Delegate describes role in future Kenya

EUROPEAN participants in the Kenya conference were virtually powerless, according to one of them, Mr. L. R. Welwood.

Four years ago, all they said today was try to help the two major African groups to bring into being a constitution which would give the Africans a dominant position.

In the future to follow the substance — now dragging on to the end of its fourth week — African power would be done by the Africans themselves.

In his interview, Mr. Welwood said he believed that a large role would be done by the Africans themselves.

The bulk of the Africans had been for the South because they would not accept anything African could do. Some would remain, but most would go.

But many British Kenyans would go.

"This is where I find it impossible to get the truth across in Britain. We do not object to an African Government, but we do object to the implications of the Government."

You could create a slum expert

On the eve of the 12th anniversary of the outbreak of the Second World War, a United Nations spokesman said that the world could disarm without creating a depression.

But, it adds, the right measures would have to be taken. Industry would have to plan ahead to retain and re-allocate workers now employed in armaments manufacture. Governments would have to maintain an effective and balanced world economy. The world would also have to be prepared to meet the needs of the 1.5 billion people now living in poverty.

It was reviewed by a group of experts representing Britain, the United States, the Soviet Union, France, Belgium, Canada, the Netherlands, and Yugoslavia. The report points out that the world's population is expected to reach 2.5 billion by 1950, or half its present population.

Each year, the report says, an amount of goods equal to 20 per cent of the world's output is accounted for by seven countries — the U.S., Russia, Britain, France, Germany, Canada and Communist China.

These vast resources would be required for other changes, it adds.

The political detente that would accompany disarmament would allow open channels of trade between countries and would be accelerated.

LESS TENSION

A world without armaments and the threat of war would be a world of great social improvements in which people would benefit from a higher standard of living, a shorter working week, longer holidays, wider cultural facilities, stronger moral responsibilities and less tension and frustrations, says the report.

"Human life would acquire a new meaning once war and preparations were eliminated. The whole prospect of life would be brightened," it adds.

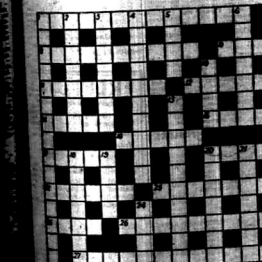

In accordance with the powers conferred by Section 11 of the Grass Fire (Control) Ordinance, and of all the powers thereunto respectively conferred on the County Council of Nairobi, hereby make the following Order:-

THE GRASS FIRES (STATE OF DANGER) (COUNTY OF NAIROBI) ORDER, 1962

1. This Order may be cited as the Grass Fire (State of Danger) (County of Nairobi) Order, 1962.

3. 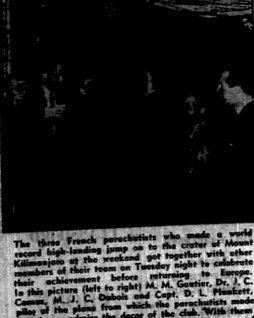

The new index, which is meant to be a guide to the general rise by the public in the cost of living, has adopted jeans, thick sweaters, moose-horn, rickshaws, sporting coats and rain-wear.

Disappearing are cooking utensils, galvanised household buckets, women's stockings and rayon dresses.

New pattern

The first cost-of-living index was started in 1946. It has since been revised several times. The present version of retail prices was introduced covering 117 different articles.

The new index will be based on prices in January 1958. This year's starting at 100. But this will not replace the present index, based on January, 1956 prices starting at 100 - it now stands at 117 - until the end of the year.

For the survey which preceded the new index, 3,000 households each sent first detailed budgets for a fortnight to reveal the new average spending pattern.

For ten years

These family budgets showed that Britons are spending more of their income on cars and less on bus and rail fares. More on electricity and on coal and gas, more on washing machines and vacuum cleaners and less on the cinema.

The experts on the cost-of-living advisory committee think the new index should be used for at least the next five years, unless there is a substantial change in spending patterns in the meantime.
