

Two representative International Commission members reported upon the deplorable conditions which prevail in the Black Republic in West Africa—confirming in every detail the charges made by Lady Simon in her book 'Slavery'.

THE OLD LAW COURTS SITE.

(Continued from page 1.)

Avenue could not be considered as a through-highway leading from one residential area to another because of the blockage caused at the one end by the Law Courts buildings and at the other by the railway. The only through-traffic centre would be the road that was to be diverted through City Square.

While he did not think that the present Law Courts site should be kept as an open space, he was definitely of the opinion that if it were laid on the authorities would have failed in their duty to it if they had not done so.

He urged a policy of requirements. He argued that public demands necessitated the extension of Third Avenue. It would not be found that the authorities had prevented any such development.

Continuing, he expressed the view that the present value of the site was merely a fraction of its value. Even this value, however, was not the real value of the land would be what the local authorities in any ten years time. There was a danger that in future traffic centre would be situated in the same way as Elton Street had been blocked by the McMillin Memorial Library.

After passing through the need for through highways to meet future traffic demands, he pointed out that it was necessary to provide a route to another part of the town. This was accomplished by voting the hope that the Council would take action in regard to the question of the site of the new site.

His views were endorsed by Mr. H. Dargatzis, Mayor of the City, Mr. H. E. Schuster, Capt. H. H. Wood, and Mr. J. H. Wood, Chairman. Mr. H. E. Schuster stated their belief that both planning schemes for through-roads, and Mr. H. H. Wood mentioned the fact that the road for a property near the Law Courts was in an endeavour to show that his suggested value of £21,000 was not a fictitious one.

Major the Hon. Cavendish-Bencher, while expressing that the subject is not one which strictly comes within his province, strongly urged upon the Municipal authorities the advisability of not removing any decision with regard to the disposal of the existing Law Courts site for some years to come. Captain Anderson seconded.

Messrs. Robson, Wood and G. Guinness-Dempsey considered that the situation aimed at leading the hands of the Municipal Council for a number of years. If this happened the Council might find itself in the position of having to turn down an excellent offer for the purchase of the site at a sum which would be prepared to erect a handsome building on it.

An Open Mind.
Captain the Hon. H. E. Schuster thought that the Chamber should urge the Municipality to keep an open mind on the subject for a few years at least, and suggested that Captain Anderson and Major the Hon. Cavendish-Bencher should think about it together and draw up a motion in which the Chamber's view on the matter would be adequately set out. This motion would then be introduced in the agenda for the next meeting of the Chamber. His proposal was supported by the chairman and unanimously carried.

BEAUTIFYING NAIROBI.

Proposals Under Consideration.

Flower and Trees.

BRIGHTENING APPEARANCE OF STREETS.

"What can be done to beautify Nairobi?" This question was put yesterday to Mr. H. M. Mountford, the Municipal Parks Superintendent, by the East African Standard, who sought to discover what schemes the Municipality had in view for the beautification of the town.

In replying, Mr. Mountford outlined several schemes which were under consideration, and also suggested various ways in which the appearance of the town could be improved. One of the proposals he had to make was to have window boxes in their windows which would encourage leaf geraniums, and which would be the most suitable plants to be considered. This, he considered, would brighten the streets a lot. Window boxes were even now to be seen in several local buildings.

It is Mr. Mountford's intention to construct a Dutch garden on the centre island in the square in front of the Railway offices for this purpose the island would be cleared in the square and crazy paving designs would be introduced. The other big job which will be undertaken is to plant a large clump of magnolia trees which will be planted on each. If possible, he would like to have a fountain erected on the centre island.

In Sixth Avenue.

Because of their shabby appearance, it is hoped one day to remove the old existing trees on the islands in Sixth Avenue and to replace them with flowering shrubs. This work, however, cannot be carried out until the reconstruction of the side road in Sixth Avenue has been completed, for at present there is too much dust.

Now that good rains had fallen, Mr. Mountford stated, the red grass and palms in Sixth Avenue would grow much better. He mentioned that the nature of the soil would change with the muck-making of the side roads as the rain would run off instead of soaking into the ground.

