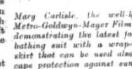

Social and Women making headway

THE COMMERCIAL AND BOOMING WORLD.

Statistics, though so dull to look at, can tell us some interesting facts. One of the most remarkable revelations of the statistics issued by the Board of Education in England recently is the fact that more and more women are applying themselves to the study of trade and industry. They have long been asserting their right to enter every profession, occupation, but the figures published in a small pamphlet make it clear that they are also doing so in industry, and in whatever way they undertake, there are now no fewer than 476,862 girls and young women attending technical schools and commerce in the evening institutions and at schools which are aided by grants from the Board of Education.

Now, you may say very few women are taking diplomas in these subjects. Now these are not as many as you would think. In fact, during the last five years the proportion of women in this specialised education has risen from 28 per cent to 38 per cent. The numbers of girls who have only part time education in the case of full time students has risen from 10 per cent to 14 per cent. The numbers of girls who are increasing at a faster rate than the men. It may well happen that within the next few years there will be more women than men studying for industrial courses.

In the training of school teachers the women students far outnumber the men. In fact, though the number of men has increased slightly during the last few years. At the Universities

however, the men still make the conspicuous show. Here, as in every other, the few men to every woman, and the male students are increasing while the female are dropping off. It is clear, therefore, that in industry and commerce women are determined to take up the challenge.

Men's Club for Women.

Dr. Grace Palihorpe, who was responsible for that report, is at present in Kenya and hopes to be able to continue her researches in this Country which, as she points out, offers exceptional scope for such investigations.

whether the work would be proceeded with at all during the present year—but in view of the voluntary offers reported to have been made by some of the owners to contribute towards the cost of making the footpaths, the Council had decided to proceed with the work, immediately, in consideration of the promised financial support from the owners. Unquestionably the promise of financial support had been a factor which had influenced the Council in deciding to proceed with the scheme.

No New Principles.

Dealing with the criticism which had been levelled against the Council for endeavouring to "make a bargain" with the owners, there was no new principle involved. There was abundant precedent for that in the "old country" and it was not unknown in Nairobi. The Council were constantly having to "make bargains" with regard to town planning proposals, and had done so also with reference to construction of roads and footpaths. He cited instances of these.

He reminded the meeting that the usual practice was to construct murrum footpaths on public roads, and if the owners desired something better, they paid for it. In this case there was a general desire to have something better than murrum footpaths, he suggested there was no violation of any principle in undertaking to provide flagged footpaths, mainly upon the owners paying some portion of the cost. The Council were not asking the owners to pay for a 12' width of footpath, but the willingness to defray the cost of the remaining width of footpath. The footpath on the south side was 19 feet wide, whereas that on the north side was only 12 feet wide. It would not have been fair to charge the owners on the south side with a greater proportion of the cost than those on the north side; hence the reason for proposing to charge for only 12 feet of footpath to owners on both sides.

meed Ali and the alleged robbery reported to him. He went to his own house, next door, and changed into uniform. Immediately Mr. Cannon arrived with the motor car. He went to the Police Station with Mr. Cannon and after having made various dispositions, went to the Cross Roads on the Mainia Road. There he treated the ear by the mark of the broken wheel for nearly a mile until he found it abandoned and parked outside the abandoned house of one Peter John, a Maganda, near Hobags Cathedral. He examined the car, and he found a label from a saddle bag, signed by some currency officials. That satisfied him that he had got the right car. He then searched the lorry round but without success.

He saw the Winchester rifle in the car boot and Mr. Cannon took the ammunition from under the seat. The ammunition was Winchester 45 Colt 30 and three rounds for a small automatic pistol.

Enquiries were continued all night and about 9 a.m. he saw the third and fourth accused at the Jinja bus park. He asked them where they were going, to which they replied "To Jinja to look for a job." He being satisfied, he asked them to go to the Police Station, and he took them there in a police van.

Statements by Accused.

