## DRIVING TESTS IN ENGLAND.

### Government's New Traffic Bill.

#### Special Limit Agreed.

##### COMPELORY CROSSLING PLACES FOR PROTESTERS.

London, March 29. (Special Service's Agency.) The resignation of a speed limit of 20 miles per hour in populated areas for all roads and a stipulation that all new and existing roads must pass a test of compulsion, are outstanding features of the Government's new Road Traffic Bill, designed to deal with the problem of the increasing number of road accidents the gravity of which is emphasized in official figures showing that 7,200 persons were killed in Britain last year as compared with 6,071 in the previous year, which involved a severe total of 216,729 as compared with 206,430.

The Bill also provided that lower speed limits will continue to apply to the heaviest road vehicles, which will be required to carry a colour disc for the purpose of identification.

# British Empire Cancer Campaign.

## H.R.H. THE DUKE OF YORK'S APPEAL.

### Lecture Given in Nairobi.

#### CO-OPERATION WANTED BY BRITISH COMMUNITY IN KENYA.

Dr. J. H. Sequeira in a lecture in Nairobi on Thursday evening explained to a large and appreciative audience some of the problems of cancer and stressed the need for research.

The lecture was under the auspices of the British Empire Cancer Campaign the Patron of which is His Majesty the King and the President H. R. H. The Duke of York who appeals for a special collection to be made throughout Great Britain and Dominions, and the Colonies on Empire Day, 1934 in aid of the Campaign.

In his lecture, Dr. Sequeira pointed out that there were three objectives in cancer research: discovery of causes, accurate diagnosis and methods of treatment. There were also three forms of research: clinical, experimental and statistical. It was certain, said Dr. Sequeira, that if cancer was recognised early enough and was accessible, it was possible to effect a cure in a large proportion of cases.

The multiplication of the cell. It is the human body within limits was not only self-repairing but made for growth. The speaker believed that it was a perversion of the process of self-repair which played a large part in the causation of cancer.

**Nearly Always Single.**

A cancer was nearly always single. It was found on occasion to start as an outgrowth of a special kind of cell, i.e. special cells which were known as the "neoplastic" cells. As the neoplastic cells increased in form a self-repairing tendency to invade the tissue of a neighbouring tissue. The invaded area mobilised its defences for a time before the invasion set in, but only too often the defence was not so strong as the invading cells. In fact the invading cells live by what one might call local autotrophy. **Form of Research.**

Cancer Research takes three forms. It may be clinical, experimental and statistical. By clinical, it means the observation of patients and the study of the conditions under which their disease has developed. By experimental it means the investigation of cancer in animals, the production of tumours under control in such animals and the study of the changes outside the body. The statistical method is becoming of increasing value and this in previous years we have trained observers to collect facts and skilled interpreters of these facts.

Dr. Squigars spent some time in discussing the causes of the skin which occur in certain occupations and showed how much has been learned from the investigation of cancer due to tar, lubricating oils, and asbestos. He also drew attention to cancer caused by the action of the sun and the repeated irritation of the skin for the X rays.

**Effect of Diet.**

The difficulties attending the investigation of internal cancer were pointed out and the speaker felt that he could lay stress upon the fact that no particular article of diet could be incriminated as a cause of the disease. He, however, stated that certain recent observations, especially with regard to malignant disease of the stomach, suggested lines of research into the effect of diet and impaired digestion.

In Western Europe it was a curious fact that cancer of the stomach was more than twice as common as elsewhere. Dutchman, Bavarian, Czech-Slovak or Hungarian, Englishman and Englishwoman. The causes of this difference were at present unknown and might take a long research to discover. Further the same type of cancer varies with the social status of the individual. There is an increasing incidence as one descends the social scale. Against we cannot say why. For instance, there does not appear to be any adequate explanation of the fact that an agricultural labourer runs more than twice the risk of a clerk, and there are other curious discrepancies. These facts suggest the possibility of prevention. The Nairobi Laboratory has also published old myths that cancer is a disease of civilisation. Cancer is far from uncommon in the East Africa. Dr. Vignani's observations were confirmed when the subject was discussed at the recent conference of Dar es Salaam.