The effect of the vegetation in Sixth Avenue, he considered, would be greatly enhanced if a fountain could be erected on the new island in front of the New Stanley Hotel. Owing to the paucity of the town's water supply, however, this was out of the question until such time as the new Bura supply scheme materialised.

With regard to the fears that the fountains might provide breeding places for mosquitoes, he remarked that this danger could be eliminated by introducing selected species of fish and water lilies. The lilies would also serve to provide shade for the fish. Species of tropical fish which ate mosquito larvae could be present.

ed with little difficulty and expense.

Other Areas.

Trees were being planted in the Law Courts site, the present Law Courts site, and planting in Riata Road, from the National Bank of India to River Road would be proceeded with as soon as possible. Riata Road, he added, would eventually be one of the main highways from a business area of Nairobi to Mathura. It would join up with Park Road.

With regard to the new Law Courts, were completed he would be able to proceed with the laying out of City Square. He considered that the present Law Courts site, when created should be converted into a garden on the same lines as the Jervoise Gardens.

Residents in Davidson Road and Lenana Road, he said, had expressed a desire to beautify these two thoroughfares by means of tree planting, and the Municipal Council had promised to provide the trees provided the residents did the planting themselves. It was proposed to plant jacaranda, bougainvillea and a bronze shrub known as acalypha.

A Man for City Park.

Rapid progress was being made with the beautification of City Park, and the Dutch garden had now been completed, while only a little remained to be done in the rose garden. A site was being prepared for a replica of the Hampton Court maze, but on a larger scale. The maze would be a continuation of the Dutch and rose garden scheme. It was also hoped to lay out a cart garden in the near future.

Improvement work was taking place at the Mathura Van Memorial. All the old earth grass was being taken out and replaced by Kikuyu grass, and a keel apple hedge was being planted outside the old hedge.

Referring to the dangerous condition of the old trees in the avenue in Government Road, he stated that his idea was that those between Almsworth bridges and Swamp Road should be lopped off to a height of 30 ft. Many of these belonged to Mr. Jervoise, however, his consent would first have to be obtained.

Special Stonework.

HAIR BRUSHES USED TO PREPARE SURFACES.

The new Kenya Law Courts which are at present under construction in Nairobi are due to be opened on May 1, 1936, and the departments which will be accommodated in the building have been notified to that effect.

The whole of the woodwork in the interior, including the furniture, will be of local timber, which in some cases is being specially treated by the P.W.D. The flooring is being prepared from a special type of granite from the Kisumu area.

There are special features in regard to the building, which when completed will cost £120,000. These include the entire absence of scaffolding in favour of two large cranes on light lines and are thus able to travel round the whole of the works. They are working satisfactorily.

For the first time in Kenya synthetic stone is being used, and modelling by the contractor, and all the casting and moulding is the work of native and Indian artisans. There are 200 natives working on the building.

done! In doubt as to what tools to use, Mr. Howers picked up in a Nairobi shop a small, light hair brush. He experimented, found that his idea was successful of execution, and wrote two or three gross of these brushes were used for the stippling.

Mr. Howers made the models himself for the various decorative effects which will be produced in stone ways. At present, there are 500 natives and Indian workmen in the quarries and on the site. Mr. Howers built the model, and he afterwards obtained the contract for the erection of the remainder of the courts, and thus the credit of the general effects is due in no small measure to Mr. Howers himself.

The Interior.

Turning to the interior, the Public Works Department is collaborating in the furnishings, and here again Kenya products have come into their own. Some time ago the Executive Engineer of the P.W.D. found near Kiama a stone known as Epidote granite, capable it was thought of being polished like marble. No large quantities came to light then, but subsequently Mr. Murray Hughes, the Government Geologist, went over to inspect the quarry. He was likely to find a stone which could be obtained for practical purposes in all, about 100 to 200 feet have been brought down to make a flooring for the corridors and terraces. A very good coloring, the stone is broken up into shingles, and then treated by the terrazzo experts, two families of Italian brothers. Three in all, who comprise the Little Flowering Co. When set in black and white bordering, the granite is very effective.

