Sustaining Nourishing. Kenya's Agricultural Output for the Season. CEREAL CROPS GOOD IN SPITE OF DROUGHT. Coffee Suffers Severely. NATIVE MAIZE POSITION GENERALLY UNSATISFACTORY.

The crop report for the month of February, issued by the Kenya Department of Agriculture, is the last to be published for the 1953/54 season and gives the final figures for the year.

The bulk of the cereal crops has been harvested, and the report states that despite the abnormal dryness of the season, cereals on the whole have done well. It is expected that there will be 400,000 bags of maize available for export, which there will be a small surplus of wheat beyond local requirements.

The maize position in the native reserves is said to be generally unsatisfactory, while the estimate of production in the European areas also suffered a reduction. But for these factors the amount to be exported would have exceeded the actual figure.

The effect of the drought upon coffee has been very serious and in all main areas the crop has suffered severely. The actual yield has been higher than recently feared, but it is substantially lower than indicated early in the season. The adverse weather conditions had the worst effect, however, on quality, with consequent low average prices.

Increased Wheat Yield. The following report on the European crops in the European areas for the month of February and for the 1953/54 season, as a whole has been issued by the Kenya Department of Agriculture.

This report is the last to be published in respect of the 1953/54 season, and gives the final figures for the year. Although the bulk of the wheat crop has been harvested, the estimates of production which follow are a large extra local surplus crop over previous years.

The final estimate of production of wheat is 106,915 bags, a decrease of 22,225 bags compared with last month's figure, and an average yield corresponds to an increase of 1.4 bags to the acre.

Wheat. The final estimate of wheat yield shows little change from last month's figure, and is given at 175,000 bags.

Reaping of wheat is practically completed in the main areas. No significant change has occurred from last month in the estimate of yield presented.

Production of wheat crops in all the main areas, and there is still a certain quantity of the harvest which can be expected to come off the trees.

The Drought. The season has been one of continued drought. The planting was normally expected in April and May having completely failed and such rains as fell during the season being badly distributed.

Despite the abnormal dryness of the season, however, cereals have on the whole done well. It is expected that there will be a small surplus of maize available for export, which there will be a small surplus of wheat beyond local requirements.

It is upon the coffee crop that the most serious damage has been done. The yield has been lower than was recently expected, and it is substantially below the 1953/54 crop.

BRITISH TRADE WITH RUSSIA WITH RUSSIA. Large Order For Steel Tubes. To be Shipped in Six Months.

FURTHER DELIVERIES PROBABLE. [TRUSSARDI'S AGENCY.] London, March 19. Following the recent realization of the Anglo-Russian trade agreement, an arrangement has been concluded according to 'Modern Transport' between Anglo-Limit on behalf of the Soviet, and a group comprising practically all the British tube manufacturers for shipment to Russia within six months of 20,000 tons of steel tubes valued at about £1,000,000.

The bulk of the order, which is valued at about £1,000,000, will be getting better results than foreign lines. The millage since 1952 had increased by 100 per cent, passengers by 50 per cent, and air mail by 70 per cent.

U.S.A. Government to Assist Industry. ESTABLISHMENT OF SPECIAL CREDIT BANKS. To Provide Long Term Capital. FURTHER FEATURE OF RECOVERY CAMPAIGN.

A Bill has been submitted by President Roosevelt to both Houses of the U.S. Parliament, providing for the establishment of intermediate credit banks for the purpose of making loans direct to industry and commerce.

The banks, which will be financed by Government, will assist established industrial or commercial businesses by advancing long-term capital, or in certain cases by direct financial loans.

Effect on Unemployment. The 12 Federal reserve districts of the United States, controlled by the Federal Reserve Board, have agreed to establish intermediate credit banks in each of the 12 Federal reserve districts.

