Parliament hears outline of Government policy U.A. UNION KENYA'S FIRST AIM Step towards peace in the world

Parliamentary union with the neighbouring countries of Tanganyika, Uganda and Malawi is the immediate aim of the Kenya Government. This was disclosed in the Queen's speech read at the State opening yesterday of the first independent Parliament by Her Majesty's personal representative, the Duke of Edinburgh.

The Queen's message said that on the African Continent the Kenya Government would strive to achieve the unity of all African States, believing that African unity would contribute not only to world peace but also to the social advancement of the people of the continent.

The House of Representatives gave little of its non-alterable status all for the State opening. Almost every member of the Government and Opposition benches looked on chairs in the normal open space between the Bar and table bearing the state.

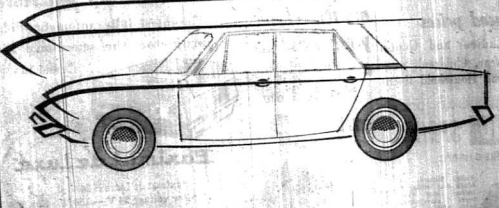

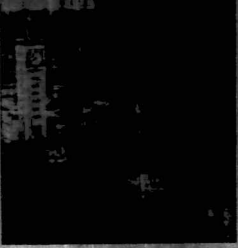

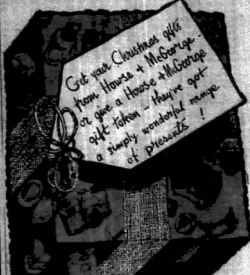

Russia's military budget

MOSCOW (AP)—Russia announced a 4.5 per cent cut in its 1964 military budget and larger increases in spending for health and education.

The Finance Minister, Mr. Vasily Smirnov, introducing this "bitter and dry" budget at a meeting of the Supreme Soviet said military expenditures would be down by about 2,940,000,000 in 1964 to about 23,720,000,000.

A year ago Russia increased military spending for 1963 by about 2,700,000,000. Western observers, such as Moscow said yesterday's reduction, whatever the figures mean in reality, was a sign of Soviet military expansion.

They also expressed an interest in the Soviet leadership, for the first time in the past 10 years, to meet large sums in spending commitments.

21 NAZIS ACCUSED OF MASS MURDERS

WEST Germany's highest court in Frankfurt yesterday found 21 men guilty of a mass catalogue of slaughter and murder during the Nazi era.

It started when it was found that 21 men were guilty of mass murder or complicity in Nazi extermination camps in Poland, Czechoslovakia and Yugoslavia. The names had been handed over to the court by the German government.

The accused include the SS and Gestapo leaders, including the former SS commander of the 'Einsatzgruppen' in Poland, who were accused of murdering thousands of Jews.

The court also found guilty several other men who were involved in the extermination camps, including those who were responsible for the transport of victims to the camps.

Many turned away from the court when they heard the names of the accused, but the court continued its proceedings.

More than 100 officials who were involved in the Nazi regime were named in the indictment, but only 21 were brought to trial.

Minister praises growth of tea industry

ANY economic indicators were pointing the way to Kenya's prosperity, the Minister for Finance, Mr. Gichuru, said at the annual directors' meeting of the East African Tea Traders' Association in Nairobi.

Those who wished to stay in the forefront of development should review their private development schemes, to bring more income to Kenya and the country, and to relieve unemployment.

It was impressed by the growth of the Kenya tea industry, which had almost tripled in 10 years while the quality had been maintained, if not improved. He had favoured the tea "top of the pop" — coffee. In 1932 it accounted for 21 per cent of the total value of exports with tea at 15.6 per cent; at the end of 1945 it comprised 47 per cent with tea at 47 and 14 per cent.

MONEY LIMITING FACTOR

Development had been largely due to the efforts of the industry, which apart from its own research on that little aid had been needed from the Government, except in the construction of the Nairobi Factory and in the marketing of the finished products. The Government, while it had not been able to provide the necessary financing for growing tea in the former African areas, which showed great vast potential, was the limiting factor was the amount of finance available for development.

Mr. Gichuru said that to finance the tea trade in the former African areas it was necessary to have a more liberal money market and to encourage industries and commerce to develop.

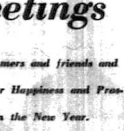
