BRITAIN'S BIG TRADE IN THE BALKANS

Government Setting Up A Company

AMBITIOUS PLANS

April 5.

There have been several fresh indications of the way in which Britain and France are expanding and intensifying their economic war against Germany.

Great Britain is to embark on a big trade drive in the Balkans and the blockade of Germany is to be made 100 per cent. effective. The big British trade drive in the Balkans was announced by the Government last night in a statement made yesterday by Mr. Austen Chamberlain, Chancellor of the Exchequer, who said that the Government is about to set up a company to trade with the Balkans. This company will be called the British Balkan Trade Corporation and will be controlled by the British Treasury and several countries in which the company will be particularly concerned.

KENYA LOCUST POSITION Little Choice For Premier

Better Than Any Time Since Middle Of 1938

The locusts according to Kenya on Thursday according to the Agricultural Department report as follows: The Migratory Locust. Nyanza Province: A swarm of young flying locusts of about three square miles in extent entered the Colony from Uganda and arrived at Nyanza in South Kenya on March 29. Nyanza is about 17 miles southeast of Tororo in Uganda.

RIFT VALLEY PROVINCE: A small swarm was seen on the plain leading down towards the Gilgil on March 28 and 29. Specimens forwarded showed that this swarm was made up of MASAI DISTRICT: March 23: A swarm about one square mile in extent and flying in a southerly direction was seen near Masai Narigwa, 15 miles south-west of Masai Masai. This is a thin swarm about 6 miles long, stated to be of breeding locusts five to six miles north of Lake Masai.

CENTRAL PROVINCE: March 28: A small swarm was seen about 25 miles east-northeast of Nakuru in Kiambu locality. Specimens showed the locusts ready to lay. COAST PROVINCE: A report from Lamu reports that there have been two large bands of hoppers there between Lamu and Kilifi. They are being destroyed by beating.

FAIRLY SAFE: (a) There are no very large infestations anywhere in Kenya; (b) There are no reports of locusts in any stage from the Northern Frontier Province; (c) The heaviest infestations appear to be— (1) Mercheri Kavirondo, where there is a swarm of three locusts miles to exist lately invited from Uganda; (2) Mercheri Kavirondo, where there is a swarm of three locusts miles to exist lately invited from Uganda; (3) The South Kavirondo district near the border between A swam entering about one hour from Mt. Kenia. This swarm was being destroyed by thousands of nets and it is believed that the survivors are being driven south to the Machakos-Kisumu area.

On the Coast no flying locusts are reported and the last of small emergencies of hoppers are being destroyed in the district. The present infestation is considerably lighter than at any time since the present invasion commenced in the middle of 1938.

U. S. TRADE PROGRAMME Powers Renewed

This means that the Administration can conclude trade agreements without consulting the Senate and in the past, 60 per cent. of America's foreign trade (including American trade with the British and Canadian States) has been raised in this way.

The renewal of these powers was strongly opposed by some sections of the Senate, but a motion, to make such agreements conditional on the approval of the Senate, was defeated last week.

Mr. Cordell Hull repeated last night his previous statement that one of the objects of renewing the trade programme was to provide a solid foundation for an efficient peace structure that might follow the war.

But when it became apparent that Kenya was not to be a theatre of war, the Government stages women's work in the early stages of the war, and they settled down on more ordered lines and there has been plenty of time since to consider the lessons of those hectic weeks and to structure the future. When she arrived in the country Lady Moore took over the responsibility of the K. W. E. O. and through Lady Brook-Popham left off and a study of the best means of carrying out the spirit of service among Kenyan women has been one of her pre-occupations. Today we publish the constitution of the K. W. E. O. and commend it to the understanding and the support of the women of the Colony. It represents the Charter of Service for the War.

