South Africa and the Native Protectorates. UNION TO URGE IMMEDIATE TRANSFER. A Controversy Expected. BRITISH CHARGED WITH FAILING TO DEVELOP THE AREAS.

The question of the administration of the three native Protectorates in South Africa has again been raised. In the South African Legislative Assembly, the Premier, General J. B. M. Hertzog, announced that it was proposed to send a note to the British Government urging the immediate transfer of these territories to the Union.

It is alleged by the advocates of the transfer that the British Government, which retained control of these areas when the South African Union was formed, has failed to develop these Protectorates which are still in a backward state.

Under the Union of South Africa Act of 1908 provision is made for the transfer to the Union Government of the Administration of protected and other native territories, two of which are contiguous to the Union and the other actually surrounded by Union territory.

Nevertheless an inter-Imperial controversy is expected to arise. The natives, themselves, are stated to be opposed to the transfer, while the "Manchester Guardian" states that the Union must adopt a more liberal native policy before the request can be entertained.

Note to be Despatched. London, April 26. The possibility of an inter-Imperial controversy has been set up by an announcement by General Hertzog, the Premier, in the South African Parliament that the government proposed sending a note to the British Government urging the immediate transfer of the native Protectorates of Bechuanaland, Swaziland and Namaland to the Union.

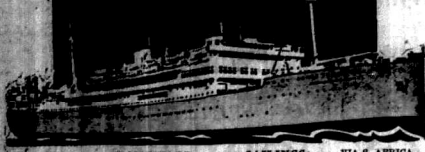

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY.

Provision for Associate Members.

Less than five minutes was required on Thursday afternoon for the disposal of the business on the agenda of the special general meeting of the Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society.

At the outset of the proceedings the chairman explained that at the last annual general meeting of the Society, a resolution was passed instructing the Council of the Society to take the necessary steps to institute a further class of membership paying a subscription of Shs. 10/- per annum, and with privileges on a lesser scale than those enjoyed by the district members.

Associate Members.

The Council, he said, referred the resolution to a special sub-committee, which, among its recommendations, suggested that no time should be lost in making provision for this new form of membership. It was the intention that this should be the principal feature in the propaganda campaign it was proposed to carry out on behalf of the Society.

The Secretary, Mr. M. F. H.B., stated that the object of the first alteration suggested was merely to provide for this new class of membership which it had been proposed should be called associate members. It would consist of persons paying an annual subscription of Shs. 10/-. The second amendment defined the privileges which it was suggested that associate members should enjoy.

Director of Agriculture.

The remaining recommendation, he said, was that the following sentence should be added to the rules and constitution of the Society: "The Director of Agriculture shall be a member of the Council, ex-officio and an honorary member of the Society."

JAMES ELIOT FLECKER.

A McMillan Memorial Library Lecturer.

An interesting lecture on James Eliot Flecker was given at the McMillan Memorial Library on Thursday evening by Mr. T. G. Benson. Flecker, by most, was a man who was proud to call himself a poet. He had grown up in a scholarly atmosphere, being the son of the headmaster of the Dean School at Cheltenham, and going later to Oxford. For a short time he acted as the General Services Officer in the Colonial Service, and owing to his knowledge of languages he was able to make suitable translations which were published with his excellent results. He was born in 1884 and died of consumption in Switzerland in 1915. His poems reflect the best era atmosphere in which he lived during his Colonial Service in Seynra, Constantinople and Beirut, and his constant hunger and inspiration had been his Greek world. In "Hassan" perhaps his greatest work gave us a new, realising world of present day, full of sympathy and understanding.

The outlook of the poet was affected him deeply. "What a pain of despair, and thoughtful of the way, now that these millions have been begotten in this world." The most notable thing about all his work was his great capacity for revision. He wrote, and re-wrote, in a manner seldom found since his contemporaries, and his model was the French Romantic School of 1800.

