DANISH HATRED OF NAZIS

What is Meant By "Protection"

A remarkable admission of the truthing with which the Germans are regarded by the Danes is made in the German-controlled paper, "The Evening Telegram" of Aarhus.

Under the heading, "Blind Hatred of the German People," the paper writes: "Blind hatred of Germany's people and the German troops of occupation prevail in the leading political, commercial and military circles in Denmark. Danish National Societies are being persecuted, boycotted and unjustly treated; several cases of molestation and penalization by the soldiers are known."

Among the population of Copenhagen, dreadfulness against Hitler and the German troops prevail. It is heard in private conversations, in the Danish streets when a German soldier passes, the Nazi Nationalist declares: "The Danes, filled with blind hate, are unable to suppress their feelings," the paper adds, "and they will not be suppressed. The German soldier, the Nazi Nationalist, the German troops, the Danes stand by the Danes from the grins of those present that it is incomprehensible."

Everywhere the Danes circulate the craze and most of the Danish stories about Hitler, the German people and the troops of occupation. It is impossible to relate the fear of conflict with the law what these circles talk regarding the private lives of Hitler, Goebbels, Goering, the storm-troopers and others."

It continues: "It is impossible to describe the desperate Danes hate everything German, what is the Danes' attitude to the Danes? Cannot the Danes express their gratitude that protection of the country has been undertaken by such a powerful military force, which has saved the other European countries. That would be the Danes' attitude."

The paper adds, "The words in these circles a dark day open every Danish meeting. This is a response to German propaganda. It will be recalled that without any justification, Germany, which had an eternal part of non-aggression with Denmark, marched into the country declaring that the Reich was the Danes' enemy. Since then the country has been aghastly troubled of all its foodstuffs and cattle."

Propaganda Lies Rebound

It is one of the favourite tricks of Italian and German wireless propaganda to state on programmes directed towards certain sections of the population, items of supposed news which they know some particular listeners cannot verify. A typical example of this was the Italian wireless news of January 12 which said:

"It is reported from Baghdad that the recent speech made by King Ibn Saud has caused the greater number of Arab nations in the Arab world. Arab circles see in the King's speech a prelude to decisive action against England. The British Minister in Baghdad, Mr. Jeddah was called to this and he is believed to have said, 'In common with all Italian broadcasts, this one is a lie and need not be believed by any Arab.'"

As in the case of the Italian announcement of the King's speech, which might have been believed by people not living here, but was known to be a lie by people who do so, so this latest example of wireless propaganda is proved to be a lie by the people on the spot.

Submarine Successes

The latest Mediterranean losses of which official news is received are the submarine U-100, which was sunk in the Atlantic on Monday, March 2, and U-101, which was sunk on Tuesday, March 3, and U-102, which was sunk on Wednesday, March 4. The last two submarines are not listed. The U-100 and U-101 were both sunk by the British submarine HMS Triton.

Doctors Post-War Plans

It is announced that a doctors' parliament has been set up by the British Medical Association to study war-time developments and their effects on post-war medical services. The Medical Planning Commission it is to be called, and it will consist of sixty-eight doctors, representing all branches of medicine under the presidency of Colonel Thomas Fraser, consulting physician to the Royal Infirmary, Glasgow.

War Risks Insurance: Questions in Commons

A question was asked in the House of Commons on War Risks Insurance for Empire countries. The question and the reply are given below.

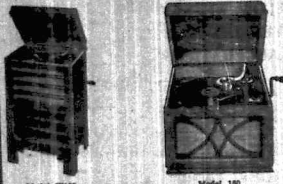

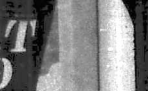

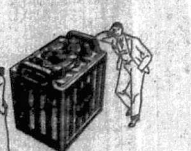

Disclosures of Enquiry into Death of Lord Erroll

the licence holder. The speedometer showed 171 1/2 miles; the highest was read, the handmarker off. One rear window was slightly open and both front windows were full open. Witnesses given descriptions of damage to the car, which was inclined to fly offside about 40 degrees.

In the front portion of the vehicle was a small body in the shape of a capsule; it was crumpled down in a kneeling position. The head was bent and resting on the floor. The hands and face were dead and the body slightly more than 90 degrees and hat was in the front of the car.

Gold Needle Disc
After some discussion, Dr. Timms, who had arrived, suggested removing the body, but without objecting thought it was sufficiently removed. They had difficulty in getting it out of the car; the time came off and he had to inspect it. A gold needle disc was given to the Commissioner of Police. It was a road measurement and made rough sketch from which next day he drew a scale plan of the scene. Inspector Lushan, who was present, including those the body before its removal from the car. The body was taken to the mortuary about 8-9 a.m. A breakdown unit removed the car to the Motor Mart and Exchange, where it was continuously repaired.

White on guard witness saw in the car what appeared to be a open but to understand the accelerator pedal. He left it there; the car was towed to Police Headquarters and the key handed to the Superintendent, Poppy.

A Statement
On January 24, before the car was taken to Nairobi, witness saw Sir Deves Broughton, his house and took a statement from him.

At this stage Mr. Captain estimated that he understood that certain statements were made by witnesses under promise that they would not be made public.

Inspector Lushan had written to the Magistrate this. It was recorded on the Friday morning, long before Lord Erroll had written to the Magistrate with this.

Wireless Reception: an Appeal
The Postmaster General invites all listeners, who are receiving sets which have "reaction" or "feedback" in the elimination of the serious interference with neighbouring stations which the excessive use of reaction causes.

