The post solution failed, but even so, Kenya, it is completely inflexible and, in fairness to that noble department, to eliminate the full-time ability of your post-boy! Under the circumstances your claim will be allowed and the copy of your original letter accepted, under the power we have thoughtfully conferred upon ourselves in rule No. 8.

**Hamann:** Your solution to "B" and "C" arrived by the same post, so you are "all right as yet." Full consideration is given to long-distance solvers in this postal department, but it would be wise to keep copies of all letters. We published the rules in our issue of 19th April.

**F.L.V.:** Pray continue the "chatty" remarks; they are particularly interesting when accompanying an alleged solution. It turns out incorrect, and will induce perhaps some of the shy modesty to blossom forth to our pleasure, so be it spoken. "We are not here that you should here repent you" but any repentence which arrive within the time limit are valid. So it the kind denotation of 'B', which will be noted in our next list.

1. 2-6. All others are spurious, and their members will be furious. We hope this article the curious and will rejoice the halcyons: "T. Tell a good key" as they say in the West Country.

**Remarks of "G".**  
This problem, No. 1546, was as follows:

**Black Five.**

**White Eight.**  
White mates in two moves.  
The Key is 1. Qx5!  
If P x Q; 2. K1-6 is mate. If K x K1 or K1-5; 2. B-5! If KxN moves; 3. K1-2! and if K1x2-3. 4. R or x P! 2. Q-4!  
It is a very nicely constructed Queen sacrifice waiting-move problem by Mr. Meredith, 4 points.

It is full of very neat tries, the best of which is perhaps 1. Qx5 which caught our old friend "F.L.V." Most of the neat variations come into this, and it is beaten only by K x R, 22 being unguarded. 1. Q-5 is beaten by 1. B-7, "an problem-like," and only just beaten by the cunning move K1-7! Most of those took their toll. E. Sumde first sent 1. Q-5, then "No Solution Possible," and finally the key. J. Karpass claimed 1. K-6, for which the normal defence 1. K1 x P1 is necessary and sufficient.

**Solvers' Comments.**  
A. Malik: An excellent two-mover. The idea of sacrificing the Queen, who seems more effective where she is, does not appeal to me, and is only tried in despair when all other attempts fail. The Queen's forsaking of her Knight introduces a very interesting position, for when Black King takes him, the Black Knight who was so troublesome, becomes cleverly pinned.

"F.L.V." (a casualty): There are several alternative tries which look sound at first, but when in doubt sacrifice the Queen. A clever little problem.

(Very clever, see above, and when sacrificing, it is better to try it on the right square. Ch. Ed.)

E. Sumde: Surely this is a masterpiece in two-movers. (It is the best of its kind that I know in the waiting-move class. "G" will probably please you too. Ch. Ed.)

Society) and Mrs. Cowling, Commandant (Mrs. Frenkel), and the Hon. J. H. Wright (Member of the Council for the Absearab). In opening the proceedings, Mr. Pratt said that he had been asked to read out a message from the President of the Royal Society of S. George, and they called upon the various scholars who had been awarded the absearab prizes by the local branch, to recite the passages selected. The following were the winners: Juniors (Girls), Jean Watson; Juniors (Boys), Collins; Seniors (Girls), Phyllis Broadhead; Seniors (Boys), Turner. Special prizes were also given by Commander Ward, F.R.S.

Mr. Scott, at the invitation of the Headmaster, headed to the winners the prizes stamped with the arms of the St. George's Society. All the companies present then sang 'Land of Our Fathers,' while Mrs. Cowling accompanied on the piano. Commander Ward next addressed the children on the meaning of Empire Day, and the significance of Empire Day. His remarks were listened to with rapt attention by his audience.

Then followed the singing of Rippling's 'Recessional.' Following a brief speech by Mr. Pratt, the pupils of the school sang 'The Children's Hymn,' which was followed by the National Anthem. A few days ago one of our leading politicians in England said that he closed a brief but impressive speech of the present day were in danger of forgetting all about the Great War and merely regarded it as another chapter in their history books which they had to study. So long as our children in Kenya keep up the practice of observing Empire Day, as on this occasion, there is little chance of our own boys and girls forgetting the sacrifice which was made to preserve the Empire by their fathers and grandfathers before them, nor the ideals and principles which they thought and died.