About 9 a.m. on March 3, the first accused came to the Police Station, Kampala and reported the theft of his car the previous night. He was detained there for enquiry. Later, at the Police Station, the first accused made a voluntary statement, which witness read. The first accused said that if he were released and allowed to make private enquiry and was not disclosed to the enquirer, he thought he could bring the case to a satisfactory conclusion. His offer was refused.

The third and fourth accused also made voluntary statements, in which they denied all knowledge of the affair.

On Monday March 5, he formally charged all accused with robbery, when armed, and in association, and cautioned them. They made statements in which they denied the offence, and they were remanded in custody.

On March 11 the two Europeans sent for him. He visited them at the hospital separately; they said they wanted to make statements. He cautioned each of them and said them that they had nothing to hope from any promise or nothing to fear from any threat by whoever made or in whatever circumstances made. They said they understood. They then made statements which are recorded and produced.

Witness also deposed to recovering two bags of money and one revolver from the lorry in the vicinity of the abandoned motor car.

Guilt Powder Found.

The next witness was a native police constable, who said that on March 3 he visited the scene of the alleged robbery and there found a car standing with headlights and rear lamps broken. From inside the car he gathered up some powder, shillies which he produced.

Vianan and a revolver near him, the latter buried with some ammunition in a pillow case. He had two further bags of money each containing Shs. 2,000 in the vicinity of the abandoned car.

The hearing was adjourned till Wednesday for certain evidence from Katakamba.

During the course of a review of the Council's annual report, the Chairman of the meeting, Col. B. B. Turner, pointed out the value of the Society in the Colony's basic industry, and detailed its activities on behalf of agriculture during recent years. He expressed the opinion that the Colony could not afford to let the Society die.

The meeting decided that unless the necessary funds were forthcoming by June 30, a special general meeting be called to consider the position.

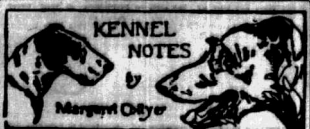

KENNEL NOTES

Margaret O'Byrne

Miss Collier, Obit., to which all correspondence in connection with "Kennel Notes" should be addressed, does not hold herself responsible for accuracy of statements made by her which are, in the main, based on information supplied by her correspondents.

For the third time I've had a case of blackwater in dogs reported to me, in each case this disease has proved fatal, 24 to 30 hours after development. I am glad to say that this last case was duly reported to the laboratory by the specimen sent for examination. I understand that after examining the specimen and reading the history of the case, the V.C.V. Unit which he also has heard of a few cases of canine blackwater, but that as yet the laboratory has not had sufficient opportunity to find out anything definite about the disease or the cause thereof.

It may be more coincidental, but such is the nature of the disease that the animal had suffered from a bad attack of tick-fever, and the blackwater had apparently developed as a secondary disease—whether tick-fever is the direct cause has yet to be discovered. It would therefore be diagnostic of this case, especially if people being dogs from blackwater would take the trouble to send all specimens to the laboratory at once. I beg my readers in the interest of the canine world to take notice of this advice.

This country being full of all sorts of parasites it rather wonder if this blackwater may not be caused by stronger gages (great intestine worms). It is not a common disease but is well-known to exist in tropical countries. This parasite is very like the common earthworm and is 10-20 C.M. long, and the thickness of a lead pencil. It is usually blood red in colour and found solitary. Generally discovered in the subcutis of the kidney, causing great irritation of the mucous membrane. The pelvis of the kidney becomes purulent and shows haemorrhagic inflammation, and sometimes the kidney itself is converted into an enormous cyst in the middle of which lies the parasite, twisted in a round spiral mass.

During life there are no symptoms which could be called characteristic and recognised with any ease. The animal may show evidence of stress of prostatic attacks of urine, great pain, quick respirations, moving from one place to another uttering at intervals short cries of pain, scratching or digging with its paws in an aimless way or may (great depression, staggering gait, emaciation, also the back is arched laterally. The urine is generally turbid and contains pus, blood, degenerated

He understood I have no kennels, and do not choose to take in dog-breeding. There are several very good boarding kennels round about Nairobi now, and dogs in need of a temporary home can be sent to these places where they will receive all the care they require on reasonable terms.