These banks will be empowered to deposit for or purchase from any bank or other financial institution in their respective districts, obligations, with maturity not exceeding five years, entered into for the purpose of obtaining working capital for any established industrial or commercial business. They will also be authorized to make direct loans where an established industrial or commercial business is unable to obtain financial assistance on reasonable terms from usual sources. Where loans are made through a bank or other financial institution, the credit bank will be responsible for 20 per cent of any loss.

President Roosevelt in his message estimated that 700 million dollars worth of working capital would be required for smaller industries employing 246,000 men and supporting 426,000 more.

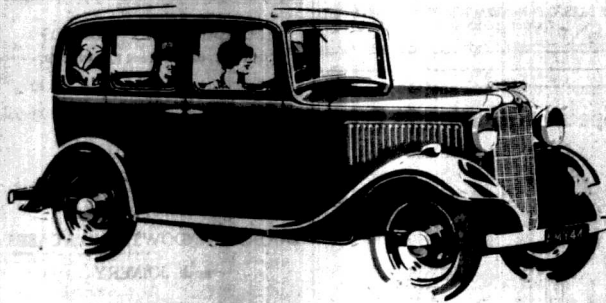

KENYA'S AGRICULTURAL OUTPUT FOR THE SEASON.
(Continued from page 1.)

In this season's series of crop reports, the discrepancy is likely to be very small and Mr. Cotton: It is expected that the production figure will be in the neighbourhood of 440,000 tons.

Summary of Crop Reports.
The following notes are given on a basis of reports relating to the month of February. It should be noted that in certain areas weather conditions are changing appreciably since then.

Uthmaniyah. Harvesting is now practically completed, despite the effects of the drought, cereal crops are well matured and ready for sale. Very little rain has fallen since December, and unless the expected winter shower falls, the coffee trees will begin to show signs of wilting.

Kimberley. Hot, dry weather is being experienced, the outpouring of which is expected to have an effect upon the coffee trees. Rain fell on December 16 and 17, but the coffee trees has improved since that time. The weather is still in some parts of the district during February. A great deal more, however, is required.

Kisumu-Londiani. Rain is badly needed for coffee trees.

Nakuru. Hot, dry weather conditions still prevail. Harvesting of cereals is practically completed.

Transvaal. Harvesting of cereals is practically completed. Despite the dryness it has been a good season for maize, and yields are satisfactory. Rain is needed for the coffee trees.

East Galt. Harvesting of cereals is completed. The season has been a reasonable one for wheat, which on the whole has done better than the maize crop, owing to the fact that the rains have been late in many areas to repair the damage done to the latter crop.

TEST CRICKETER'S ILLNESS

[STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.] London, March 7.

The Australian players arrive in England on April 26th, and the first Test will begin at Nottingham on June 8.

Meanwhile our cricket news is not too good. Jardine is staying for some time in India. It is officially announced that the M.C.C. have accepted Jardine's resignation of the Surrey Captaincy as he will be able to play regularly and have offered the Captaincy to Holmes. No one knows whether Jardine's foot will be well enough to enable him to play.

Mr. G. O. Allen, the England and Middlesex all-round cricketer, underwent an operation in a London nursing home last Saturday. The operation an internal one was successful, and Mr. Allen is going on very well. It will, however, interfere with his cricket for some months. In view of the fact that the Australian cricketers are to visit King's Hall this year, this will be greatly regretted, as Mr. Allen was very successful as a fast bowler during the last Test matches in Australia.

28 For One Hit.

When a first-class batsman makes a hit for six, people interested in cricket are told about it. But when a player makes a hit for more than four times as many, the feat seems to light only by accident. Laying for Fish Hook against Alexandria in the first Test at South Africa, P. Sweet hit a ball into the outfield. It disappeared and the whole of the fielding side, assisted by the umpires, joined in the search. The batsman ran. Having covered approximately a quarter of a mile at top speed, and registered 22 runs, they slowed down to a walk. With 28 runs completed, the ball was found inside the

field of play, seemingly concealed in a tuft of grass. Had it been credited to Sweet? They had. Rule 4 is clear on the point. It says: "If a ball in play cannot be found or recovered, any fieldsmen who call 'lost ball' when the ball shall be 'found' six runs shall be added to the score. But if more than six runs have been run before 'lost ball' has been called, six runs shall be allowed. 'Lost ball' shall be scored 'No ball' and shall be credited with 28 for one hit."