INDIAN SECONDARY SCHOOL.

At the Indian Secondary School, Empire Day was observed with full spirit and enthusiasm in the presence of a large attendance of the pupils. The school was drawn up on three sides of a hollow square about the flagstaff. On the arrival of the Director of Education, the Scout Troop, and the band, the ceremony of hoisting the flag of the British Empire was completed. The band played the National Anthem

and the whole School fled into the assembly hall. The Principal, Mr. J. H. Maxwell, read the Empire Day message from Lord Jellicoe and Mr. Scott addressed the pupils.

In the course of his remarks the Director reminded the boys and girls that whether they were born in India or Kenya they were all citizens of the British Empire. Hence he asked them to think of what the British Empire meant for them. 'It stands for you, not as a foreign Empire but as an Empire in which you were born and of which the King of England is the King Emperor. I would ask you today not to think of it as something strong and roaring power, but as something which, if it has any meaning at all, tries to improve the conditions and tries to improve the conditions of the many millions who are the citizens of the Empire. If you think of the Empire in this way you yourselves will perhaps understand that it will help you as with every other citizen of the Empire to improve conditions under which we all live.'

Mr. Scott hoped that the spirit of comradeship evidenced in the past years would grow stronger and stronger, his hopes could do much to fortify and strengthen that spirit. At the conclusion of the address the Principal returned the ceremonial thanks of the School to Mr. Scott, and three rousing cheers for the Director brought to a close a brief but impressive session.

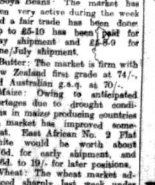

**FILM CENSORSHIP.**

*To the Editor, "E.A. Standard."*  
 Sir—With reference to your leading article of yesterday on Film Censorship, I am so pleased to agree with you when you say that the Asians have no reasonable grounds for objection if in the public interest they are occasionally prevented from seeing cinema entertainments not made for them in the first instance. I contend that they will, as you do, be able to see other grounds for objection if your suggestions were adopted. In this I believe I am voicing the general opinion of the Asians here.

A most lucrative market like that of India is not lost sight of and is not ignored by the producers of films either in Hollywood, Europe or elsewhere when a film is made. They realize perfectly well that to a considerable extent in each and every screen entertainment they provide they have to cater for the large Indian audience with its varying standards of life and thought.

As far as my knowledge goes, a single instance can be quoted where a picture has been banned to the Indian masses as a whole in India (including all the States and Jammu and Kashmir) and the Weylers some) which is shown, exclusively to the Europeans. And I trust you will agree, Sir, that the public interest and other factors which are not to be lost sight of in the censoring of films there do not in any degree, vary from those of Kenya at least as far as the European and Asian communities are concerned.

 Sir—This is not in any way a manifesto on my part for any one side, but deals with an important portion of the future Town Planning of Nairobi and must be outlined definitely in the next few months. This will be done if the election in the forthcoming election in June vote and elect out of the numerous men or women who have foregone and think of the future, instead of being too busy with the present temporary depression.

A short retrospect of the past history of the case might be of interest to those who have the Town's future at heart. In the early days, Government sought Mr. A. M. As time went on, there arose a question as to whether the Government had given the plot to Mr. Jevanjee or not. This was settled later by a bargain between the two and the Municipality, which was then becoming rather insistent on the interest of the Government.

Anyhow, Mr. Jevanjee agreed to give up any rights in the land where the Court is at present, with the addition of the Government Market lands, and all erections built on the two plots, for a compensation in cash and land in another position in exchange. This was on the Council at the time and I feel sure that in the case of the Court House site, Mr. Jevanjee agreed to the exchange on the full understanding that this site be left off for the general benefit and health of all concerned. This was done entirely at my own initiative.

