THE DAWN OF KENYA'S GREAT DAY

68 years of British rule to end tonight

DO YOU LIKE IT? LET AN GIVE IT TO YOU

KENYA will become an independent nation at midnight tonight. Its black, red, green and white flag will be hoisted at the Uhuru Stadium in Nairobi seconds after the Union Jack has been lowered for the last time to mark the end of 68 years of British rule.

The Duke of Edinburgh, who will hand over the Constitutional Instruments of Independence to the Prime Minister, Mr. Kenyatta, in a further ceremony tomorrow, arrived at Nairobi Airport last night from Zanzibar.

The welcome given to the Duke (Report in Col. 3) signalled the start of the official programme of independence celebrations which will continue until Friday.

Weather raises hopes

Last night the Governor, Mr. MacDonnell, the Prime Minister, Mr. Kenyatta, and hundreds of State guests and Kenya celebrities attended the Civic Ball given by the Mayor of Nairobi, Aed Charles Robbs, at the City Hall.

Brighter weather yesterday raised hopes that tonight will be fine for the Uhuru ceremony. The official weather forecast for the day is that it will be cloudy at first, clearing later with scattered showers in the afternoon and evening.

Thousands, as more official guests poured into the capital, people of all races throughout Kenya prepared to celebrate Independence with programs of tribal dancing, parades, games and parties. Church services of dedication of the new Kenya are being held in many towns.

The Prime Minister led a questionnaire to ask the views of the people on the new Kenya. The results will be published in the next few days.

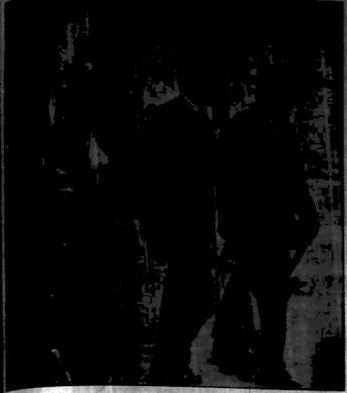

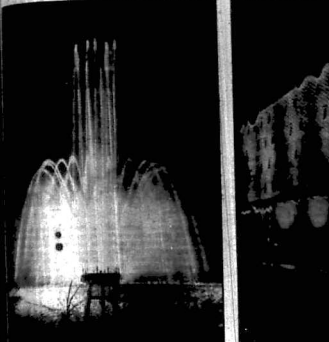

Jubilant crowds give welcome to Uhuru

KENYA IS INDEPENDENT. The new nation was born on the stroke of midnight last night amid scenes of great excitement at the Uhuru stadium, Nairobi, where it was estimated that 250,000 people had gathered.

The vast crowd, including many heads of State, Prime Ministers and other honored guests from 70 countries, watched the black, red and white flag of Kenya raised to the top of one of the twin 40ft. flagpoles as the accompaniment of the playing of the Kenya National Anthem.

Seconds earlier, the Union Jack which had been hoisted from the other flagpole until a minute before midnight, had been lowered as the stadium was played to signify the close of 45 years of colonial rule.

At the moment of Uhuru all eyes were on the Prime Minister, Mr. Kenyatta for whom this was the triumphant climax to a lifetime of struggle for his country's freedom.

First moments of freedom

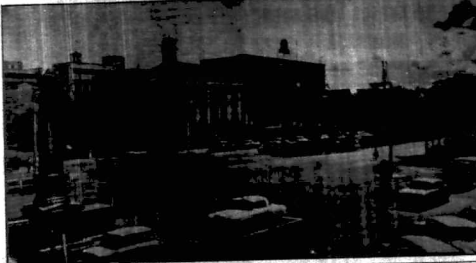

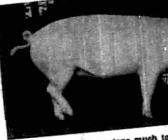

Tremendous growth of the health services

The Medical Department of the East African Provinces (as Kenya was then called) was set up in 1905 with a staff of 19 doctors, four assistant surgeons, eight nursing sisters and 24 compounders (figures available) in 1911 (the first year for which figures are available). The recurrent expenditure was £23,715.

The tremendous growth since then will be appreciated when it is recalled that the present staff numbers are 1,300, comprising 110 doctors and 1,190 other health workers. The recurrent expenditure is £2,621,100 or over 20 per cent every year for every man, woman and child in the country.