**Results of Treatment.**

A very important part of cancer research is the study of the control

of the various methods of treatment. The operating surgeon and the hospital have tried their methods of following up patients. Here doctors are on somewhat more hopeful ground than a generation ago. Whether they are dealing with the cancer parasite in women or with the malignant disease of amenable parts they can afford with increasing certainty that early recognition and accessibility are the essential factors of effecting a cure, whether by operation or by the application of the X rays or radium or by a combination of these and other measures. What is also certain is that even if operation is not curative it especially with one of the other adjuvants, removes some of the more terrible features of malignant disease.

With regard to the recurring statements that cancer is on the increase Dr. Squigars pointed out that with a few exceptions cancer is essentially a disease of advancing life and that in all civilised countries the average age of the population is increasing. Mr. Samuel Insull Arrested in Turkey.

AND TO BE EXTRADITED TO THE UNITED STATES.

Legal Technicalities.

COURT INTERPRETER'S ERROR LEADS TO STRANGE SITUATION.

When the Greek Government decided a month ago that he was no longer to remain in the country, Mr. Samuel Insull, the American financier, who was wanted by the police in his own country on a charge of fraud, left on a Greek ship to Constantinople, en route to Persia.

When the ship arrived in the Bosphorus, it was detained pending extensive negotiations, enquiries and investigations of international law. Eventually Mr. Insull, despite his protests and those of the Greek Captain of the ship in which he had arrived, was instructed to appear, in person, before a Turkish Court.

The proceedings then took a Gilbertian turn. Mr. Insull was brought before the Turkish Tribunal who, owing to an error by the Court Interpreter, decided that Mr. Insull was not an American citizen and that he was free to do as he pleased.

Finally the mistake was discovered, and Mr. Insull, on whose behalf lawyers, both Turkish and Greek, were making the greatest efforts, was arrested and informed that the request of the United States Government would be complied with, and he would be handed over to the American authorities for extradition.

Greek Captain's Protest.

Insull, March 31. After protesting to the Turkish Police and the Greek Consul against the detention of my client, the Captain of the "Mastis" refused to give up Samuel Insull who was under the protection of the Greek flag. I also reported to the British Consul in Athens and he has declared his moral support for the "Mastis" against the Greek Consul.

After receiving a visit from the Captain, the Greek Consul proposed to Athens for instructions. The Greek Legation is delaying advice from the Legation at the International Straits Commission as to whether the detention of Mr. Insull is a violation of the Montreux Convention.

To Attend Court.

An order has been issued compelling Insull to present himself personally before a Turkish Court which will decide if he is to be extradited to the United States. He will probably be subject to a summary trial before the Turkish Court. Following conversations between the Turkish Consul, Minister and the Greek Minister to Turkey, it was stated that Insull would attend court in person as far as an appeal against the "Mastis" case is concerned.

The only law that exists in this case is Insull's contract with the "Mastis" to offer to attend court. A dangerous precedent would be created by the view of international law.

## THE ART OF HAIRDRESSING

MAJOR CONRAD WALSH LEAVES AN IDEA WITH KENYA.

Colonial Office and Industry.

SECRETARY OF STATES POLICY OF OPPOSITION TO DEVELOPMENT.

Outspoken criticisms of some aspects of public policy in Eastern Africa were made to the "East African Standard" by Major Conrad Walsh, the London financier and a leading figure in the sisal industry who recently visited the Dependencies.

He deplored the policy of repression and discouragement of industrial development which is being followed by the present Secretary of State for the Colonies. During recent years several very important proposals for large-scale new industries in East Africa have been turned down to safeguard the British manufacturer.

