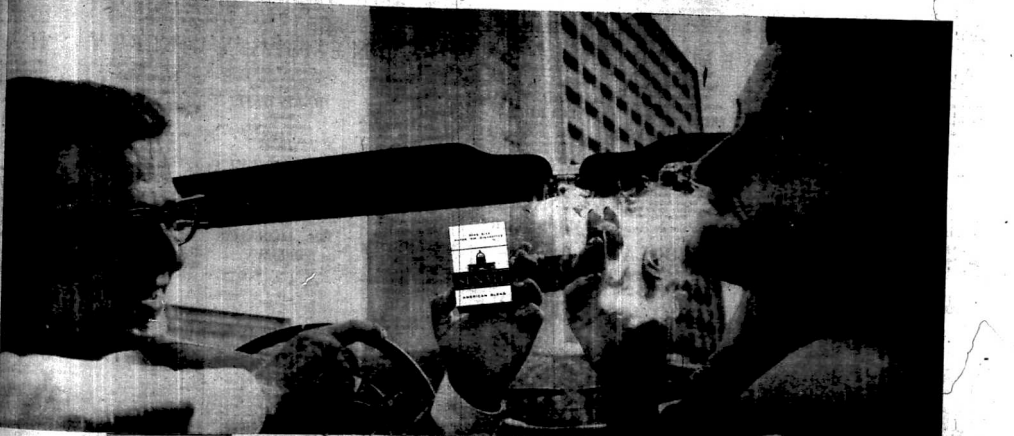



Dr. S. SALAM TO VISIT Federation's future to be discussed

DR. DUNCAN SANDYS, Commonwealth Relations Secretary, will leave London by air on Tuesday for talks with Sir Roy Welensky, Prime Minister of the Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland.

His talks, it is authoritatively learned, will concern not only the future of the Federation but also the Northern Rhodesian constitutional split over a Northern Rhodesian Cabinet.

Mr. Sandys has not planned the date of his return from Salisbury. His visit may last two weeks but it will certainly not be more than three weeks.

There is a possibility that he will visit Northern Rhodesia and Nyasaland, but he will not make a final decision on this until he reaches the Federation.

Mr. Sandys is known to attach much importance to the future of the Federation and his talks will include a discussion of the Federal Reserve conference and the progress made so far for the Federation's future.