Leicester's Captain.

A. G. Hargreave, former Kent and Lancashire cricketer, captain, is to lead the Leicestershire team next season in succession to E. W. Hooper, who is only resigned through illness. The new captain proved for Cambridge against Oxford in 1930 and 1932 and was captain of the University in the last year. During that summer he made 1,010 runs in first-class matches, and assisted another Leicestershire on several occasions last year by making 1,000 important runs. He is a son of Sir Arthur Hargreave, Lord Leicestershire.

Australia's Feeling.

Bitterness marked some of the speeches at the farewell given to W. M. Woodfull, Australia's Test team captain, when he left Melbourne, where he was the manager of the last touring team who is also a member of the Australian Cricket Board of Control, and that if the cricket played in the forthcoming tour was that taught by Englishmen in the early days, Australia would regret the loss. "That," he continued, "of the cricket played, or rather the alleged cricket played, is under the captaincy of a man named Jardine—I will be frank—and I will just wish Woodfull every success." Mr. J. A. Setts, the former Rhodes Scholar, Oxford and Blue, Captain Victoria, and Vice Assistant Director of Education in Melbourne, said that the players should "preserve the spirit of cricket and not play to win, wrangle or kill their opponents, as had been the case when the English team were in Australia last year." Unfavorable comments that

have been made in some quarters on the English team players are unfair and warmly resented in Australia. Perry set a great example and is most popular, and the whole team endeavored themselves to the Australian spectators. Undoubtedly, the team have created many friendships and their Australian opponents are looking forward to future contacts with such sportsmen.

A Cricket Slogan.

"Straight up the centre, no short passes, bats and all!" No one is wrong. This has nothing to do with football. It happens to be a cricket slogan, coined by W. M. Woodfull, the Australian captain, which has again been adopted by the team to visit England this summer. Woodfull gave this slogan to the last side he captained in England and remember how it helped them up in that 1930 Test series. Now Woodfull has again urged his men to remember the words of power according to an Exchange cable from Melbourne. Alibi Parfitt, the old Australian Test player who lives in London nowadays, translated the phrase: "Don't pitch away with the idea that it is an Australian saying. It belongs to Bill Woodfull," he said. "I've heard Bill say dozens of times before a match, but I've never heard anyone use it. What does it mean? Well, this is how I take it: "Straight up the centre—'Keep them straight,' that is for the bowlers below." "No short passes—'Don't pitch them short,' also for the bowlers. "Bats and all—'On your toes,' and that means the whole team."

USE OF FALSE TRADE MARKS AND ORIGIN INDICATIONS.

East African Imports.

COLONIAL OFFICE TO TAKE ACTION IN THE MATTER.

The copying of British trade marks and use of false descriptions of country of origin are stated to be methods used by foreign firms in their efforts to sell their goods on the world's markets, particularly in regard to imports into East Africa.

This complaint has been the subject of considerable discussion by the East African Section of the London Chamber of Commerce, where it has been alleged that Japanese exporters habitually use these tactics in order to obtain an unfair advantage for their goods.

The matter has been referred to the Colonial Office. As a result Colonial Governments are being advised to legislate in East Africa, so as to prevent such a practice.

Local Legislation.

THE HONORABLE MEMBER'S ADDRESS. London, March 21. Ordinary Mombasa/Dar or Salabum hides have been sold at down to 9 1/2 for 40/40/30 per cent selection of natives and 5 1/2 for 8/12 lbs. range. Light weights are in fair request at late rates, while thirds and fourths, although enquired after have not been dealt in owing to the absence of supplies. Mombasa/Dar or Salabum butcher hides have been bid for at 9 1/2 to 9 1/4 according to selection, but sellers are holding for 1d. more.