At the Medical Department headquarters in Nairobi, the staff is organized into 12 regional offices. Starting with training being handed over to the Government in 1963, the staff has grown to 1,300. The Medical Training Commission in Nairobi provides courses, laboratory facilities, radiography, pathology and other services. Government medical officers and other staff are distributed throughout the country in 12 regional offices and 120 sub-offices. HOUSING PROBLEM HAS TO BE FACED



At the last year and a half my Ministry has been responsible for housing. The building of housing in urban areas is a responsibility primarily of the Government, the Government being concerned with the policy of housing and the provision of housing for housing.

outlined way instead of each following their own road. Besides the Government, the community have contributed greatly to the health facilities in Kenya. All were built by community interests although all are now run on a multi-racial basis and are no longer restricted to members of the community concerned.

Major planning factors

All planning of the future medical services is dominated by two major factors: the first is the economy of the country and, secondly, the funds which will be available to the Government.

I need not enlarge upon the first factor, but I must just mention, concerning the second, that the present rate of expenditure on health services is a population burden of some 100 shillings per head. This is to say, the expenditure of an average rural man is about 10 shillings per head to give health services every year.

I have certain objectives which I think that we must aim at in any future planning of the medical services. These are: (1) To maintain the existing health services and to increase the health service coverage of the country. This objective, which is vital more than maintaining the status quo, requires the construction of 20 additional hospitals each year and 20 new health centres.

New types of training

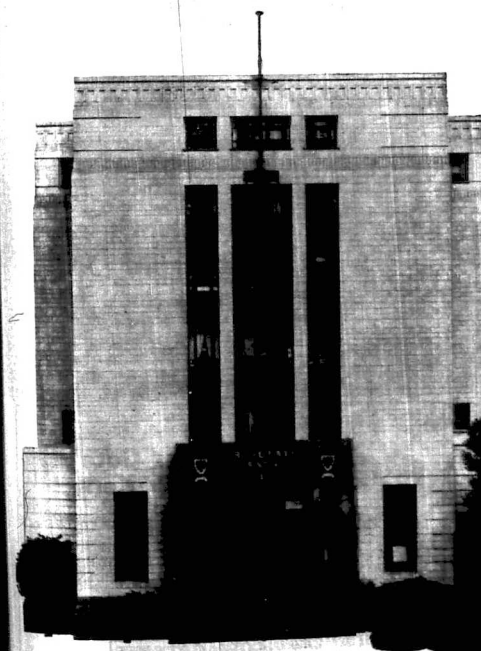

Tea pioneering started 40 years ago

ATTAINMENT of independence is a great day for Kenya and, in taking effect of its new position, it now has for tea in the tea industry, have come. The first area in which the commercial planting of tea was undertaken was in the Lamuria district. This was followed by other important invaders who having received favourable reports in regard to the suitability of growing of tea, bought out much of the ill-fated German-Officers Colony.

As far as the tea industry was concerned, the Government of Kenya took over the tea industry in 1963, when a group of representatives and members of the tea industry met to form an association. This was the Kenya Tea Growers' Association, which was formed to promote the interests of the tea industry in Kenya and to act as a direct channel of communication between the tea growers and the Government of Kenya. Today the tea industry in Kenya is a highly developed industry, and the tea industry is one of the main sources of foreign exchange for the country.

The first chairman of the association was Mr. Percy Mwangi, who was a prominent tea planter and one of the first tea growers in Kenya. He was succeeded by Mr. H. G. OUR HERITAGE IN AGRICULTURE

SIR MICHAEL BLUNDELL, who was formerly Minister of Agriculture and now farms at Subukia, recalls the struggle against pest and disease and writes of

THE development of the agricultural industry is at present undergoing a period of uncertainty and the steady progress which has been made since the end of the war in 1945 has been slowed down, or even in some cases halted. This is not the first time that this has happened.

Indeed, the history of farming on modern lines in Kenya is one of ups and downs, with each upward surge carrying the industry a little further forward and each recession falling back not quite as far as the one before.

