have meant a crash—and possibly death.

"Do Not Leave"
The accident was seen from the ground, and from that time for three hours, until two gas tanks, the pilot and sleeping arched by radio telephony and replied to them.

Many listeners at home to the wireless heard the aerodrome full of noise. "What is the meaning of those urgent orders transmitted to the pilot?"
These orders were given by the officer commanding the flight in which Tucker belonged.

"Woodcock calling. Your undercarriage is damaged. Do not attempt to land until your petrol is exhausted."
When the pilot replied, his steady voice was occasionally audible.

Keeping an average height of 1,200 feet, he circled round and round the landing field.

Ambulance Ready
Then, when they knew the petrol was nearly gone, "Woodcock" said:
"We are waiting for you, overwriting is ready. Come in."
Spectators in the lane dusted as the plane swept over their heads.

As it touched, ambulence dashed across the landing ground. Before they reached his Tucker had climbed from his machine.

Tucker, unhurt, was seen a few superficial bruises, and suffering only from shock and nervous strain, was, as a precautionary measure, taken to the aerodrome hospital.

Viceroy Graziani Orders Economies

Economic measures enacted by Signor Mussolini for the Italian Empire in East Africa are to be applied "with iron Fascist discipline."

Marshal Graziani, Viceroy of Abyssinia, made a striking address, after a review at Asmara, laying down to the colonial population the pressing need for economy in the use of vital supplies—such as petrol—and drawing attention to the intended functions of the transport routes of Eritrea, Somaliland and Abyssinia.

Indictment as Squanderers

(2) To limit the losses of maintaining it as an asset to burden not necessarily the currency balance sheet of the nation."

Continued With Pleasors
The Marshal addressed finally the Eritrean economy was today based and organized on a self-sufficient system. When they surmised they designated easily and successfully.