Skins. There is nothing fresh to report and the general weakness in the goods market continues.

Cloves. The market is steady. Zanzibar quoted: Spec 3 1/4; March/Apr shipment e.i.f. 5 1/4. London stock 3,949 bales as against 5,460 bales last week.

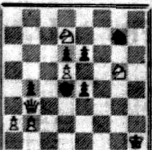

The two-mover, locally composed, is a very pleasing little puzzle quite other "own" own heart, being neat and tidy and not overburdened with pieces. The three-mover, though easy, will give careful practice for the Solving Competition which will begin on Saturday, 14th April, with Problem No. 134. We are glad to hear from several old and new solving friends that they are going to enter this tourney.

Dr. Tartakower tells a story of a new acquaintance who had taken up the game, but was not getting on very well at it. One day his friend came up to him in a chess cafe with a newspaper cutting in his hand and request-

ed the doctor to look at a problem which had been worrying him. Tartakower glanced at it and saw that it was a complicated end game with a board full of pieces. He looked to be convinced, saying that life was too short for such treacherous subtleties, but that he would not have minded if it had been a two-mover. "Well then," said his friend, "do it in two moves!"

The present World Champion is evidently much more of a problem solver than Dr. Tartakower, for during his tour through which Dr. Alekhin spent with me in 1922 I showed him lots of difficult two-movers on my pocket board at meetings, and I am still amazed at the facility of his solving power. Generally he seemed able to read off the solution of a chess and consistent on the variations, pointing out the most ingenious ones, and never moved a man! He outplayed a three-mover for me which had long reputation some day in this column.

Nairobi Chess society welcome Mr. A. L. Buxford back from long leave. His merry style enlivens the club meetings and makes the "stone walls" seem slower than ever. The Buxford-Cockle match is still so near a decision after three weeks; the second game, played last week, also being drawn. 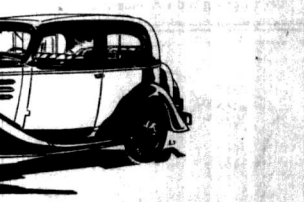

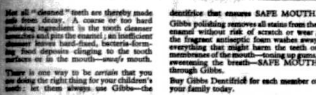

LAWN TENNIS LEGISLATION.

The Footbalk Under Review.

DEFINITION OF THE AMATEUR.

The actual league of nations in the sport, the International Lawn Tennis Federation, met on March 15. Forty-one national bodies subscribe to it, while four applications for affiliation were dealt with from Kenya, Colombia, Rotorua and Peru. Kenya, it will be remembered, was duly elected.

The annual deliberations of the Federation are usually one of a sporting interest, justice a writer in "The Field" comparable to the magnitude of its minutiae of the game, but this year the South African Union faced the meeting with the problem of the footbalk, that incoherent twofold.

The Union's proposal is strenuous, namely to rescind the existing rule and to substitute the following: "The server shall throughout delivery of the service keep both feet behind (i.e., farther from the net than) the baseline." This simple solution of a world problem appeals to the ordinary player and spectator, in whom the scientific and sometimes apparently partial positions for broad sport in tennis have traced mixed feelings. But legislation is a complex affair, and the assembled body may mistake vain things like a high jumper with both feet on the ground, behind the baseline, serving legitimately at the moment. The Federation will have also before it the report of the 1933 committee appointed to review the rules relating to the amateur definition. Effort is to be given to any resolutions arising therefrom, and these will probably tend rather towards restriction than loosening. ENGLAND'S FAST BOWLER.

Allen May Not Play This Season.

Lady Allen, mother of G. O. Allen, England and Middlesex fast bowler, states that it is unlikely that her son will be able to play cricket this season.