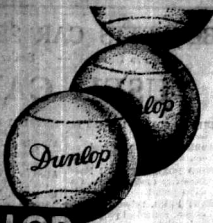

COLONIAL PREFERENCE AFFECTED.

[TRANSCAUCA'S AGENCY.] London, March 28. The Colonial Office announces that in order to deal with the fall in the exchange value of the Canadian Dollar, which affects Canadian preference in Colonial sugar, it is proposed, subject to the approval of Parliament, to reduce the general preference on Colonial sugar to the old rate of 9/6d. in order to reduce the price, so Canadian preference will be slightly unprofitable than the United Kingdom preference. Colonial producers will be compensated by a reduction in the general preference on all other goods of 1/- per cwt. on an invoice of value 500,000 tons of sugar 20/-, per cwt. on a four-monthly basis to the extent of 12,000 tons. For These Taxes. The new schedule, if approved by Parliament, will come into effect from the introduction of the Budget and it is intended to continue until 1935.

The proposed new quotas include:—Trans-Nyanza (Kaya) 2,000 tons and Mombasa 12,000 tons.

ROAD AND WEATHER REPORT.

Mr. Graham-Smith writes as follows:—
The weather conditions in East Africa are still unsatisfactory, as with the exception of small isolated storms in a few centres the weather in western Tanganyika, Kenya and Uganda still continues hot and dry. As far as it is possible to tell I do not see how the long rains can start before the middle of April. The wet retreating season, however, is least south of the central valley in Tanganyika it is raining steadily which means wet, so when the long rains do reach us they should be really plentiful.

In Nairobi and slating the weather has been as hot during the last week or ten days that I think you must have a heavy storm very shortly which will do much to relieve the present situation.

In Kenya the heaviest rains to get a drop more this week were in the Mombasa district which had 2 1/2 inches and certain parts of the Kakamega district. The rest of the country from the western rain fall reports received at the time of writing appears to be practically dry.

In Northern Tanganyika, Mushi had two heavy storms and a considerable amount of rain has fallen in the Usambara mountains and a somewhat lesser amount in the Tabora district. The rest of northern Tanganyika is still dry and parched.

In Uganda this week there has been a few small local showers but nothing really of importance to report.

I hear that the fishing on Mera, Nanyuki, North Thompson Falls and Nanyuki is really good, but as so many people are spending their holidays in Kenya, the mountain, in the Kenya Highlands and in the Great Ruwenzori like at Kisumu and Nanyuki, it is absolutely essential to book

NATIVE WELFARE AT ELDORET.

Progress of Municipal Location.

WELL ADMINISTERED.

Report on Activities During Last Year.

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT].
Eldoret, March 23.
At yesterday's meeting of the Eldoret Municipal Board the third annual report—1933—on the Eldoret Native Location was adopted. The report stated later as follows:—
"With the progress of time the living conditions employed by the natives in the location have improved to such an extent that at the end of 1933 it became increasingly difficult to think of any fundamental changes or additions.
"Every room in the location is thoroughly gone over with a lorry lamp at least once or fortnight and unimproved ones at six weeks. The result is very gratifying, as the rooms are entirely free from bugs and a pleasant clean smell pervades the whole atmosphere. The boys' dormitories are kept above their proper state, and assisted the staff, by keeping their rooms clean and leaving their possessions neatly arranged during the day, and not at their natural business districts in untidy heaps.
Lawns and Gardens.
"The lawns have become an accomplished fact, the waste material from the lawnmowers being provided an excellent fertilizer. Every block in the location has four lawns, which are kept in the best possible condition practically all the year round. The inhabitants are encouraged to pick the flowers in reasonable quantities to lighten their rooms and many make good use of the privilege. The trees too have stood great ground, the last season having the roof having been planted up during the year.
"Thirty allotments measuring 10 ft. x 50 ft. were bestowed of and handed over, free of charge, to the natives with a view of growing their own vegetables. Excellent results were obtained one half-acre setting six large cabbages of tomatoes from his holding. The total rainfall recorded at the location for the year was 35.07 inches.
The Mission.
"The Salvation Army and O.M.S. have built and opened halls in the location. They occupy positions side by side on a raised ground about a quarter of a mile from the location living quarters and are connected to them by a broad tree-lined motor road. The opening ceremony of the O.M.S. Hall was carried out by the Bishop of Mombasa on December 24, 1932, and the Salvation Army Hall was formally opened by the Provincial Commissioner, Col. O. Watkins, on April 16, 1933. From that date both bodies were assured of success. Morning classes are held for the children and successfully well attended, while classes for adults are held in the evenings. The church services are held every Sunday.
"The rents derived from houses and Gladstone halls are very much less than in 1932, being in 1932, £1,564 and in 1933, £1,425. The difference can be attributed to two main causes, namely reduction in labour due to business depression and insufficient Police to see that the by-laws dealing with native housing