Kenya woods are to be used throughout the building. In Court No. 3 the wood is in mahogany. Nos. 2 and 4, camphor. No. 3 is teak, and No. 4 is eucalyptus. That is for the panelling and fitted furniture, such as the court's seats, witness box and dock, etc. All of this wood has been kindly seasoned by the P.W.D. in their own kilns, and in the case of polo, when treated it looks like mahogany. The flooring of all the courts is in shagreen. The scroll work around the ceiling is of fibrous plaster, and from the one design sent out from England copies were made by Mr. Howers. This was extremely complicated work, but it has been most successfully achieved.

At the P.W.D. is also being made the furniture for the courts and offices, and an interesting experiment has been carried out with the camphor wood for the library. The wood has first been burnt with lime, and then polished with beeswax. Not only will this prevent insects, but the books will not be stained if they would with the ordinary oiling of the wood. The appearance of the camphor is also greatly enhanced. Local products also include Kenya cement and three grades of a million bricks. At the P.W.D. there is being made the furniture for the different rooms, and the artisans have combined skill with handsome sense of design.

and Administrations carrying out a large measure identical work. It was the view of the Association of Chambers of Commerce in 1929, that the departments of customs, railways, ports and communications including aerial communications, defence, control research, law and civil procedure and posts, telegraphs and tele-phones should be co-ordinated under one departmental head for each service.

In regard to present frustration from the policy of centralization, it must be remembered that the system now adopted is of a far more size co-ordination after consultation under the aegis of a non-statutory body like the Government Conference which the possibility of co-ordination to the extent of the parties to any proposed for further work, although it has been done by the permissive system. The Association feels that to obtain a full measure of possible co-ordination, something more authoritative is necessary.

The Recommendations.

Cattle Farming in Kenya.

Progress of the Dairy Industry.

For some years therefore, beef production continued hand-in-hand with dairying and it is only recently after a series of warnings by the Department of Agriculture over a long period, that it has been noted that a beef trade for Kenya is not practical.

 "In addition, he said, he contended with many doubts as to the value of which was in course of elucidation and there was a certain period of improvement in the way of dairy products and had commenced exporting butter to London."

Beef Production (Continued).
 "At this time, 1953, the dairy farms became really dairy-farmed and it is perhaps, fitting that we should consider that a somewhat statistical thought of the position then. Taking figures up to 1951, Mr. Y. Leverage, the Agricultural Department's Economic Development Officer, estimated from a survey of some 50 farms that the average stock density of butchers of profits and losses over

the farms varied from seven with a profit over £500 per annum to only one with a loss of £100. The result of the survey, however, indicated that in 1951 the dairy industry was holding its own and providing a close return on capital of between four and five per cent, which was better than most other industries could show at that time.

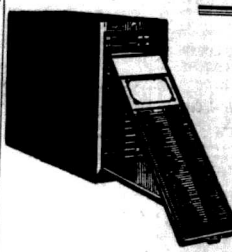

MIND THE METAL

Metallic Currency in United States.

A GOLD TO SILVER RATIO OF THREE TO ONE. President Roosevelt's Scheme.

IN ORDER TO BROADEN METALLIC BASE OF CURRENCY SYSTEM. Describing the recent Gold Reserve Act as being merely a step in giving a sound foundation to the currency of the United States, President Roosevelt now desires a larger objective.

In a message to Congress he demands legislation to make silver a quarter of the metallic base of the currency and thus broaden the basis of the monetary system.

It is believed by President Roosevelt that a world-wide metallic agreement would constitute the ultimate solution of the silver problem.

In order to fulfill the President's plan, the Treasury will have to acquire 1,300,000,000 ounces of silver over and above that which it already holds.

Increasing Monetary Stocks. [THE BUREAU'S AGENCY.]