Mr. Benson gave a summary of the story of "Hassan", which was produced on the London stage with all the splendour which had been lavished on "The Chin-Chin". It was the over-romantic production of the play which led to its failure. Flecker had written one word, "The King of Almodar" which was very little known. It was "just a light-hearted funny story of no particular importance" but it contained some fine writing. Mr. Benson referred to his knowledge of economy, his pessimistic regard for the future and his "affectionate and tender" towards the poet's instrument.

The Rev. J. W. Douglass, who was in the chair, expressed the appreciation of those present for the insight into the life and work of James Eliot Flecker which Mr. Benson had given them in his lecture.

Agreeing that the principle of the Bill was a sound one, Hon. Charles de Buns asked that it should contain some provision to take care of children who, instead of themselves or any crime, were left orphaned because their parents were in prison.

Canon Burns (Native Interests) said that girls presented the most serious problem in Nairobi, particularly in those cases where the mother were out of the country.

While he agreed with Lord Francis as to the need for caution in finance, Hon. J. D. Pankaj believed that expenditure in this direction would be an investment for the Colony.

A brief reply from the Attorney General—who assured Mr. Stewart-Deen that a section of the Bill met his point—and the Bill met its second reading and went to select committee.

ENGLAND'S WIN OVER SCOTLAND.

Scots' Weakness at Wembley.

Home Team's Snap Goals.

Gallacher - The Hero.

[STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.] London, April 17. [By air mail.] England last Scotland by 3-0 at Wembley on Saturday, but no one believes unless they see the score represent the relative ability of the teams, or that the result was in keeping with the general run of the play.

The pretty but puncheon and heavy Scotland were on top for more than half the game, and for the first 20 minutes of the second half they were no less aggressive, when they did everything but score. They were then a goal behind, but just when they looked certain to save the game at the least, a second goal for England seemed to break their hearts, and they faded out of the picture. It was a triumph of opportunism over skillful play that locked the deciding goal to make it perfect. England's goals were all of the makeshift order, but two of them were the result of brilliant efforts. Baslin and Brook took the first of the home goals that Scotland lacked. They took their chances without the slightest hesitation. The Scots, on the other hand, wanted to wait the ball into the net and paid the inevitable penalty. England's defence, after a shaky start, played sterling football. Cooper was the star, and Moss came to the rescue when a corner was taken. The Scottish goalkeeper was in the winners' half-back line, though. The game was half-finished, but the Scots were not outstanding.

There were brilliant individual plays in the England back. Baslin barged into the game of critical moments. His goal was masterful, while his service to Brook was both neat and telling. Cooper was a most effective player. He was always giving Crook plenty of the ball. Brokers scored a goal, but beyond that he did little of note.

McGonigal's Slip.

Scotland failed in front of goal, otherwise that team played vastly better than many of the northern supporters expected. They were gallant, and Gallacher was a hero, but without the luck which is the mark of heroes' work. McGonigal bluffed a sterner display by a good line foot on Crook. Anderson was a plucky back, and the main Scots defence came through with credit.

The official program for the match was: (1) 1919-7-0. (2) 1900, including the Duke of York. Receipts £20,178-7-0. (3) The play: The Scots won the toss and played with a straightforward, but the weather was fine at the turf goal.

A Wonderful Goal.

Goal after the starter Gallacher worked hard, but pulled the ball back to Moss with the result that Moss got to it in time. With nearly a quarter of an hour gone, Brokers missed a glorious chance to open the score. Brook did the work, and when the ball came across Crook's defence headed it over Smith's head to Carter. The Sunderland youth heaved the ball on to Baslin, who was eight in front of goal and not six yards out. Baslin's shot was a good push the ball gently into the Jackson's arms. Anything like a real shot and England must have been a goal up. England scored after 40 minutes, and it was a goal worth work of the occasion. Crook started a raid that saw Brook and Baslin attacking steadily. They eventually missed, but with his right foot, and it served as a rough the danger to the Scots was past. All the visiting forwards had a share in the bustle and Gallacher essentially held off Cooper so that Crook could centre without interruption. And Crook did his part of the job so effectively that only a splendid save by Moss kept the ball out. It was only a moment's relief for the Scots were back again, and Gallacher looked the ball on to the face of the crossbar. As if with a horrible of players falling over each other in the goalmouth the situation was full of danger to England. Again Moss saved - one after another as Gallacher charged him into the net. This was a splendid Scottish revival.

