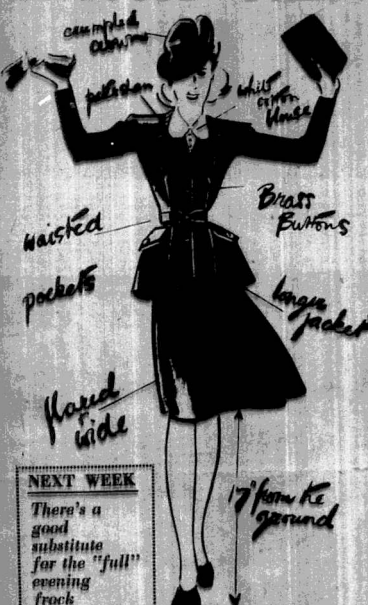

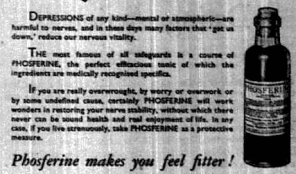

## No Allied Ship Sunk Last Week

### British Submarine's Daring Action

Not a single British or Allied ship was lost by enemy action last week. This was the first week since the beginning of the war that had been free from losses.

The Admiralty statement has to report, however, the loss of eight neutral vessels, totalling over 16,000 tons. Six of these were Danish ships victims to German torpedoes. None of the ships were lost in convoy.

The Admiralty announced that the German submarine shipbreaker, of 8,000 tons, has been sunk by a British submarine.

The vessel was intercepted on the north coast of Denmark on Thursday night. The submarine was 15 miles off the coast when it sighted the ship, and after they were all safely in its nets, torpedoed the vessel and blew her to pieces.

The submarine reports that the crew were safely landed in Denmark and it has since been learned that they have arrived in Germany.

Great Britain and France have agreed upon a solemn declaration of conditions for peace. This was announced in an official communique which states that the Government of the French Republic and H.M. Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland mutually undertake that during the present war they will neither negotiate nor conclude an armistice for a treaty of peace except by mutual agreement.

They also undertake not to discuss peace terms before the final agreement on the conditions for peace is reached. This will continue to be so until the final agreement is reached.

After the War. Britain and France will maintain, after the cessation of hostilities, the status quo in the Mediterranean and the Aegean Seas.

Unconfirmed. The Home Office has received information that the German navy is planning to attack British naval bases in the Mediterranean.

It is to be expected that the Germans will use the announcement to support their constant allegations that the Allies want to drag the war to the Balkans, but the corresponding truth would be further from the truth.

She expects, in that way, to find it easier to exert pressure on all of them, so that, in all these matters the decision of the Supreme War Council are likely to reflect the special conviction that the time has come to wage the war with the utmost energy and determination.

# ONE YEAR OF TYRANNY—AND A NAZI FAILURE

## Powerful Spiritual Revival Of The Czech People

Just over a year ago the German troops occupied Prague. The history of these 12 months is that of a Nazi failure and of the Czech people's triumph. The Nazis have failed to recognize that Czech nationalism of today is a more powerful force than in Habsburg times.

The period of German occupation has been marked by a powerful spiritual revival and it is many decades since churches have been so full. It is evident that it is in search of spiritual as well as moral strength that many Czechs are now changing their way of life.

Since the London March 14, Reichweiser occupied Prague a year ago today they have produced the greatest but deadly application of the Nazi system of a century of free men. Yet the history of these 12 months, though written in letters and graphs, is that of the Czech people's triumph. It is a particularly bitter for the Nazis to know that their failure has been caused by that deep-seated and healthy nationalism which they had regarded as the invention of a handful of plotting professors and ambitious politicians.

With characteristic blindness, the Sudeten Germans who advise Berlin on policy in Bohemia-Moravia have failed to recognize that Czech nationalism of today, founded on a people's faith in the principles of the First Republic, and to destroy the political institutions of the First Republic, and to destroy the political institutions of the First Republic, and to destroy the political institutions of the First Republic.

The paralyzing of the central authority, whose own action is shadowed and frustrated by the local State Government, has not led to the breakdown of national life. Local authorities, backed by the National Party, have assumed the responsibilities that the process of decentralization thrust into their hands. This dispersal of power is the fact of the German onslaught gave the Czechs the valuable gift of preventing their own establishments, complete control during the early months of the occupation.

The Man in the Street  
The failure of the Czech people lies in the hands of the individual man—with the Novaks, the Prochazkas, the Geras, the Januses, and Bohumirs, ironworkers by dark, thinking Klavirs, cautious peasants of the bleak Moravian Highlands, laborers on shores of southern Bohemia's lonely lakes, but, however Prague's intellectual elite.

Prague is a city where, in spite of its size and options spread by word of mouth with an almost Albanian rigidity, and where it is so difficult to suggest, for as it would be put out a fire spreading through its narrow streets. During the first few months German propaganda, based by all the technical methods in Nazi control, was almost unthwarted by the street. Within two or three days there were few who did not know the latest instance of Gestapo brutality or the most recently invented glib of the Germans. Thus on March 21 it was common knowledge that 2,826 men...

During the greater part of the 27 months the Nazis have been able to carry out their work unopposed. Land and industry have been rendered to German ownership by simple manipulations during the process of "Aryanization" which took place in the first few months. The man in the street has been transferred to the Reich, under the guise of residential laws. The German commissioners who quietly took office in many of the cities under cover of the military occupation were responsible for the removal of the man in the street. Every effort has been made to produce an aspect of normality in daily life.

Yet from time to time there have been occasions when a searching light has been thrown on to the real conditions. The incident at Hladkov was the first of these, when the State Secretary, Frank, tried to intimidate the workers by imposing their political representatives and by limiting a right of honor in this small industrial town, on the border of the Czech-German frontier. It was Frank's aim to deprive the workers of the protection which led to the massacre of the workers in the Hladkov district.

## KENYA FLY FISHERS' CLUB A Vigorous and Progressive Policy

The annual general meeting of the Kenya Fly Fishers' Club, held in the New Strand Hotel, Nairobi, yesterday under the Chairmanship of Major A. W. Suddiffe, was most successful. The club's policy of "all anglers and very honest sportsmen" was warmly commended.

In the course of his Presidential report Major Suddiffe gave comparative figures for 1937 and 1938 of the rivers fished by members. For 1937 the total catch was 487 lb. in brackets (there were 487 anglers) a drop of 15 lb. per day; fish killed numbered 125 and 125 fish. For 1938 the average weight rose by 25 lb. to 102 lb. for the year. Although 1,210 fish were caught, 300 were returned to the same, or other waters.

There was, however, an increase in the average weight of fish killed. The average weight was 102 lb. for 1938, while the number of fish killed exceeded 31 lb. in weight increased to 31 lb. per day.