Major Walsh also criticises the financial policy of Tanganyika and the apparent willingness of the Colonial Office to provide loan funds without meeting remaining Kenya deficits.

He asks Kenya to consider an idea—the creation of a "Colonial Empire Marketing Board" to take the place of the defunct E. M. B., and to concentrate the concentration of Colonial production and the expansion of Colonial development.

Tanganyika Financial Policy.

Major Conrad Walsh, the well-known London financier, who has interests in sisal among the largest in East Africa, left London on Saturday after a visit to the Territories. Major Walsh has been interested in East African development for many years and is intimately associated with that area in the continent with East Africa. He is an ardent supporter of the policy—followed by the Imperial and local Governments in regard to development and has always used his influence on the side of wise, sound and judicious financial progress in the development of a part of the Colonial Empire which is his view, will bulk very large in Colonial affairs in coming years.

In an interview with the East African Standard Major Walsh laid stress on the conviction he has that the policy in regard to India and the distribution of foreign nations was together transformed the attitude of London financiers and industrialists to the Colonies and particularly to Eastern Africa which are seeking openings for capital investment and that he was of the opinion that the Government has shown its intention to encourage development of resources on people.

Industry.

He declares the fact that at the present time there appears to be no consistent industrial policy in regard to the East African Dependencies is a question insisted in Kenya and Uganda by large-scale proposals for industrialization, which have been turned down by the present Secretary of State mainly for the reason that in his view they would compete with British industry, adversely affect export trade, and cause unemployment at home. That attitude, he said, has been changed from one of repression through very important advances in Tanganyika, the establishment of a sisal and sisalinder fibre factory in the Mandated Territory.

Reaping Japan.

He points out that the effect of the policy of industrial repression in East Africa is to reduce the means to build up an East African production in the very lines where financial groups were attempting to establish local industries. Major Walsh believes that the Government should abandon the present attitude of repression in favour of a policy which would encourage and assist the development of local industries.

Sisal.

The proper place for the insertion of proper merchandise Marks legislation which should be covered by a separate and comprehensive ordinance. It is certainly noted that the law does not seem to have been thought there was a good deal of trade in goods bearing trademark trade marks than previously. He insisted the fact that the section he mentioned covered "Manufactured goods" did not deal with the contents of such goods. For as the Customs was concerned they would witness the contents of more comprehensive legislation.

**Local Legislation.**

In reply to the Chairman as to amendments being made in local legislation where necessary so as to bring it into conformity with the provisions of the Imperial Merchandise Marks Act, as mentioned in the Colonial Office letter, Mr. Walsh thought this would meet the case so far as East Africa was concerned. He said that some manufacturers at this end might object to any such thing. They might want existing legislation in the United Kingdom tightened up.

Various questions were put to Mr. Walsh by members. Answering Mr. Mountstuart about the system of certifying invoices Mr. Walsh said he thought it had served its purpose. Of course it was useful in the case of South Africa which had travelled the same path with power to verify the value of goods etc. but in a small place like Kenya it had been practically impossible to have traveling officers so that the system mentioned by Mr. Mountstuart was so far as they could go.

Mr. Walsh was accorded a hearty vote of thanks and warmly congratulated on his appointment as Treasurer.

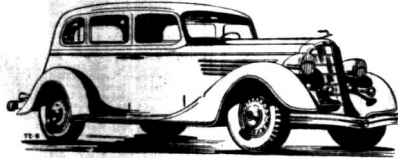

Combating Locusts from the Air.

EXPERIMENT TO BE CARRIED OUT IN RHODESIA.

A Laboratory Discovery.

SWARMS TO BE SPRAYED BY FINELY POWDERED SODIUM ARSENITE.

The spraying of locust swarms with finely powdered sodium arsenite, discharged from a specially fitted aeroplane, is about to be undertaken as an experiment in Northern Rhodesia. The operations will be carried out by Mr. H. H. King, an entomologist, under the auspices of the Colonial Office.