When reception by means of such sets is so bad that the use of a large amount of "reaction" seems necessary, listeners should, in the interests of their neighbours, use this "reaction" control with the greatest care. It should be remembered that when a set is "howling" it spreads a broadcast only five feet in range but also for all other listeners, within a considerable distance, who are tuned to the same frequency.

Such interference is at the moment general and widespread in Nairobi and in other districts, and is actually a contravention of the second of the Principal Conditions and Regulations which govern the use of a Receiver, Loudspeaker, and which are set out clearly on the back of every Brooking Licence form.

Complaints of such interference received by the Postmaster are numerous and all listeners who are capable of causing this type of interference are asked to co-operate during this time of stress, in easing the task of the Post Office staff. At the same time they earn the gratitude of their fellow listeners by clearing the ether of this interference.

Missing Pound Notes
Highlighted to Mr. Shapley with regard to the alleged theft from Sir Deves Broughton's house, Inspector Purton said the loss was also reported of two English £1 notes which had been placed in a book on the table. One of the boys at the house said he had found a window open, but when another boy was questioned he referred to another window having been open.

Captain first put questions about the finding of the body. The inspector replied that one of the photographs showed the body as it was actually found. It took three people to lift the body on to the seat of the car.

With regard to the alleged theft from the house, it was possible that one of the windows could have been opened from the outside. The windows were about 4 ft. to 4 ft. 6 in. from the ground. He did not examine a dispatch case which was found for fingerprints as it was not the experience that such articles would show fingerprints.

In answer to the witness' question, Sir Deves offered no explanation. He said he had no knowledge of the £1 notes in a book in his house. When he saw Sir Deves on the day Lord Erroll was found dead there was no conversation about the loss he had previously reported.

STAFF SHORTAGE IMPEDES PROGRESS

AMERICAN AID FOR BRITAIN

Isolationists Still Oppose Lease & Lend

WHEN the monthly meeting of the Nairobi Municipal Council opened on Tuesday, Councillor A. Tyson referred to a report on the Public Health Department dealing with public health matters which had been considered at a private meeting, the gist of which was that the Council had made a little investigation before the arrival of the Medical Officer. It was pointed out that the debate took place in an unfortunate manner and that an approach was not first made to find out the reasons.

Councillor D. Newmark, who pointed out that he had left the United States tomorrow or Friday to take up his new post as Ambassador to Britain. He will travel by the ship from New York to America via the Pan-American Air Service. President Roosevelt has been known to have had no knowledge of the suggestion that Mr. Wilson was to be taken to Britain since the fact of his going was not known to the public. The President added that his own view was that the first job was to get the war started.

All Aid to Britain
President Roosevelt was also asked about the amendments to the Lend-Lease Bill which had been forwarded the United States Congress outside the British Empire. The President said in answer to the question that he would alter the policy of the Government of all points of view.

When the debate continued yesterday in the Senate the attendance was only 25 Senators. It was a sign that Senators are getting weary of the protracted discussion of the Bill carried by the House of Representatives. The argument that it would not be passed was already being made by supporters both at it is the most effective way to win the war.

Washington Report
A Washington report says that the Administration is uncertain as to whether to support the Bill which took this week.

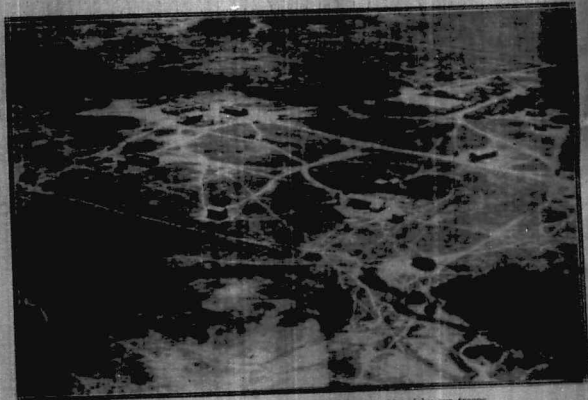

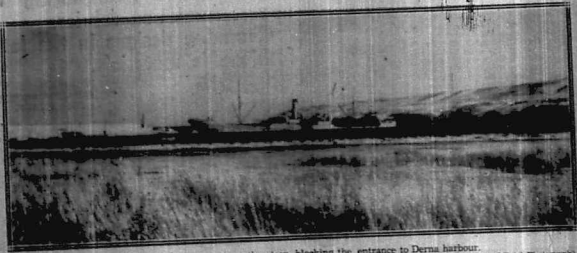

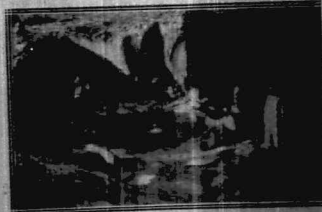

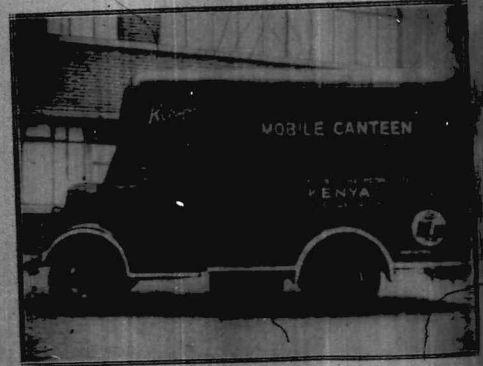