The functions of the K. W. E. O. are clearly defined in the constitution. They are: (1) the compilation and maintenance of a Central Register of Women-Power, and the utilization of the same; (2) the selection of the best advantage; (3) a liaison between all women's organizations in the Colony and the Government and Military authorities which may be required; and (4) the organization of any other activities if asked to do so by the Government or by the Military authorities. Much has been spoken and written about women's work since last September and the purposes for which the Government established the K. W. E. O. are now generally understood. Speaking at Nakuru last month, Lady Moore told the gathering of women that the

worst enemy at the moment is monopoly and in Kenya, where, as she said, we have not yet felt the urge to guard ourselves against what she called the "onslaught of apathy" in regard to our responsibilities. Nor is it surprising that only a few of the people of this Colony at any moment and we must be ready to face it calmly and with the confidence that only a long training and careful preparation can bring." That is really the case for the K.W.E.O. they say in victory through the complete defeat of the enemy, and anything which stands in the way of victory can be justly removed. Germany has been given plenty of evidence that this is the way the Nazi mind works. There has been no respect for international law. The war was only a few hours old when the Athenia was sunk and since then many other fine merchant ships and their crews and men have been sent to their doom. The neutral losses have been heavy. Heaviest of all have been those deliberately inflicted on the Scandinavian countries, particularly Norway, not by accident but as part of a deliberate policy. The aim of that policy is clear. It is to prevent these neutral countries from trading with Britain and to break down their Governments into adopting a standard of neutrality so benevolent from the German point of view that they would be prepared to let the neutral States, become part of the area from which the Nazis draw their war strength and to make these countries as serious that countries such as Norway no longer offer any resistance except for the feeblest written protest at intervals. There is evidence to show that the policies followed by the Scandinavian Governments are not necessarily progressive of the view of the people. The war in Finland revealed that and every fresh case of German submarines and aircraft in regard for the rights of neutrals added fuel to the fire of indignation.

That these neutrals need stiffening. Public opinion in Scandinavia requires to be strengthened so that it can associate some of the policies of the Governments. Granted that Scandinavian Governments are afraid of being drawn into the war and every effort to resist any attempt to turn their country into a battlefield for a foreign conflict, Britain and France have certain belligerent rights and are entitled to expect from States that enter the conflict in support of their responsibilities of neutrality. Furthermore, the trust is that by pleading difficulty in the way of the Allies these neutrals are merely feeding the forces of aggression, prolonging the war and exposing themselves to the attack which has overtaken Poland and Czechoslovakia. Norway is even furnishing naval escorts for German ships carrying contraband in territorial waters, and as the Altnark incident proved, the authorities are willing to go to considerable lengths to modify Germany and provide evidence of obedience to Nazi dictates.

Fromagana Instruction Inspection of Work of GOVERNOR OF SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION

Nucleus Organisation to Be Set Up Immediately

The conservation of land and water in Kenya is of the very first importance to the future of the Colony and it is an essential condition that Government should receive the widest possible measure of general support in tackling this difficult problem.

His Excellency the Governor of Kenya yesterday speaking at a meeting of the Settlement and Production Board to deal exclusively with this question.

While there may be no doubt in the Colony which will call for the formulation of individual schemes involving considerable sums of money, I feel that in many areas, day-to-day and consistent instruction and inspection in the forty-day work of farming in its widest sense, including, of course, animal husbandry."

His Excellency felt that if a consistent policy was to be laid down and carried out it was essential that an organisation should be set up under the control of a senior officer who might be styled a chief soil conservation and water conservation organisation. This organisation would, he hoped, be set up immediately and its first task would be to consider the drawing up of regulations under the Land and Water Preservation Bill so that no time might be lost in laying down the lines which the general policy should follow.

A meeting of the Settlement and Production Board began yesterday morning at 10.30 a.m. when Mr. Wilson was called to deal exclusively with the question of land and water conservation in Kenya. He said that he was pleased to see that many members of the board many others, including His Excellency, were present, attended by invitation.

Delegations to attend were sent to the Chief Secretary, the Chief Native Commissioner, the Director of Agriculture, Medical Services and Health, the Conservator of Forests, the Acting Financial Secretary, the Acting Commissioner of Lands and Settlements, the Acting Director of the Association of Chambers of Commerce and Industry, the Director of Coffee Board, the Chairman of the Forestry Board, the Chairman of the Milk Board, the Chairman of the Suez Canal and Harbour Trusts, Major E. H. Ward, Mr. A. C. Mahon, the Provincial Commissioner of the Central and Rift Valley Provinces, and Mr. H. R. Moseley, M.C.