Washington, May 22. The ultimate solution of the silver problem. Congress is now meeting for a bill has been introduced into the Senate providing for the turning of silver stocks.

It preliminarily authorizes the President to take over the nation's monetary silver stock and also authorizes the Secretary of the Treasury to purchase silver at home and abroad at such rates, times and terms as he may deem reasonable and most advantageous to the public interest.

It declares that a sound and ultimate foundation to the monetary system was laid by the Gold Trust Act of 1934, but that though the monetary system has been only a step, as part of a larger objective plan.

THE ULTIMATE OBJECTIVE. The President recommends legislation this session, declaring that the policy of the United States is to maintain the monetary and monetary stocks with the ultimate objective of maintaining a one-to-one monetary value in silver and to direct the President to make silver the monetary base of the currency.

THE ULTIMATE OBJECTIVE. The President also seeks an increase in the gold content of the currency of the country as required for industrial uses to include imports, exports, and other uses in monetary system.

Majority Support Third Party Insurance.

 Koro, May 20.
 A meeting of the Nyanza District Council was held on Monday Mr. J. O. Hamilton-Koro was in the chair, other Chairmen present being L. Dasini, H. Harvey, W. S. Bedford, L. R. Latimer-Sanders, T. Allen, L. E. Lawrence, J. F. Allen, R. T. P. P. P. and T. A. B. Turton. High-Supervisor Mr. Eddell Cooper in attendance. The Hon. Conway Harvey was also present by invitation.

After an exchange of compliments between the Chairmen who are shortly proceeding on leave and members of the Council, Mr. E. Lawrence-Koro was elected Chairman for the current year and Mr. L. R. Latimer-Sanders (Leek Island) Vice-Chairman.

The following members were elected as members of the Finance Committee:—Councillor Allen, Mr. Martin, Harvey, Dasini and Latimer-Sanders, the General Purposes Committee being composed of the Chairman, Messrs. T. Allen, E. Martin and H. Harvey.

Road Reserve.

The importance of guarding road reserves was emphasized by the Clerk-Supervisor and the Council agreed that all possible steps should be taken to prevent encroachment by occupiers of land adjacent to road reservations which should be placed on their permanent alignment and formally gazetted at the earliest possible moment.

Third Party Insurance.

On a motion by Councillor Latimer-Sanders it was decided by 7 votes to 4, that the Central Roads and Traffic Board should be informed that the Council was in favour of the immediate introduction by Government of compulsory third party insurance.

Councillor Dasini and other members considered that the public generally had been frightened by the high cost of the policy as reflected by the quoted figure of £27,000, and that universal support would be obtained if the necessary cover could be given through the agency of a Third Party Insurance at a reasonable rate. ELDORET WATER SUPPLY.

Flat Rate Decreases Continued.

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.]
 Eldoret, May 21.
 The question of a flat rate for water supply in Eldoret has appeared on the agenda for the first time at the meeting of the Council held on Monday. The Council, after a long session, decided to grant a flat rate of Shs. 16/6 per year, which is to be reduced to Shs. 12/6 in the case of the water supply for lodges, hotels, boarding houses, hospitals, and other public institutions. It was also decided that the Town Clerk be authorized to cancel all flat rates in this locality be collected forthwith.

The Chairman pointed out that at the last meeting it was unanimously decided to order all matters connected with the water supply to the Works and Health Committee and that in view of that unanimous resolution this matter be referred to the Board should be referred to the proposer and seconded approval and the matter was so referred.

The District Commissioner and the Supervisor submitted information and proposals for lighting up collection of license fees on non-motor vehicles which Council decided to pass on to Government. The chief point in differentiation between annual license and license for six monthly and quarterly periods.

Councillor Dasini urged Council to look sight of his ambition to obtain control of the main trunk roads in the district. It was decided that action should be deferred for the present and that the Government's appointment in this direction in the Nakuru area should be closely watched.

The District Commissioner informed the meeting that it was hoped to arrange for employment on Lumina township roads of the inmates of the Deviation Camp recently established at Lamboh and that if this could be effected, it is expected that the long standing problem of the maintenance of these roads would be solved.