Mr. King, late of the Sudan Service, has discovered, by laboratory tests, that the adult locust is a spray victim to this spray, and has conceived the idea of firing this poison from an aeroplane flying across the line of flight.

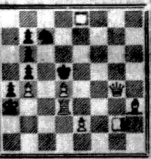

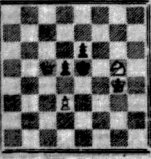

### THE CHAMPION.

On the occasion of Dr. Alekhin giving a simultaneous blindfold performance in the Hall of the Hotel Danubius, the opportunity of arranging a broadcast for him on the radio to the Dutch East India and even beyond, Dr. Alekhin was very interested in this event, so he had just completed a long tour through these islands.

The broadcast was also arranged in connection with the 25 years' jubilee of Dr. Alekhin as a chess master, as in 1909 he won his first prize in St. Petersburg, when 12 years old.

He announced that he learnt chess from an older brother at the age of 7, but was not allowed to play outside his house until 14. A year later he was allowed to compete in a tournament at Dusseldorf, when he divided the third and fourth prizes, which was a great disappointment to him. He then challenged the old Van Dandelen, who, however, was not very interested in the match and lost by 4 games to 2, two being draws.

He considered that his most important opponents in matches have been Capablanca and Bogoljuboff. The first was the more difficult to beat, but Bogoljuboff's play was more dangerous as he is very enterprising and at times risks everything on a certain combination. His match with Dr. Ewee in 1906 he considered as being too short. He rather underestimated Dr. Ewee, but thought the result of 5-4 was a correct one, but Dr. Ewee of 1922 is not the same as Dr. Ewee of 1906. At present his chess is very deep and gives great promise for the future.

The chess master who has had the greatest influence on the development is Steinitz. Lasker and Tarrasch had none. The best because he is a great individualist and has never tried to found a "school," which the latter's ideas expressed in his 300 Chess Games already coincides with his own. Philidor he considered a great pioneer. Merely a great practical chess genius, what he looked upon Anderssen as the greatest combative player of all time, although Morphy was his superior as regards actual play. With regard to his match with Bogoljuboff, which is commencing early in April and which is guaranteed by the State of Baden, the games will be played mostly in Baden Baden, Munich and Nuremberg. He was hoping to win the match, and if not it is quite likely that Bogoljuboff will not be able to find a husband for a return match. After his the following would come into consideration for future matches—Dr. Ewee, Plohr, and Kaslman, since these three are the great masters of the future.

His plans for 1954-5, stated the world champion, are as follows: After his match with Bogoljuboff he intends to complete his mysterious book, The Soul of Chess (in German). At the end of summer he will begin a tour of the British Isles and Australia, where he will take part in a tournament in Melbourne in December of this year. After that he hopes to make a further tour through Java and Sumatra to renew acquaintance with friends he made there in 1932. Probably Mr. London, the well-known Rotterdam Chess and Bridge expert, will accompany him on the tour. After India he intends to go to China, Japan, Hawaii and California, which he had not seen a few months in the U.S.

After the broadcast Dr. Alekhin was quite anxious to know if his friends in Java could really have heard his voice. Of these four present in the studio laughingly made the remark "Not only your friends but your enemies also." Dr. Alekhin smiled and replied that he did not know whether he had any enemies or not.

After the interview he took a train to Amsterdam to visit his friend Dr. Ewee.—(B.C.M.).

The Director also expressed the hope that detailed daily reports with a forecast of possible changes would soon be available.

## Forecasting Problems.

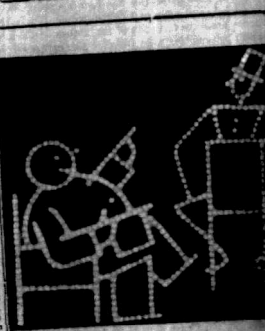