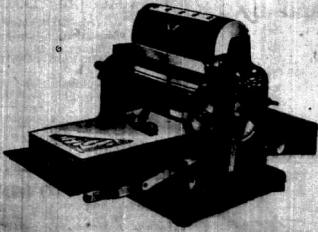

### Tonight's Film.

#### Empire Theatre.

"The Road to Paradise" is the story of the strange likeness between a society girl and an orphan who has been brought up by two crooks and is forced to become slightly crooked herself in order to keep up with them. The orphan, who is Lovetta Young, decides to break into the city mansion of the society girl (who is also Lovetta Young), and through impersonating her to remove a few of her poisonous jewels. The setting is clever in the sense in which both the women appear at the same time and occasion when the orphan child becomes involved with the young men of the society young woman. The burglars plan goes wrong and a mistaken bullet is fired at the society Lovetta when she arrives home from her party to find her double doing a little quiet accomplice work for the two crooks who have climbed up the drain pipe. Playing opposite Lovetta Young are Jack Mitchell and Raymond Hatton, while Kathleen Williams gives an amusing presentation of a neurotic woman who faints and has "attacks" at quite the wrong moment. "The Road to Paradise" is a neat melodrama that grows more crooked and well-told and more dramatic as the story proceeds.

#### Capital Theatre.

"The Finger Points" shows that a young man on the staff of an American newspaper can't be too careful. He isn't, with the result that in search of copy he finds gangsters, and they snuff him. He meets Maxima, a fair young journalist who is kind to him when he is new in the office. She finds out that he has become involved with gangs and holds ups and is unable to run straight through fear of the crooks, but she loves him and decides to run away with him to safety. There comes a drawback to this when she is in for her and the unfortunate younger man is set "on the spot." The film ends with Maxima, with another faithful young man, watching the funeral cortege as it winds down the street. Although he thought a reporter had nine lives as far as gangsters were concerned, Richard Barthelmess made one mistake more than he catered for. The story moves fast, and as a gangster hard-boiled drama it is entertaining. Among the cast are Fay Wray, Clark Gable (as the gang leader, of course), and Robert Elliott. The Empire pointed, but the story went through and the reporter went fast!

**Pity the Poor.**  
 THE Censor Board of Kenya has been rather more in the limelight again than many of the recent films. At Mombasa, an attempt has been made to meet the various shades of opinion by the new certificate which has been issued. The old one permitted exhibitions of films to (a) Europeans and Indians only or (b) all classes of the community, this to include all premises of whatever denomination, with the proviso that premises should not be permitted to use (a) category films. It was pointed out to the "East African Standard" that an authority existed under the Ordinance for any of these differences, hence the new one has been issued, it is keeping with the law on the subject. A film concerned in passed (1) for general exhibition, (2) for exhibition subject to the following conditions: "not to be shown to Africans." with the provision regarding "The film is not considered suitable for exhibition to children under 16 and the fact should be advertised by the exhibitor." The Board of course always retains the right to refuse a certificate at all.

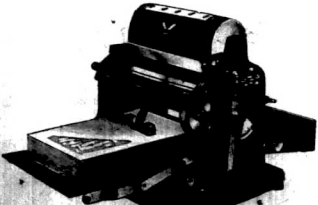

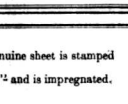

legal restriction, and it is a necessary consequence of those considerations that a measure which aims at preserving the beneficial use of the land to the natives must include regulations for handling it.

The Board.

In the Commission's determination the results which have emerged from the failure to observe the directions of the provision requiring all matters relating to management and development to be dealt with by the Lands Trust Board they are afforded by the Commission.

The clause implies a state condition in which the initiation of development lies with the Lands Trust Board, which takes the advice of the Local Board, and, finally, authorities considered to do something so that the reserve may be developed. We prefer to think of a dynamic condition in which native and settler are the principal developing agents by utilizing their own capital and their own land pursuant to their lawful concerns, the Lands Trust Board being only concerned in a protective capacity. Advice or regulation required for helping or assisting to develop their land would should be the settler's concern. However, that the Lands Trust Board should make representations, if it considers that their consent is neglecting its duty of constant reference of petty matters to the Lands Trust Board with the triple disadvantage that it distracts the attention of the Board from more serious matters, holds up legitimate development, and introduces a clogging paraphrase into the power, and ultimately, the will of the Government to govern.

### MOTING TRAGEDY.

Father and Son Killed in Tanganyika.

(By BEATRICE D. CORCORAN.)

Arusha.

On Tuesday last Mr. E. L. Lantz, farmer of Oldonyo Sambu was motoring back to his home at night. He had as passenger his own small son, Mrs. J. J. Bekker and three children. **THE COURT HOUSE SQUARE.**  
 To the Editor, "E.A. Standard."  
 Sir—I have read with much interest the letter of my friend Mr. H. E. Henderson appearing in Saturday's issue of your paper and I am afraid I must disagree with portions of his summing up of the general feeling in the Municipal Council with regard to the Court Square.