THE KIKUYU CRIM.
Bishop of Mombasa, there was Kenya's Dismissal.

STANDARD CONVENTION.
London, (By Air Mail.)
The Bishop of Mombasa addressed the 11th annual meeting of the Colonial and Overseas Church Society in London at the beginning of the month.

In the course of his address the Bishop said that if there were any comparisons between the two, he thought the work of the man who counts on his own feet would be more difficult than that of the missionary, who, with the help of the natives of the country, in Kenya can only realize that the difficulties of the settler, if not so great as those of many others, were yet not insurmountable. In the last few years the settlers in Kenya had terrible families, but through and through they were not so much as they were once, as well as a very real difficulty in the close association of two kinds of people, the white and the black. In the Highlands of Kenya, the settlers—many of them public school boys and their families—were settled down, some outside the African, only some of whom were even now coming out of the darkness of feudalism. The problem was very difficult for both parties.

Murdering.

People in Kenya were criticised for being inquisitorial, or very little interest in the black people whom they were situated. There might be some who did not recognise their responsibility, but the great majority really wanted to do the right thing by the Africans by whom they were surrounded, and those who worked on their farms. But the difficulties were very real. The African could be more aggressive without meaning it. He mistakes the Kikuyu tribe for a horridly hairy, when scolded by the mistreat of the hoes for falling, breaking, or some such thing. But the Kikuyu custom for a man to go to the bush and prove, to show that they know the meaning was just and that they do not want to go to the bush and strip little ways in which it was very easy for white and black people to misunderstand each other, and for trouble in small matters to arise. The Society was helping them with stipends up country, but more were needed.

Tonight's Films.
Capital Theatre.

When "The Private Life of Henry VIII" was released at the end of last year it was proclaimed as one of the greatest in studio film history, and Charles Laughton was awarded the gold medal for his inspired and frank acting. It is difficult to make any comment on such a picture, whose advent has been awaited so long and whose reputation has been made and proved, except that it is a masterpiece. It is difficult to write in such a way as to suggest the somewhat arid speech of those who satiated the taste of the modern audience; the production is lavish and detailed; the cast of players is huge and contains such names as Elsa Lanchester, Franklyn Dyll, Robert Donat and Hilda Horne; and there is the character of Henry, given, in a most lovely way, by a man named in all his wives, love. There is something within in the film, something, something pathetic, especially in his death at the birth of his son and his tragic end at the discovery of Katherine Howard's infidelity. Then the human touch again when he sits up all night playing cards with Ann of Cleves (what matter if she is not a virgin and let as history describes her?), and at the end, when the old man, and the end of whose old man, and of nobility creating the violent eyes of the sixth year. Though the subject is historical, it is treated with humour and gaiety, and Charles Laughton gives a superb portrait of the merry monarch with every bit of his six wives. The remark that the film had been, undoubtedly by the censor is quite unfounded. It is being shown just as it was sent to the country. "The Private Life of Henry VIII" is a film that is quite exceptional in every way.

Empire Theatre.

"Mr. Bill the Conqueror" is a typically English picture, beautifully photographed, in which a society young man who takes to the land and farms in spite of the moans of his father and mother. The countryside gives him and he is happy in his life and finds what his feet have laid it built. It is a simple story of a simple life, with the necessary elements of romance and disappointment in it. The acting by Henry Kennedy is of the highest quality. The film is a masterpiece. Those who love the English country can not help up, providing the entire of a cloud freshly ploughed under a cloud swept sky; the village houses such as one found nowhere but in England, the hunting picture, and the village interiors. Revision of Rules Recommended.

STANDARD CONVENTION.
Eldoret, May 21.
On a discussion arising at the last meeting of the Eldoret Municipal Board, out of a letter from Mr. W. A. Shaw and a memorandum from the Town Clerk, both of which had been circulated, it was resolved to submit the following as recommendations for the revision of the Eldoret European Hospital Rules to the Committee of Management.