This means that he will not be available to play for England against Australia in the Test matches. It was announced that Allen had undergone an operation, but it was hoped he would be fit in time for the cricket season. "My son is getting on well" and Lady Allen "but I do not think he will be able to play." Allen was also a strong candidate for the captaincy of England, in the event of H. E. Hoad being unable to play.

SAM STAPLES A VICTIM OF RHEUMATISM.

Many followers of cricket will be sorry to hear that Sam Staples the well-known New Zealand bowler has again fallen a victim to rheumatism. He is to undergo special treatment in the hope of being fit for the country's first match.

It will be remembered that when Staples was a member of the M.C.C. team which went to Australia six years ago he had to retire home without playing in a single match owing to the same trouble.

It is most bitterly regretted that he should have had to recognize the demand for an open championship until public opinion throughout the world unreservedly declares for it. Meanwhile the thin line between the amateur and professional must be strengthened so far as divergent local conditions permit. But in no event was the Federation to be entrusted if it does not act as to relieve the man in the street of the impression that commercial considerations colour its actions in connection with the amateur rules. The policy adopted in the past, of shifting the responsibility on to the shoulders of the crumpled alleged to be converted, is false. If there is a responsibility, it is international.

WALSLEY SENSATIONAL RUGBY WIN.

A Thrilling Finish.

IRISH LINE CROSSED THREE TIMES.

WALSLEY'S "SQUADROONS" (By Air Mail).

London, March 21. Further drastic measures to control investment of company profits. Further drastic steps have been taken by the German Government on behalf of the country's industries.

The Cabinet have passed further laws, one of which limits imports of raw materials to such an extent as almost to amount to a world blockade of foreign raw materials.

It is proposed also that Germany and other countries too should arrange to lay up a certain percentage of shipping tonnage, and a conference on the matter is suggested.

Finally the Cabinet has decreed that in the case of company dividends which exceed those paid last year, the difference must be invested in state or communal loans.

Tonnage to be Laid Up.

It is proposed as a definite step to limit imports of raw materials to an absolute minimum and to assist the Reichsmark to overcome its foreign exchange shortage.

Further Measures Taken. Berlin, March 25. The first measure in the direction of limiting raw material imports was taken today by the Cabinet.

It is explained that the device of prohibiting the purchase of textiles from Germany is a measure to ensure that the human industries mainly dependent on raw foreign materials are not handicapped.

It is stated that the device can be regarded as only a temporary measure.

STRONG CRITICISMS OF GERMANY'S CLAIM.
Guarantee Demanded.

POWERS HAVE THE RIGHT TO KNOW THE CONSEQUENCES OF CONCESSIONS.

French reply to the British note on disarmament has been published. It puts forward a number of serious objections to Britain's attitude on the question, although France agrees that the reconciliation of the French and German standpoints is an essential to agreement.

The memorandum states that France neither understands nor admits that Germany's extravagant claims to rearmament should be regarded as an argument for demanding reductions injurious to France's security.

France further points out that Powers who accept a limitation of armaments have a right to know the consequences of their concessions, and any infringement of an agreement should be considered as a threat to the community.

Such infringements should be rectified without delay by all means, and France suggests that pressure should be recognized as indispensable in such common action, and should certainly be applied.

There is general disappointment at the fact that the French reply has not made a great advance towards solution of the problem. It is felt that the door has not been closed on further negotiations. The British reply will make further efforts to reconcile the French and German points of view.

Agricultural Finance.

KEEPING PEOPLE ON THE LAND.

To the Editor, "E. A. Standard," Sir—I am writing to you in order to reply to the query raised in a letter dealing with "Agricultural Finance from the Morning Star" which appeared in this morning's paper. The letter to which I refer was written under the nom de plume "Justice" who made a microscopic inspection from a very high vantage point of the most difficult and most pressing problems with which we have to deal. "Justice" will no doubt have commented that the general financial position which we face forward to Sir Philip Gubbins, to the Members, and which was published in your issue of 19th March 1964. The Memorandum put forward an unworkable case showing that the Government and the Department are dependent on agriculture loans in order to be able to pay the interest on the loans. Later rural poor-pool beyond the contents of the Memorandum, but reference to the Right Hon. Mr. B. McKenna, who after all is in a subordinate position, was made to substantiate the contents of the Memorandum in his speech at the recent Annual General Meeting of the Millbank Bank.