In an opening statement Mr. Wilson expressed the appreciation of the Board at the Governor's presence and said that it was another sign of his keen interest in the different problems of the Colony and as an earnest of the intention to take steps to bring about a more united front in the future.

GERMAN SPREADS TO SCANDINAVIA

German Invasion Of Norway And Denmark

ALLIED PLEDGE TO GIVE FULLEST AID TO LATEST VICTIM OF AGGRESSION

GERMANY HAS SPREAD THE WAR TO SCANDINAVIA. YESTERDAY CARRYING OUT A PLAN LONG PREPARED HER TROOPS OVER-RAN DENMARK WITHOUT RESISTANCE AND AT THE SAME TIME ATTACKED NORWAY.

The situation in Norway is obscure but there is evidence that the Norwegians are determined to resist. AID HAS COME SWIFTLY TO THEM FROM THE ALLIES. SPECIAL CABINET MEETINGS IN LONDON AND PARIS YESTERDAY MORNING DECIDED THAT THE ALLIES WOULD FIGHT THE WAR IN FULL ASSOCIATION WITH NORWAY.

Germany's excess is that Denmark and Norway had to be protected against Allied action.

April 9. History was being made in Europe today. It began the day before with the laying of Allied mines in the Skagerrak waters followed by a night of air raid against the coast of Denmark and before dawn German troops had set out on a new march of aggression. Denmark was occupied according to plan but Norway is resisting and will be aided by Britain and France. The Allied announcement was made early in the day when the British Foreign Office issued a statement shortly after noon announcing that Britain and France would fight the war in full association with Norway and that the British and French Governments are already taking the naval and military measures necessary to reply the invasion.

Germany Explains "PROTECTIVE MEASURE"

The German Government explained its action in a wireless announcement which was in the following terms: "This was made about nine o'clock. The High Command of the German Army announces that in order to counteract actions against Denmark and Norway and prevent a possible hostile attack against these countries the German Army has taken these two countries under its protection. All the resources of the German Army therefore invaded these countries this morning. Germany's statement that the invasion of Denmark and attempted surrender of Norway is only the Allied action in laying mines in Norwegian territorial waters was amplified here today by a statement. Propaganda Ministry at full blast spreading this statement on the coast where troops were landed from ships. According to an Amsterdam message, most of the German landings have already taken place in accordance with plans which the Germans have been carrying out for several years for the occupation of Denmark to be carried out in a period of 24 hours.

German demands. At five o'clock the morning the German Minister in Copenhagen and the German Minister in Oslo announced that Denmark should agree to being placed under the protection of the German Army and advised that the military forces of the Reich. Later reports of the actual operations show that the invasion by land and sea took place at six points, one being across the frontier into Slesvig. The Danish Government has demanded that the German demands were by sea along the Little Belt and the Great Belt and also to Copenhagen itself which is only 30 miles across the Sound from the Swedish coast.

Three German cruisers entered the Sound and the Danish coastguard manned aided and occupied the neighboring streets and at least one heavy gun was brought ashore. Meanwhile three large ships which were working for the Germans were in the Little Belt.

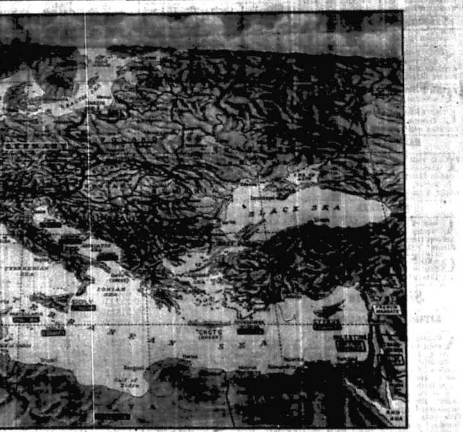
