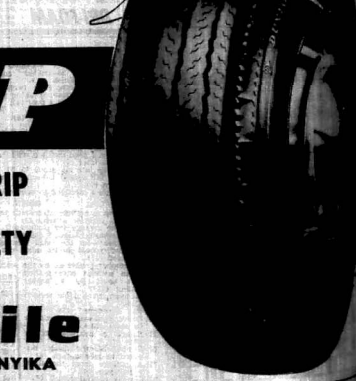

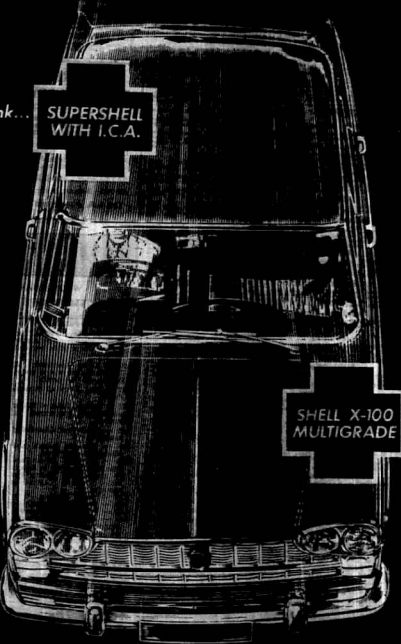

The joint communique said Mr. Kenyan had expressed his sincere thanks for the prompt assistance given to Kenya by British troops during the recent operations.

Mr. Kenyan explained that the Government wanted to expand the Kenya Army and provide it with air support. A small navy for coastal defence was also wanted. He hoped the British Government would help to implement this programme, and Mr. Sandys was given authority to accept the proposals.

Mr. Sandys said that a new British infantry and armoured division would be sent to Kenya for the present, but that the R.A.F. would also be asked to support the Kenya Air Force.

He also stated to the provision of the Kenya Army and Air Force, and the existing air training establishment in Kenya.

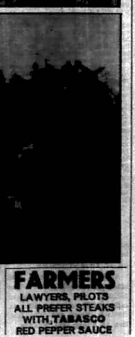

**DURING** the recent reconstruction of Zanzibar, one of the most important workers for those made homeless was Miss Marie Jones, one-time Director of the Island's Government Hospital.

Miss Jones first arrived in Zanzibar in 1948 on appointment from Britain. She hopes that when she leaves Zanzibar for good to return to her native land in Scotland, the work she has initiated in her spare time will continue to help over this duty.

## BRITISH 'EARNING' ON CYPRUS 'Cannot bear sole burden much longer'

AS Greek-Cypriot authorities yesterday gave British troops an ultimatum, Britain's Commonwealth Secretary, Mr. Stensley, told the House of Commons that the United Nations had been informed that Britain could not carry the peace-keeping burden on the island alone for much longer.

In a statement he said Britain was exerting all her efforts to help the Secretary-General of the United Nations to bring about a settlement of the Cyprus problem which would be in the best interests of the island and the people of the island.

He added: "We have asked him to inform us tomorrow of the progress he has made and of his assessment of the prospects of success. The light of his reply we will review the position."

That we have repeatedly made it clear, he continued, "that we cannot discharge the peace-keeping burden of the Cyprus Islands for much longer."

He praised the British soldiers for their "courage, discipline and admirable patience" but warned "that there is a limit to the dangers and indignities which we have the right to ask them to endure."

A few minutes after Mr. Stensley's statement the Prime Minister, Mr. Churchill, said that he would be withdrawing the British troops from the island.