Both the Memorandum and the speech under that circumstances of the last few years has combined to put both the borrower and the lender in a thoroughly false and unfair position. The point I try to make in my speeches, and made in my Memorandum, is that the problem raised by the fact that the money lent by the Land Bank alone. To explain what I mean I cannot do better than quote from the Memorandum which I sent to all Members early in February 1964. "Land Bank. The Land Bank has been started upon state aid and continues to be in my opinion to fall to take risks with this institution. The experience which has now been acquired in operating the Bank upon a sound basis fully justifies an immediate withdrawal of state aid in the future to be placed at the disposal of the Land Bank Board. I consider the immediate provision of further funds for the Land Bank to be a matter of paramount importance and I intend to press this point with all the force possible."

Agricultural Finance. Many industrial farmers, owing to circumstances entirely beyond their control, are at present on the verge of bankruptcy. In my opinion something must be done to assist these people in restoring the situation. In many cases assistance to these can scarcely be regarded as a day's pay level, as a percentage of the value of the assets of the Land Bank transaction as prescribed by law, in that, as I have pointed out above, a Land Bank must be recognized as an institution designed to serve a particular purpose always based on a guarantee security at time of loan. At the same time the situation in which these people find themselves cannot be attributed to any fault of their own. Being at the Ottawa Conference and at the International Conference held in London last year, the Imperial Government has admitted that the present policy of subsidizing agriculture has had a hard and long term effect on the economy and has further contributed to the inflationary pressure of primary products. This policy has not as yet been effective and pending the raising of prices level, that the farming community in this country and in other countries, such as the United Kingdom and the United States, are being forced to pay for an unworkable case for special treatment. This, in my opinion, should be forcibly put to the Government of this country during his visit to this Colony and to the Colonial Office and the Treasury at London.

I still strongly adhere to the opinion that a sound Land Bank is essential to the economic development of this Colony. The Land Bank would not, however, remain solvent long unless adequate security is provided at the time when the loan is made. Your correspondent evidently considers that it is a Land Bank which is the cause of the economic and capital stagnation of this country. The case he quotes is that a borrower is a borrower and what he borrows and what he repays are not the same thing. The interest on the loan is very much higher than they are repaying. During recent hard times the borrower has been unable to meet his interest commitments and which he now owes \$400. The Land Bank Board have apparently recently considered the case and consider that the security offered would only justify a loan of £1,000.

I am afraid I do not think the Land Bank would be right in these circumstances to lend £1,000. After all, if the Land Bank fails it is the taxpayer who has to make good the hole which is left behind it. If the Land Bank Board consider that the security offered would justify a loan of £1,000, it is for that very reason that I cannot agree to the loan. Any sums of money provided by such institutions may be largely squandered by giving the credit elements the option of accepting loans bearing a certain rate of interest in lieu of a loan. However, this question will no doubt be carefully considered.

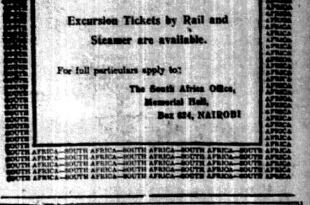

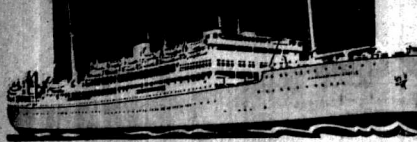

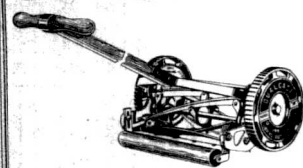