Mr. Henderson says there are three suggestions which are, briefly—  
 1. To leave the plot as an open space and shield the back of Victoria Street with a wall.  
 2. Or to allow one building of monumental character.  
 3. Or to commit the ownership of allowing a few shops on the Government Road fronted by the few docks at the end of Victoria Street divided by the main boundary lane, etc., etc.

I quite agree that suggestion No. 1 would be an enormity had it ever been contemplated by any member of the Council. My whole training and experience has been in the direction of crystallizing the general discussions and expressions of opinion which take place at meetings and I can say before hand of suggestion No. 3 that I have never witnessed any such idea in the air at any of the discussions at which I have been present.

With regard to No. 1, I rather gathered the supporters of this scheme favoured a sort of pocket park but definitely not as a screen to Victoria Street. I don't think a picture had been painted of harassed and work-worn business men, gasping for air and tettering out of their offices in order to feast their eyes for a few minutes on the trees and green grass.

But why this inordinate envy, this Nehemian sensibility, this fondness for green grass in this particular spot, when they will have the whole of the air and grass in Sixth Avenue to choose from? Incidentally Sixth Avenue is an area about thirty times the size of the suggested Lilliputian Park.

No. 2 suggestion, I have all along favoured this with the proviso that having regard to the existing depression we should not in too great a hurry to sell the site in any case it appears as though over twelve months must elapse before we can obtain occupation.

Suggestion No. 3, quoted by Henderson I read and noted briefly, but there are two other suggestions in the air which Mr. Henderson has not mentioned. (a) That the area in question should be used as a car park, but less valuable sites must be found for the future parking requirements of the town.

(b) That this site should be used for traffic purposes and that Sixth Avenue should be driven through to connect ultimately with the route to Matigaga. But quite apart from the question of the route to Matigaga, it would argue along the route of the direct continuation of Sixth Avenue (which reference to the Map of Nairobi will make very apparent) surely such a scheme would be the creation of a "spokeway" right through the heart of the town, and the present day tendency is to avoid anything of such a nature. The formation of "islands" at all connecting points in order to slow down the traffic.

How better could the traffic be slowed down at this point than by adopting suggestion No. 2, namely by the erection of a building which would be a credit to the town and would form a pleasing focusing point for the eyes of anyone looking down Sixth Avenue from the railway crossing end.

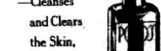

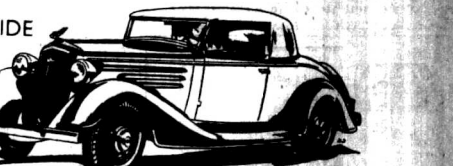

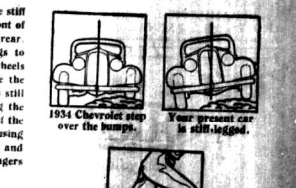

appeared to come from one very small deposit and there was no stratigraphical confirmation of this, that is, the earlier forms of striae tanks in a lower deposit with the more developed forms in an upper one.

Digging during February last carried the excavation further back into the gently sloping bank and yielded the stratigraphical evidence, the lack of which was so confusing. That which appeared to be one bed now being at the foot of the gentle slope having deposited the fossils in what appeared to be the weathered and the unweathered sections of the one bed.

**Three Beds.**

Bed 1, the bottom bed, consists of about 4 feet (this varies in places) of greenish sand, pure pebbles. This green sand gradually becomes white on exposure. Bed 2, the greatest depth exposed being four feet. It is very earthy and carries no fossils, except just where it makes contact with the beds below and above. It is bed No. 2, 18 inches deep of greenish color, speckled with black, composed of a sandy loam thickly studded with water-worn pebbles, from the size of a pea to three inches long. All the pebbles are nearly the same color, black in color, the coloring matter also staining the very hard, almost black, sandstone. From this bed, No. 3, came new types of teeth and found in bed 1, a complete second molar with three ridges and a fourth ridge in process of development, and portion of a third molar showing a marked advance in the sub-division of the cusps, also some teeth similar to those found in bed 1. Makoko Island thus furnishes most important evidence, not only of the distribution of some