were properly enforced. During the latter part of 1933 this latter was in some extent remedied, and there is every reason to believe that a very considerable increase in room rents will be shown in 1934. The annual wall is still being extensively used.
"Many visitors both official and unofficial were shown over the location during the year and they expressed themselves as delighted with what they saw.
The Health Clinic.
"Miss Rita O'Leary once again had charge of the Health Clinic and together with Miss Wilson, who relieved her when she was on leave, carried out valuable work. Figures taken from the annual report of the Medical Officer of Health show that the standard of health enjoyed by the natives in the location is steadily improving.
"The discipline during the year has been extraordinarily good. The two location sabars have carried out their duties excellently and have assisted the Location Superintendent in the execution of their prompt action in dealing with minor cases of disorder at their respective locations. No serious cases occurred during the year. The Location Superintendent and his 200 men were on duty at all times in case of any sudden emergency for the purpose and it appears to be generally appreciated by the inhabitants.
"Work was found for 30 boys and 100 women at the location by both employers and boys and very useful Labour Bureau. —"

INDIAN SECONDARY SCHOOL.

Annual Distribution of Prizes.

A SATISFACTORY YEAR.

Remarkable Examination Results.

The Annual Distribution of Prizes took place at the Government Indian Secondary School, Nairobi, on Friday, the 5th inst. The prizes were distributed by the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, who was accompanied by Mrs. M. M. Moore and the Hon. the Director of Education. Among the many people who attended the function were His Worship the Mayor and Mrs. MacIntyre, Mr. and Mrs. D. F. Moore, and the Very Rev. W. J. Wright.
"The principal of the school, Mr. J. H. Maxwell, M.A., extended a warm welcome to Mr. and Mrs. M. M. Moore on behalf of the school and the Indian community. In his report for the last year, Mr. Maxwell said that it had been successful but satisfactory. Nineteen pupils had passed the London Matriculation, many of whom had gone to India to continue their studies, and some of whom had obtained places in banks and in the Post Office locally. Subscriptions towards the supply of sports materials had been generous in the extreme, and two new hockey fields had been opened. The hostel had purchased a wireless set and the programme of Indian music had been much appreciated. Mr. Maxwell said that he had been glad to witness the future years could be as satisfactory as the year they had just concluded.
"Mr. M. M. Moore said that he considered the Principal was wrong in saying that the past year had been uneventful. The remarkable results of the Matriculation Examination of the University of London spoke volumes in praise of the good work done. Similarly the school had made great strides in other directions as well. The various activities such as sporting, sports, and dramatic performances were helping the boys a good deal in forming their characters and broadening their outlook. He rejoiced that the Government had to create some of the money given to

is a matter that rests entirely with the Returning Officers.

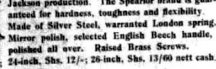

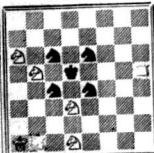

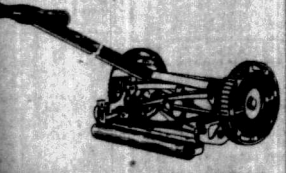