Vain attempt

An attempt was made to establish an agricultural industry in East Africa, and at least in Nigeria, by the British and the Dutch. This failed and was later abandoned to the disappointment of those who had laboured and sweat around Elmina and Malacca. Much was the main error in the severe attitudes and the efforts to make the land fertile, but the experiments in agriculture in East Africa were not so successful as those in the West Indies and the Americas. In fact, the only crop which was raised in East Africa in 1902 was the groundnut.

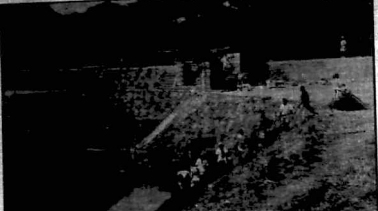
For instance, the high ground to the east of the Kilimanjaro in the Rift Valley district was dependent mainly on the banana plant, but the banana was not a very successful crop in the area. In 1914, a farming industry only in the Rift Valley had been discovered and brought to the first light of life.

After the First World War, a considerable agricultural industry around Nairobi developed ex-

Field research

First, a great programme of research was laid down by the departments in the Ministry of Agriculture on new methods, new ideas and new crops and their varieties were tried out over the country. Second, of field marketing and a balance agriculture were firmly sup-

ported by the Government of the day. Third, the introduction of large estates in the European areas and land consolidation in the African districts raised production by the greater input of man and his resources on individual acreage. And, fourth, there was confidence in the future among the farmers with the result that long-term planning and a flow of new money strengthened the whole basis upon which the agricultural industry was being expanded.

Confidence need

This cannot be too strongly emphasized — it is only when the farmer, large and small, black, white or brown, has the confidence to give ahead and nourish his soil, not for just a year, but for five years hence, that nature will reward him with full crops in return for his care and attention.

Before we leave this short sketch of the history of agriculture in Kenya, mention must be made of two other districts, tea and sisal, which were introduced in 1912 and 1913 respectively. Although a small acreage of tea had already been tried earlier in the Kericho district, the first large plantation was opened in 1918. With the soil protected by the growth of the tea plantation, some of the best husbandry skills were applied to the cultivation of the tea plant. The sisal industry was established in 1914, but the planting heralded the arrival of what will eventually become the greatest single contributor to the agricultural economy of Kenya.

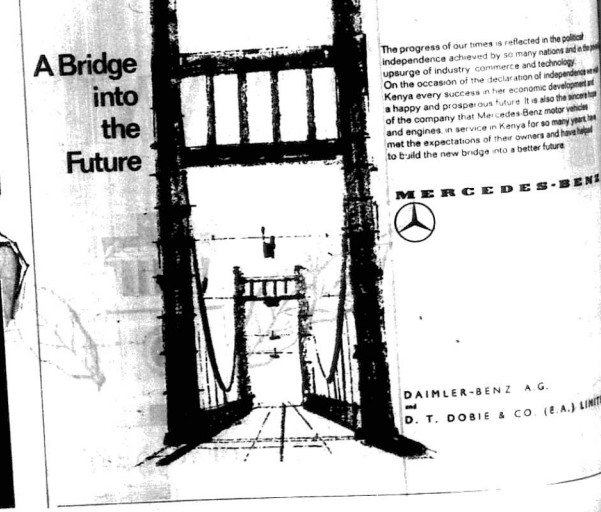

WE are told of Chinese records indicating that pyrethrum flowers were used as an insecticide 1800 years ago. Centuries later, in 1810, an extract was being prepared for use as an insecticide and by 1859 a process had been evolved by J. S. Gadenager of the United States which produced a highly concentrated standardized extract of pyrethrum of a uniform quality.

When Kenya farmers first began cultivating this larger crop in the early 1920s because a commodity market had collapsed and an alternative crop was essential if they were not, therefore, experimenting with its use as a natural material in pest control. Japan was already a major producer.

Between 1923 and 1928 Kenyan pyrethrum rose from 222 tons to 1,284 tons of dried flowers. The production was put in the Government by the Kenya Government.

Factory built
Fortunately, pyrethrum has shown rapid development—mainly due to technological advances which have reduced its cost and improved the methods of its application.

Until 1939 the commercial extraction of pyrethrum flowers was carried out overseas in America, India and Ceylon.