(a) That no alteration appear to be necessary or desirable regarding the method of appointing the Chairman and Members to the Committee of Management.

(b) That no alteration is necessary which makes it necessary for the Minutes of the Committee of Management Meetings to be circulated to the Local Authorities as in the opinion of the Board this Rule is unnecessary in view of the confidential nature of many matters which are dealt with by the Committee. It is recommended that the rule be altered in order to provide that copies of the Minutes of the Meetings of Management be circulated to the Local Authorities in so far as they concern finance only.

(c) That the rules require amendment in order that discretionary powers may be given to the Committee of Management regarding the reduction of fees in special or exceptional cases without reference to the Local Authorities.

Councillor Schrenkner stated that he had proposed to submit a further resolution upon this subject, but it was agreed that he would bring it into the matter with the Town Clerk and make his further recommendation direct to the Committee of Management.

The Chairman in conclusion proposed a very hearty vote of thanks to Mr. Shaw for the interest he had taken in the matter and for his services as Chairman of the Committee; the vote of thanks to also include the retiring Committee of Management.

ROADS AND WATER AT NAIVASHA

and new spraying are all in active operation, but as some of the tanks are in their third stage of development, the concentrated work will be required if control is to be established. Adequate supplies of poison and bait have been despatched to the Coast for distribution to the various centres. Very large numbers of bands have already been destroyed principally by beating. Labour is plentiful and working under direct supervision. Considerable quantities of poison will be used in selecting the method of distribution in various districts, the principle of spraying and the broadcasting of places where they were marked in native cattle and goats are practised. The epidemics in such districts have, however, been warned that unless beating is carried out thoroughly and systematically, no other method will have to be resorted to. In other districts, such as on the coast, spraying is not feasible, and here beating only is employed.

Though on the whole no extensive damage to crops is reported, some of the districts have been received from Mudi—rather heavily at Mt. Kenia and Mt. Meru; that crops have suffered from the frost and starve species ("kuzi" and "dings") are taking heavy toll of hoppers in the high country, with the use of seration, though spread over an extensive area, is not regarded as serious.

Where there is plenty of sweetgum, the hoppers appear to prefer this food to cecropia in most of the affected districts there is now no lack of green grass.

From the Kilifi district very heavy infestations are reported from the Bahi, Rumani and Ghama forests. Energetic measures have been adopted by the local administrative officer who has organized a well equipped force over an extensive area, and the work is progressing satisfactorily, enormous numbers of hoppers having already been destroyed. Owing to the heavy and continuous rains it has been found possible to conduct any beating operations in this district, but the method will be employed as soon as weather permits.

Disturbance is in progress for the first time in the Mandari and Kipta areas, where large numbers of natives are employed on the work.

Machakos-Mandi Area.
It has been found necessary to support the local beat-off force with the work in this area, and a sweeping campaign over the whole district from Machakos to Kibwezi and down to the Cheyvi Hills is being conducted. The officer operating in the Mthini-Mukaa-Nandi triangle reports that, apart from fresh hatchlings still in progress, all the original hopper bands have been wiped out and there are now present only the most recent hatchlings, which are being dealt with. Excellent results are being achieved by means of poison bait under the direct supervision of the Chiefs concerned, but beating is still very defective in districts where it is practised. Heavy rains are definitely becoming frequent, so that it is hoped that hatchlings will be completely wiped out.

for the defence said that she knew nothing about the agreement.

Acted as Agent. In his judgment which was given on May 18, 1934, His Honour said that he thought it certain that Mrs. Tronck and Mrs. Manley knew nothing about the agreement which had been entered into by them on behalf of Potts, and Potts specifically authorized them to enter into that agreement. He, however, held that there was a partnership as the relevant facts showed. Potts and the other defendants, that on a farming partnership the power to borrow from time to time is essential, the business cannot be carried on without such power and, therefore, there was an undoubted implied authority for Potts to borrow for the purposes of the business; and that Potts acted as the agent for the partners and he authorized all the members of the partnership.
