tion is that those works do not in any way alter the true nature of the transaction. Why, if the world should suddenly give to the Duke of Atholl some shares to be distributed among charities at all?

"It Seems Odd."

"So far as I know the Duke's name has never previously been associated with any large distribution of public funds for charity."

"Further, even odd that this should benefit a person who, according to his own evidence, is unable to tell of what he is going to do with the money."

"The grounds of the objection is that the works were a mere sham, one of the devices which the Duke thought would enable him to escape the provisions of the law."

I am considering whether to purchase an animal for a week here he could have said, 'No, I am not going to give you £100 and you £200, and that would have been an absolute gratification and nobody from that would have broken his bargain.'

"No Promise."

"You cannot make a lottery by retrospective action. The prosecution has to prove that the Duke was aware of this case to infringe the Letters Act in the time when the man paid his 10s. He was a witness in the subsequent distribution."

The University of Sydney has recently adopted precisely similar provisions.

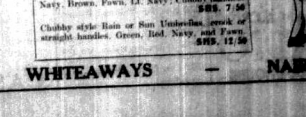

gain of strychnine were placed in a glass of cold water & would remain practically insoluble. It would sink to the bottom of the glass and would remain insoluble for many hours. The water in the glass would be harmful, but would taste bitter—assuming that the water had been allowed. In reply to another question, he said that if strychnine was mixed with "pain killer," water with water, the taste of strychnine would probably be detected.

Mr. Kaplan. The evidence shows that a glass of cold clear water was placed beside the prisoner's bed. He himself took a drink from a tin, instead, it with water, took a drink, and ten fifteen minutes afterwards showed signs of strychnine poisoning. Can you say there was strychnine in the water or in the room? It is very rare here to find strychnine in the room; is it not? I cannot say.

Replying to further questions, Mr. Fox said that the probability was that a glass of cold water was found by him in the portions of organs he examined, the evidence being that the water was from a bottle of Phosphorus, he explained to be obtained from a medical and from certain red pills. The powder therein retained 23 per cent.

It might be used as a filling for a bullet.

The Cat Again.

Mr. Fox had died from strychnine poisoning, Mr. Fox be- lieves to find strychnine in the water of the cat afterwards. If strychnine had been placed in a tin, it would be expected to find some traces of it even days afterwards.

The Judge. Is it your professional opinion that that cat was not a strychnine poisoning you are talking about?

It is possible that the cat was given strychnine and that strychnine would be found. Cases have been known where strychnine known to have been administered with fatal result, but not been found subsequently on the cat.

A Demonstration.

At the request of the Judge, Mr. Fox put roughly a quarter of an ounce of strychnine into a glass of water. In another glass he put a quarter of an ounce of strychnine and a quantity of coffee in water.

It was clear, the Judge then inquired if the coffee and strychnine mixture the strychnine was invisible to the naked eye.

The two glasses were passed to the jury for examination.

He examined the witness said the strychnine was not visible. Mr. Fox had purchased only a small quantity of powder.

Replying to the Judge, the witness said there were cases on record where strychnine had been found in a body a year after it had been taken.

At the request of the jury Mr. Fox then mixed powdered strychnine to the extent of seven the fatal dose with a small quantity of powder.

He then mixed a teaspoonful of strychnine with a full dose of coffee in water.

At the request of the defence, the Analyst made up a full dose of strychnine into a glass of coffee.

Fatal Doses.

Dr. H. D. Tomkins, Assistant District Surgeon, said there were a lot of records on record. He gave evidence regarding the strychnine poisoning of the prisoner. He had been heard the accounts by witnesses of the late Mrs. Prinloo's case, and he had no doubt that the symptoms were those of strychnine poisoning. There he discussed the poison itself.

The accepted fatal dose of strychnine alcohol was, he said 1 to 180 grains. That was a very small dose, and cases where less than half a grain had proved fatal. The Judge explained that the fatal dose of strychnine was the normal time taken for assimilation. It was a very small time from the taking of the dose to the first exhibition of symptoms. If after the first symptoms death did not occur within two hours, recovery was almost certain. The person was not comatose in its effects. The accused found in the organs suggested that was a very probable case than that there were some cases where strychnine was taken, although it was known to be taken, but not assimilated.