The Second Goal.

With 27 minutes of the second half gone Baslin picked up another stray ball that came in his direction. He was in the act of reaching the line of the penalty area he was brought down. The referee gave a free kick. The Scots did not agree with his decision, but perhaps the English referee. Eric Brook the outside-left, of Manchester City, drove the ball hard and a second goal if McGonigal deflected it, once, and Jackson was beaten a second time. The Scottish goalkeeper might have covered the drive, but the tanger at which the ball rebounded left him helpless. The second goal really finished the game, although six minutes before the finish Baslin passed the ball to make a job of the centre. The Scottish referee heard a goal-mouthed the one thing he did well to do.

The game was interesting until the last quarter of an hour, when the spectators' left in their thousands, as the game was beyond any argument or hope for the visitors.

And so England have a post of honour in the international table, but Scotland have named through a season without a win. The men's the pity.

A SUCCESSFUL SAFARI IN EAST AFRICA.

Here Valuable Publicity for the Country.

TOUR BY AUSTRALIAN EXPEDITION.

Excellent News Photographs Obtained.

Judging by the results of a four months' safari which has just been concluded, Kenya is equally as good a hunting ground as far as photographing and shooting big game is concerned, as Tanganyika. This was intimated by Commander G. P. Patrick, the well known Australian skipper, who accompanied by his wife, arrived in the country in December last year, and left Nairobi by Imperial Airways on Friday, accompanied for their having completed a four months' safari in the Highlands of Kenya and Uganda.

Starting from the Coastal belt they secured one of the biggest safaris ever taken in this area, and while on their way up to Nairobi, good deposits and thick sprays were obtained. The party then went towards the Abyssinian border, and in this area a great kill was bagged, having a horn spread 48 inches, which is nearly a record, while in the northern part a magnificent ox eye deer was obtained. In addition to these, a very large black mutton deer was secured in the Uasin Gishu.

Photographs Secured.

Although the party consisted of Nairobi with a fine collection of trophies, they were out on the mountains of "Kilimanjaro" the one which, however possible with the summer, and the general one brought back is one which will astonish Commander and Mrs. Patrick of a most extraordinary capture in Kenya. His original idea was to go to Tanganyika, the country now famous for its "large" horn, but on hearing of the difficulties encountered in entering Tanganyika and of the various other obstacles in the way, he decided to keep to Kenya and Uganda, where he found that

photograph of "tame" big game could just as easily be obtained. After only a brief time devoted to the examination of Patrick saw 20 lions and some excellent pictures were taken, believed to be just as good, if not better, than the Indian chowdhari. The only trouble was that the animals come too close to the camera. In many instances they were not more than ten feet from the lens, while one young lion in particular appeared to have a great desire to jump on the lorry.

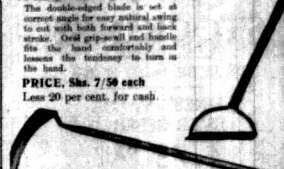
In Uganda.

The party then travelled up to Uganda, where a most interesting spectacle, from the point of view of cinema pictures, was a fight between a hippo and a crocodile. The hippo immediately made a mad rush at the ugly reptile and grabbed it in the middle of its back, and a severe struggle lasting about half a minute ensued. Commander Patrick and his wife visited the East African and intend to return to the country in the next few months. This, he thinks, will be the forerunner of a number of Australian "outing" "over this side" of the world. He has been to India where he managed to obtain several good specimens of tiger and panther. He is now on his way to China, where he will spend a fortnight. After touring the whole of Europe, he hopes to go on to Canada with the object of shooting a grizzly.