The Symptoms.

Mr. Prinloo's symptoms on the Saturday night continued. He took some strychnine with some coffee from a small tin of strychnine. The symptoms were those of strychnine poisoning. He had also carried out experiments with strychnine, coffee and water similar to those made before the jury.

On Saturday night Tomkins said he had only seen one case of strychnine poisoning, which was the case of Mrs. Prinloo had completely recovered from the strychnine poisoning on the Saturday night.

A Jury Test.

The Judge at this point tested the "Pain killer" himself and pulled a very strong face.

Witnesses at the Judge's request mixed a dose of the "Pain killer" with water and then introduced a fatal dose of strychnine. When water was added the mixture became milky in appearance. The strychnine was then added without noticeable change.

When the exhibit was passed to the jury His Honor said he did not know whether any jury man would care to taste the "Pain killer."

Dr. Tomkins hurriedly interposed. You had better warn your Honor not to taste that mixture, he said with some agitation.

A Distinguishing Feature.

Mr. Prinloo the eleven years' old son of the accused was the last Crown witness. He was not sworn. As soon as he was called the witness appeared to be weeping. He said he remembered returning with his mother to his parents' home about midday the day the murder was committed. He was a list of records present. Mr. and Mrs. Dr. Tomkins were the last to be heard. At that time he was in his mother's bedroom. His father, James, was a small, stout, and a younger sister were also there. No food nor water was brought into the room on the night.

A candle was burning in the bedroom. The child and Mrs. Prinloo were in the room. He remembered a glass of water being brought to his mother. He did not know who brought it. Asked to think again, he said he remembered that he himself took the water in. That was before the 10th came. He took the water from a bucket in the kitchen. His mother mixed coffee with the water and drank it. He did not know whether she drank it after drinking it. He remembered the glass to the kitchen and he and she washed it. They put the tin of coffee flour into the cupboard. This concluded the evidence for the Crown.

"I Am Not Guilty."

Crown Counsel said in the lower court passed had said: "I was called to the Crown because I am here as not guilty. That is all I have to say."

He also did that it was not reasonable. Things about which no evidence had been presented. Moreover, the solely evidence did this thing, he said, the strychnine, supposing she had wished to commit suicide, if the tin of the poison had been found in the house after her death.

An Accident?

Dealing with the question of accident, Crown said there was no likelihood at all that she would have received it accidentally. Kenya's Crops for the Forthcoming Season.

ESTIMATES OF SURPLUSES FOR EXPORT.

Increase in Wheat Acreage.

OUTPUT OF MAIZE EXPECTED TO BE OVER A MILLION BAGS.

Estimates of the surplus crops for export during the crop ending July 31, 1954 are included in the crop report issued by the Kenya Department of Agriculture for the month of October.

The estimated maize yield is stated to be 1,051,200 bags from 133,400 acres. The acreage planted is a slight decrease on that of last year. Conditions are generally very favourable but much depends on the weather during the next few weeks.

A brighter outlook is indicated for wheat. As many as 39,210 acres have been planted as compared with 30,114 last year, while the yield per acre is expected to improve. The Colony's production is estimated at 4,000 bags, which is a slight surplus above local mill requirements.

In regard to coffee, an estimated acreage of 102,695 is expected to yield 1,000,000 cwt. It is pointed out, however, that a very substantial amount is of poor quality and may not be worth shipping to London.

Poor Quality Coffee.

The crop report for the month of October is based upon a final number of returns from the Agricultural Department for the first time. Estimates of the surplus of coffee are available for export during the next few weeks.

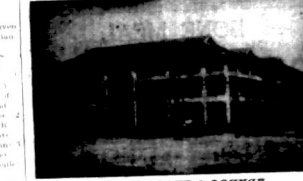
